A RESOLUTION

In memory of Congressman Clarence J. "Bud" Brown, Jr.

WHEREAS, The members of the Senate of the 134th General Assembly 1 of Ohio extend our heartfelt condolences to the family and friends of 2 Clarence J. "Bud" Brown, Jr., in their bereavement; and 3

WHEREAS, Bud Brown left an indelible impression as a public 4 servant, and he worked tirelessly and with intent to benefit the State 5 of Ohio as well as our nation as a whole. A U.S. Navy veteran of the 6 Korean War, he was highly respected for his integrity and leadership 7 as a reputable nine-term member of the U.S. House of Representatives, 8 representing the Seventh Congressional District of Ohio from 1965 9 until 1983. He was an advocate for environmental responsibility as 10 well as an influential force in shaping U.S. energy and economic 11 policy, as evidenced by the success of such laws as the Department of 12 Energy Organization Act of 1977 and the Economic Recovery Tax Act of 13 1981. Indeed, he inspired trust in President Ronald Reagan, who 14 nominated Bud Brown to the post of deputy secretary of the U.S. 15 Department of Commerce, and he maintained his strong ties with 16 Washington, D.C., through his continued contributions to the United 17 States Capitol Historical Society and the National Presbyterian 18 Church; and 19

WHEREAS, Bud Brown demonstrated the true hallmarks of engaged and 20 responsible citizenship through his sincere desire to serve not only 21 his fellow Americans but also his fellow Ohioans. He was an avid 22 supporter of Wilberforce University and Central State University, and 23 his initiatives led to the establishment of the National Afro-American 24 Museum and Cultural Center in Wilberforce. In addition, he was the co-25 founder of the Urbana Rotary Club and city park, a founding member of 26 the Friends of Cedar Bog, and the board chairman for the Brown 27

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Publishing Company, the family business for which he worked as a 28 journalist prior to his election to Congress. His generous efforts 29 earned him the esteem of many, and his regard for improving the 30 quality of life in society through mentorship, collaboration, and 31 resolve was indisputable; and 32

WHEREAS, Above all, Bud Brown flourished in the circle of his 33 family, and he was a devoted husband to his wife, Joyce, a loving 34 father to his children, Clancy, Cate, Roy, and the late Beth, and a 35 doting grandfather to Rose Beth, James, Clark, Camille, and Jack. He 36 always used his talents to the benefit of others, and the laurels of 37 his life stand as a tribute not only to him but also to those he left 38 behind. The world is a richer place for his having been in it, and the 39 impact he made during his lifetime will be his eternal legacy; 40 therefore be it 41

RESOLVED, That we, the members of the Senate of the 134th General 42 Assembly of Ohio, in adopting this Resolution, pay tribute to the life 43 of Clarence J. "Bud" Brown, Jr., and, in so doing, salute the memory 44 of this truly honorable man; and be it further 45
