10	An Act relating to professions and occupations; amending 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1850.8, which relates
11	to Mechanical Licensing Act; authorizing certain apprentices to take certain journeyman examinations
12	without satisfying training and experiences requirements under certain conditions; stating
13	conditions; and providing an effective date.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1850.8, is
18	amended to read as follows:
19	Section 1850.8. A. The Construction Industries Board shall
20	issue a license as a mechanical journeyman or mechanical contractor
21	to any person who:
22	1. Has been certified by the Committee of Mechanical Examiners
23	as having successfully passed the appropriate examination; and
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Has paid the license fee and has otherwise complied with the
provisions of the Mechanical Licensing Act. The license fees shall
be established by rule by the Board pursuant to Section 1000.5 of
this title.

5	B. <u>A registered apprentice working under the supervision of an</u>
6	active mechanical contractor may sit for the examination for a
7	limited mechanical HVAC license, limited residential journeyman
8	license, limited residential installer license or any subspecialty
9	to the limited mechanical HVAC license without satisfying the
10	training or experience requirements in the Mechanical Licensing Act,
11	provided the overseeing mechanical contractor certifies to the
12	Construction Industries Board that the registered apprentice:
13	1. Has at least eighteen (18) months' substantially similar
14	experience;
15	2. Has at least six (6) months' as a registered apprentice under
16	the certifying mechanical contractor; and
17	3. Has the skills necessary to sit for the relevant examination.
18	A journeyman licensed pursuant to this subsection shall be required
19	to work under the supervisions of an active mechanical contractor
20	who shall be required to maintain adequate insurance coverage for
21	any journeyman working under their purview. A registered apprentice
22	may not receive an unlimited journeyman license through the
23	provisions of this subsection.
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1 C. All licenses shall be nontransferable. No license shall be 2 issued for longer than one (1) year and all licenses shall expire on 3 the last day in the birth month of the licensee. Licenses renewed more than thirty (30) days following the date of expiration may only 4 5 be renewed upon application and payment of the required fees and payment of any penalty for late renewal, as shall be established by 6 7 the Board. No journeyman or contractor license shall be renewed unless the licensee has completed the required hours of continuing 8 9 education as determined by the Committee. Persons who are licensed 10 as contractors under the Mechanical Licensing Act may have their 11 license placed on inactive status by paying the annual renewal fee 12 and eliminating the bonding and insurance requirements. No late fee shall be charged to renew a license which expired while the 13 applicant was in military service, if application is made within one 14 15 (1) year of discharge from the military service.

16 C. D. The Board is authorized to establish and issue, subject 17 to the provisions of the Mechanical Licensing Act, limited licenses 18 in each area of mechanical work based on the experience, ability, 19 examination scores and the education of the applicant. The limited 20 licenses shall authorize the licensee to engage in only those 21 activities and within the limits specified in the license. 22 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.

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
