Any person who commits an aggravated assault and battery upon a municipal building inspector or municipal code enforcement officer while such building inspector or code enforcement officer is in the performance of his or her duties shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections for not less than two (2) years nor more than five (5) years, by a fine of not more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
