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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:							
20	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified							
21	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5-148.1 of Title 70, unless							
22	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:							
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A. The State Department of Education shall establish and maintain a three-year pilot program known as the School Resource Officer Program.

- B. School resource officers employed or contracted by school districts participating in the School Resource Officer Program shall successfully complete law enforcement active shooter emergency response training given by the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET) and approved by the Oklahoma Department of Public Safety.
- C. For purposes of this section, "school resource officer" means a law enforcement officer with sworn authority and training in school-based law enforcement and crisis response who is assigned by an employing law enforcement agency to work collaboratively with one or more schools using community-oriented policing concepts.
- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5-148.2 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the State Department of Education to be designated the "School Security Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the State Department of Education from:
- 1. Reimbursements, grants, or other monies received from other state agencies and entities for school security;

- 2. Reimbursements, grants, or other monies received from the United States government obligated to school security projects;
 - 3. Gifts, donations, and bequests; and

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- 4. Monies appropriated or apportioned by the Legislature.
- B. All monies accruing to the credit of the School Security
 Revolving Fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and
 expended by the State Department of Education for the purposes of:
- Establishing and maintaining a School Resource Officer
 Program; and
- 2. Providing physical security enhancements for schools including, but not limited to, school resource officers, cameras, gates, lighting, locks, doors, windows, security geofencing, and ballistic storm shelters.
- Monies in the School Security Revolving Fund shall supplement and not supplant existing school security funding.
- 16 C. Expenditures from the School Security Revolving Fund shall 17 be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims 18 filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of 19 Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment. 20 Expenditures from the School Security Revolving Fund shall not 21 exceed Fifty Million Dollars (\$50,000,000.00) in any fiscal year and 22 shall be divided equally among every public school district in the 23 state.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.

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SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
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    of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby
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    declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
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    be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
