9 An Act relating to crimes and punishments; making  
10 certain acts unlawful; providing penalties; providing  
11 for codification; and providing an effective date.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 650.12 of Title 21, unless there  
16 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 A. Any person who commits an assault, battery, or assault and  
18 battery upon a municipal building inspector or municipal code  
19 enforcement officer while such building inspector or code  
20 enforcement officer is in the performance of his or her duties  
21 shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by  
22 imprisonment in the county jail for not more than one (1) year, by a  
23 fine of not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or by both  
24 such fine and imprisonment. Upon a second or subsequent conviction,

1 the person shall be guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in  
2 the custody of the Department of Corrections for a term of not more  
3 than two (2) years, or by a fine of not more than Two Thousand  
4 Dollars (\$2,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment.

5 B. Any person who commits an aggravated assault and battery  
6 upon a municipal building inspector or municipal code enforcement  
7 officer while such building inspector or code enforcement officer is  
8 in the performance of his or her duties shall, upon conviction, be  
9 guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the  
10 Department of Corrections for not less than two (2) years nor more  
11 than five (5) years, by a fine of not more than Five Thousand  
12 Dollars (\$5,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment.

13 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
