PROPOSED COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

An Act relating to public retirement systems; authorizing cost-of-living increases for certain members of the Oklahoma Firefighters Pension and Retirement System, the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement System, the Uniform Retirement System for Justices and Judges, the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Retirement System, the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma, and the Oklahoma Public Employees Retirement System; specifying amount of increase; providing for certain comparison of benefit increases authorized by certain statutory provisions; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 49-143.8 of Title 11, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Except as provided in subsection B of this section and except for persons receiving benefits pursuant to Section 49-101 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma Statutes, effective July 1, 2023, any

1 person receiving benefits from the Oklahoma Firefighters Pension and  
2 Retirement System as of June 30, 2022, who continues to receive  
3 benefits on or after July 1, 2023, shall receive an increase in  
4 benefits equal to four percent (4%).

5 B. Any increase in benefits a person is eligible to receive  
6 pursuant to repealed Section 49-136 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma  
7 Statutes after June 30, 2020, shall be used to offset the increase  
8 in benefits provided in subsection A of this section.

9 C. Effective July 1, 2023, any person receiving benefits  
10 pursuant to Section 49-101 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma Statutes  
11 shall each receive an increase in benefits of four percent (4%) to:

12 1. Seven Dollars and eighty-three cents (\$7.83) per year of  
13 credited service, not to exceed thirty (30) years of service if the  
14 person's retirement benefit was not adjusted pursuant to the  
15 provisions of Section 49-143.7 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

16 2. Seven Dollars and ninety-nine cents (\$7.99) per year of  
17 credited service, not to exceed thirty (30) years of service if the  
18 person's retirement benefit was adjusted pursuant to Section 49-  
19 143.7 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma Statutes from a base amount of  
20 Seven Dollars and sixty-eight cents (\$7.68); or

21 3. Eight Dollars and fourteen cents (\$8.14) per year of  
22 credited service, not to exceed thirty (30) years of service if the  
23 person's retirement benefit was adjusted pursuant to Section 49-

1 143.7 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma Statutes from a base amount of  
2 Seven Dollars and eighty-three cents (\$7.83).

3 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
4 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 50-136.10 of Title 11, unless  
5 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

6 A. Except as provided in subsection B of this section, any  
7 person receiving benefits from the Oklahoma Police Pension and  
8 Retirement System as of June 30, 2022, who continues to receive  
9 benefits on or after July 1, 2023, shall receive an increase in  
10 benefits equal to four percent (4%).

11 B. Any increase in benefits a person is eligible to receive  
12 pursuant to repealed Section 50-120 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma  
13 Statutes, after June 30, 2020, shall be offset by the increase in  
14 benefits, if any, provided by this section.

15 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1104L of Title 20, unless there  
17 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

18 Any person receiving benefits from the Uniform Retirement System  
19 for Justices and Judges as of June 30, 2022, who continues to  
20 receive benefits on or after July 1, 2023, shall receive an increase  
21 in benefits equal to four percent (4%).

22 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-305.13 of Title 47, unless  
24 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1       A. Except as provided in subsection B of this section, any  
2 person receiving benefits from the Oklahoma Law Enforcement  
3 Retirement System as of June 30, 2022, who continues to receive  
4 benefits on or after July 1, 2023, shall receive an increase in  
5 benefits equal to four percent (4%).

6       B. Any increase in benefits a person is eligible to receive  
7 pursuant to subsection B, C, or D of Section 2-305 of Title 47 of  
8 the Oklahoma Statutes after July 1, 2023, shall be offset by the  
9 increase in benefits, if any, provided by this section.

10       SECTION 5.       NEW LAW       A new section of law to be codified  
11 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 17-116.23 of Title 70, unless  
12 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

13       A. Any person receiving benefits from the Teachers' Retirement  
14 System of Oklahoma as of June 30, 2022, other than those benefits  
15 specified in subsection B of this section, who continues to receive  
16 benefits on or after July 1, 2023, shall receive an increase in  
17 benefits equal to four percent (4%).

18       B. Any person receiving benefits pursuant to subsection (3) of  
19 Section 17-105 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes whose benefits  
20 commenced prior to July 1, 2023, and who continues to receive  
21 benefits on or after July 1, 2023, shall receive an increase in  
22 benefits equal to four percent (4%).

1 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 930.12 of Title 74, unless there  
3 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 Any person receiving benefits from the Oklahoma Public Employees  
5 Retirement System as of June 30, 2022, who continues to receive  
6 benefits on or after July 1, 2023, shall receive an increase in  
7 benefits equal to four percent (4%).

8 SECTION 7. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.

9 SECTION 8. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
10 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby  
11 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
12 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
