A RESOLUTION

Recognizing the Thirtieth Anniversary of the Americans with Disabilities Act.

WHEREAS, The members of the Senate of the 133rd General	1
Assembly of Ohio are pleased to acknowledge the progress made by the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990; and	2 3
WHEREAS, In 1986, the National Council on Disability	4
recommended a proposal to protect people with disabilities from	5
discrimination and recognize that disability is a normal part of	6
our human experience; and	7
WHEREAS, Landmark legislation titled the Americans with	8
Disabilities Act (ADA) was introduced in the U.S. House and Senate	9
with bipartisan support from the Administration and Congress; and	10
WHEREAS, The ADA was a result of a decades long fight for	11
civil rights by advocates with disabilities, their families, and	12
allies and proceeded through a rigorous legislative process with	13
input and advocacy from Ohioans and many citizens, including	14
people with disabilities from across the nation; and	15
WHEREAS, The ADA was signed into law by President George H.	16
W. Bush on July 26, 1990, and was amended with the support of	17
President George W. Bush in 2008, and the United States has	18
benefited from the equal opportunities created for persons with	19
disabilities since the ADA's inception thirty years ago; and	20
WHEREAS, Indeed, our country's success has been strengthened	21
by the great contributions its individual states have made in	22
addressing such issues as those that comprise the Americans with	23
Disabilities Act of 1990. Ohio has long recognized the importance	24
of equal access to education, employment, independence and other	25

vital services to people with disabilities, including 26 developmental disabilities, through the establishment of county 27 Boards of Developmental Disabilities, Opportunities for Ohioans 28 with Disabilities, the Ohio Department of Developmental 29 Disabilities, the Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction 30 Services, and many other fine efforts which have transformed our 31 society; and 32

WHEREAS, The Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 has extended the promise of civil rights and inclusion to millions of people, and it stands as a testament to achieving a shared vision of potential and progress. On its milestone Thirtieth Anniversary, we reflect on the ADA's outstanding principles and celebrate the scope of its benefits to Ohioans, while we acknowledge the work still left to do to ensure that all persons with disabilities have equal opportunities and access to participate fully in our society; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That we, the members of the Senate of the 133rd 42 General Assembly of Ohio, in adopting this Resolution, honor the 43 Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 on its Thirtieth 44 Anniversary and remain committed to working alongside all people 45 with disabilities, their families, and advocates to address 46 barriers to equal opportunity and participation in every part of 47 society; and be it further 48
