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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:			
19	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified			
20	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5026.1 of Title 63, unless there			
21	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:			
22	A. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority, to the extent			
23	permissible under federal law, shall provide Medicaid coverage for

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medically necessary pasteurized donor human milk and donor human milk-derived products in a home setting; provided:

- 1. A physician, physician assistant or Advanced Practice
  Registered Nurse licensed in this state signs an order stating that
  such milk is medically necessary for an infant Medicaid beneficiary;
  - 2. a. The infant is medically or physically unable to receive maternal breast milk or participate in breastfeeding, or
    - b. The infant's mother is medically or physically unable to produce maternal breast milk in sufficient quantities; and
- 3. Such milk is provided by a donor human milk bank that meets the quality standards of and is licensed by the Authority.
- B. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority Board shall promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this section including, but not limited to, the following:
- 1. Establishing infant birth weight and health conditions that may make the provision of pasteurized donor human milk and donor human milk-derived products medically necessary and time limits for Medicaid coverage of pasteurized donor human milk and donor human milk-derived products; and
- 2. Establishing minimum quality standards and licensing of all human milk banks that collect, process, distribute and sell

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pasteurized donor human milk and donor human milk-derived products in the state.

- C. The Board may adopt a policy or procedure to implement the provisions of this section while in the process of promulgating rules; provided, such policy or procedure is posted on the Internet website of the Authority prior to adoption of the policy.
- D. The Authority shall seek any federal approval necessary to implement this section.
- SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2021.
- SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
