WHEREAS, The United States Department of Transportation	4
(USDOT) announced on December 7, 2015, the Smart City Challenge,	5
which is a grant program to be awarded on a competitive basis;	6

WHEREAS, In order to be awarded a grant under the Smart	8
City Challenge, a mid-sized city must demonstrate how advanced	9

WHEREAS, The City of Columbus was named as one of seven	15

finalists from an original pool of seventy-eight applicants that are eligible to receive funding for capital improvements and operations for the purpose of demonstrating advanced data and intelligent transportation system technologies that are capable of meeting the stated goals of the Smart City Challenge; and

WHEREAS, The city that is selected under the Smart City Challenge will be awarded a \$40 million USDOT grant, with a potential additional grant of \$10 million from USDOT's electric vehicle vendor, Paul Allen's Vulcan, in addition to tens of millions of dollars of in-kind contributions from Alphabet's Sidewalk Labs, Amazon Web Services, Autodesk, MobileEye, and NXP; and

WHEREAS, Grant money awarded to the city that is selected under the Smart City Challenge will be used to assist that city in implementing its proposed demonstration; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That we, the members of the 131st General Assembly of the State of Ohio, in adopting this resolution, urge USDOT to select the City of Columbus as its winner for the Smart City Challenge based on Columbus' ability to create a twentyfirst century transportation system that will be a model for other cities around the country; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Senate transmit duly37authenticated copies of this resolution to the Secretary of the38United States Department of Transportation, the members of the39Ohio Congressional delegation, the Mayor of the City of40Columbus, and the news media of Ohio.41
