A humble man who possessed great faith, he was ordained for the Maryland Province of the Society of Jesus in 1979, and he served in such roles as a member of the faculty and dean of student activities at Gonzaga College High School, an assistant professor of American studies at Georgetown University, president of Archbishop Carroll High School, associate vice president for academic affairs at the University of Detroit-Mercy, titular bishop of Fuerteventura, auxiliary bishop of Chicago, where he was ordained to the episcopacy in 1995, coadjutor bishop of St. Thomas in the Virgin Islands, and the fifth bishop of the Diocese of Youngstown, where he was installed in 2007. He was known for his generosity, talents, and seemingly inexhaustible energy; and

WHEREAS, George Murry's regard for improving the quality of life in our society was clearly evident in his personal sacrifices of time and effort to family, friends, and community. He was named to the Ohio Task Force on Community-Police Relations by Governor John Kasich, and he was dedicated to spreading awareness and resources to benefit the Catholic community through his service to such organizations as the University of Detroit, Loyola Academy,
