# A BILL

To amend section 3505.10 of the Revised Code to	1
modify the deadline for a political party to	2
certify its nominees for President and Vice-	3
President to the Secretary of State.	4

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3505.10 of the Revised Code be	5
amended to read as follows:	6
Sec. 3505.10. (A) On the presidential ballot below the	7
stubs at the top of the face of the ballot shall be printed	8
"Official Presidential Ballot" centered between the side edges	9
of the ballot. Below "Official Presidential Ballot" shall be	10
printed a heavy line centered between the side edges of the	11
ballot. Below the line shall be printed "Instruction to Voters"	12
centered between the side edges of the ballot, and below those	13
words shall be printed the following instructions:	14
"(1) To vote for the candidates for president and vice-	15

president whose names are printed below, record your vote in the 16 manner provided next to the names of such candidates. That 17

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recording of the vote will be counted as a vote for each of the 18 candidates for presidential elector whose names have been 19 certified to the secretary of state and who are members of the 20 same political party as the nominees for president and vice-21 president. A recording of the vote for independent candidates 22 for president and vice-president shall be counted as a vote for 23 the presidential electors filed by such candidates with the 24 25 secretary of state.

(2) To vote for candidates for president and vicepresident in the blank space below, record your vote in the manner provided and write the names of your choice for president and vice-president under the respective headings provided for those offices. Such write-in will be counted as a vote for the candidates' presidential electors whose names have been properly certified to the secretary of state.

(3) If you tear, soil, deface, or erroneously mark this ballot, return it to the precinct election officers or, if you cannot return it, notify the precinct election officers, and obtain another ballot."

(B)(1) Below those instructions to the voter shall be printed a single vertical column of enclosed rectangular spaces equal in number to the number of presidential candidates plus one additional space for write-in candidates. Each of those rectangular spaces shall be enclosed by a heavy line along each of its four sides, and such spaces shall be separated from each other by one-half inch of open space.

In each of those enclosed rectangular spaces, except the 44 space provided for write-in candidates, shall be printed the 45 names of the candidates for president and vice-president 46 certified to the secretary of state or nominated in one of the 47

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following manners:	48
(1) (a) Nominated by the national convention of a	49
political party to which delegates and alternates were elected	50
in this state at the next preceding primary election. $A-$	51
(i) Except as otherwise provided in division (B)(1)(a)(ii)	52
of this section, a political party certifying candidates so	53
nominated shall certify the names of those candidates to the	54
secretary of state <u>in writing</u> on or before the ninetieth day	55
before the day of the general election.	56
(ii) If a political party's national convention will not	57
convene in time for the political party to certify the names of	58
the political party's candidates for president and vice-	59
president in accordance with division (B)(1)(a)(i) of this	60
section, then as soon as practicable but not later than the	61
ninetieth day before the day of the general election, the	62
political party shall notify the secretary of state of that fact	63
in writing. The political party then shall certify the names of	64
its nominated candidates for president and vice-president to the	65
secretary of state in writing not later than the seventy-fourth	66
day before the day of the general election or not later than the	67
third day after the close of its national convention, whichever	68
<u>is earlier.</u>	69

(2) (b) Nominated by nominating petition in accordance70with section 3513.257 of the Revised Code. Such a petition shall71be filed on or before the ninetieth day before the day of the72general election to provide sufficient time to verify the73sufficiency and accuracy of signatures on it.74

(3) (c) Certified to the secretary of state for placement75on the presidential ballot by authorized officials of a minor76

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political party that has held a state or national convention for77the purpose of choosing those candidates or that may, without a78convention, certify those candidates in accordance with the79procedure authorized by its party rules. The80

(i) Except as otherwise provided in division (B)(1)(c)(ii) of this section, the officials shall certify the names of those candidates to the secretary of state <u>in writing</u> on or before the ninetieth day before the day of the general election. The certification shall be accompanied by a designation of a sufficient number of presidential electors to satisfy the requirements of law.

(ii) If a minor political party will not nominate its 88 candidates for president and vice-president in time for the 89 political party to certify the names of those candidates in 90 accordance with division (B)(1)(c)(i) of this section, then as 91 soon as practicable but not later than the ninetieth day before 92 the day of the general election, the political party shall 93 notify the secretary of state of that fact in writing. The 94 political party then shall certify the names of its nominated 95 candidates for president and vice-president to the secretary of 96 state in writing not later than the seventy-fourth day before 97 the day of the general election or not later than the third day 98 after it nominates its candidates, whichever is earlier. 99

(2) A political party may transmit a notice or100certification to the secretary of state under division (B)(1)(a)101or (c) of this section by any reasonably reliable method that,102under the circumstances, will provide for the secretary of state103to receive it by the applicable deadline, including by any of104the following methods:105

(a) Hand delivery;

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(b) Certified, express, or ordinary mail delivery by the	107
United States postal service;	108
(c) Commercial carrier service;	109
(d) Facsimile transmission;	110

### (e) Electronic mail.

(3) The names of candidates for electors of president and112vice-president shall not be placed on the ballot, but shall be113certified to the secretary of state as required by sections1143513.11 and 3513.257 of the Revised Code. A vote for any115candidates for president and vice-president shall be a vote for116the electors of those candidates whose names have been certified117to the secretary of state.118

(C) The arrangement of the printing in each of the 119 enclosed rectangular spaces shall be substantially as follows: 120 Near the top and centered within the rectangular space shall be 121 printed "For President" in ten-point boldface upper and lower 122 case type. Below "For President" shall be printed the name of 123 the candidate for president in twelve-point boldface upper case 124 type. Below the name of the candidate for president shall be 125 printed the name of the political party by which that candidate 126 for president was nominated in eight-point lightface upper and 127 lower case type. Below the name of such political party shall be 128 printed "For Vice-President" in ten-point boldface upper and 129 lower case type. Below "For Vice-President" shall be printed the 130 name of the candidate for vice-president in twelve-point 131 boldface upper case type. Below the name of the candidate for 132 vice-president shall be printed the name of the political party 133 by which that candidate for vice-president was nominated in 134 eight-point lightface upper and lower case type. Except for 135

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candidates nominated by petition under section 3517.012 of the 136 Revised Code, no political identification or name of any 137 political party shall be printed below the names of presidential 138 and vice-presidential candidates nominated by petition. 139 The rectangular spaces on the ballot described in this 140 section shall be rotated and printed as provided in section 141 3505.03 of the Revised Code. 142 Section 2. That existing section 3505.10 of the Revised 143 Code is hereby repealed. 144 Section 3. The amendments to section 3505.10 of the 145 Revised Code by this act first apply on January 1, 2025. 146 Section 4. (A) Notwithstanding any provision of the 147 Revised Code to the contrary, a major political party shall 148 certify to the Secretary of State in writing the names of its 149 candidates for president and vice-president nominated by its 150 national convention pursuant to section 3505.10 of the Revised 151 Code not later than the seventy-fourth day before the 2024 152 general election. The political party may transmit the 153 certification to the Secretary of State by any reasonably 154 reliable method that, under the circumstances, will provide for 155 the Secretary of State to receive it by the deadline, including 156 by any of the following methods: 157 (1) Hand delivery; 158 (2) Certified, express, or ordinary mail delivery by the 159 United States Postal Service; 160 (3) Commercial carrier service; 161 (4) Facsimile transmission; 162

(5) Electronic mail. 163
