Supp. 7 2022, Section 4-112), which relates to hunting license; updating statutory language; providing an 8 effective date; and declaring an emergency. 9 10 11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 12 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 29 O.S. 2021, Section 3-103, is amended to read as follows: 13 Α. Section 3-103. The Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation 14 Commission shall constitute an advisory, administrative and 15 policymaking board for the protection, restoration, perpetuation, 16 conservation, supervision, maintenance, enhancement, and management 17 of wildlife in this state as provided in the Oklahoma Wildlife 18 Conservation Code. 19 20 Β. The Director shall consult with the Commission regarding the administration of the affairs of the Department of Wildlife 21 Conservation. The Commission is authorized and empowered to require 22 from the Director complete reports and information relative to the 23 24

affairs of the Department at the time and in the manner the
 Commission may deem advisable.

C. The Commission shall meet in regular session at least nine 3 times per year not to exceed one meeting per month with not more 4 5 than two consecutive calendar months between meetings and in special sessions as may be called by the Chair or a majority of the 6 Commission. The Commission may hold any regular or special session 7 at any location within this state. Should a location be chosen 8 9 other than Commission headquarters in Oklahoma City for a regular or special meeting, notice shall be posted at Commission headquarters 10 in Oklahoma City and advertised in the local newspaper of the city 11 in which the meeting is to be held, at least one time during each of 12 13 the two (2) weeks prior to the meeting. The advertisements shall include time, date, and address of location of the meeting. 14

D. In addition to the other powers and duties prescribed by law, the Commission shall:

Institute an affirmative action plan for hiring women and
 minorities throughout the agency;

19 2. Elect a chair, vice-chair vice chair, and secretary, who 20 shall perform the duties required of them by statutes, rules of the 21 Commission, and the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma. The 22 chair, vice-chair vice chair, and secretary shall receive no extra 23 compensation;

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3. Appoint a Director, and determine the qualifications of the
 Director and all assistants and employees. A Commissioner shall not
 be eligible for employment in any position within the Department;

4 4. Prescribe rules and policies for the transaction of its5 business and the control of the Department;

5. Develop and implement a plan to provide step raises for
7 Commission employees so that discrepancies of pay levels within a
8 pay grade are eliminated;

9 6. Acquire by purchase, lease, gift, or devise, waters, real 10 property, and personal property incident to the exercise of its 11 functions and to maintain, operate, and dispose of the same;

12 7. Acquire real property by condemnation only when the Attorney 13 General or other counsel deems it an appropriate means of clearing 14 title from willing or unavailable sellers;

8. Supervise the establishment, extension, improvement, and
operation of the wildlife refuges, propagation areas or stations,
public hunting areas, public fishing areas, game management areas,
and fish hatcheries;

9. Prescribe the manner of cooperation with the Oklahoma
 Tourism and Recreation Department, colleges and universities within
 the state, other state agencies, any agency of the federal
 government, and any city, town, school district, or any other agency
 or organization in study of conservation and propagation of wildlife
 and in the establishment, maintenance, and operation of visual

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educational facilities, recreational facilities, and hunting and 1 fishing facilities, in the study and propagation of wildlife; 2 Supervise the letting of all contracts and purchases for 3 10. the Department, with all purchases of personal property to be made 4 5 through the Office of Management and Enterprise Services; Authorize all claims or expenditures prior to incurring 6 11. payment except as otherwise provided in this Code; 7 12. Prescribe rules on the use of Department-owned vehicles by 8 9 the Director, department heads and other essential employees as the Commission deems necessary in order to perform their duties; 10 13. Prescribe rules for the sale of all regular or special 11 12 licenses: 14. Publicize and encourage the conservation and appreciation 13 of wildlife and all other natural resources; 14 Regulate the seasons and harvest of wildlife; 15 15.

16 16. Promulgate rules to sell fishing and hunting licenses via 17 the Internet;

18 17. Annually report to the Governor and the Legislature on the 19 complete operation, activities, and plans of the Department, 20 together with such recommendations for future activities as the 21 Commission may deem to be in the best interest of the state; and 22 18. Provide the Governor and the Legislature with an annual 23 inventory of all property and equipment.

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E. Five (5) years after the effective date of this act, and every five (5) years thereafter, the Commission shall prepare a report for the Legislature with proposed licensing fees based on the latest Consumer Price Index year-to-date percent change release as of the date of the annual average county wage data release from the Bureau of Economic Analysis of the U.S. Department of Commerce for Legislature approval or rejection.

8 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 29 O.S. 2021, Section 4-110, is 9 amended to read as follows:

Section 4-110. A. Except as otherwise provided in the Oklahoma 10 Wildlife Conservation Code, no person shall fish, pursue, harass, 11 catch, kill, take in any manner, use, have in possession, sell, or 12 transport all or any portion of fish without having first procured a 13 license for such from the Director or from any of the authorized 14 agents of the Department of Wildlife Conservation. The Oklahoma 15 Wildlife Conservation Commission may designate two (2) days per year 16 17 in which residents and nonresidents may fish without first procuring a fishing license pursuant to the provisions of this section. 18

B. The following legal residents of Oklahoma <u>and the following</u>
<u>nonresidents</u> shall be exempt from the annual fishing license
requirements of subsection C of this section <del>and the following</del>
<del>nonresidents shall be exempt from the annual nonresident fishing</del>
<del>licenses required pursuant to subsection E of this section:</del>

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Legal residents under sixteen (16) eighteen (18) years of
 age and nonresidents under sixteen (16) eighteen (18) years of age
 from states which do not require nonresident fishing licenses for
 persons under sixteen (16) years of age;

5 2. Legal residents sixty-five (65) years of age or older and 6 nonresidents sixty-five (65) years of age or older from states which 7 do not require nonresident fishing licenses for persons sixty-five 8 (65) years of age or older, provided a legal resident has obtained a 9 senior citizen lifetime fishing or combination hunting and fishing 10 license pursuant to the provisions of Section 4-114 of this title;

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## 3. Legal residents born on or before January 1, 1923;

4. Legal resident veterans having a disability of sixty percent 12 (60%) or more and registered with the veterans registry created by 13 the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs; provided, that if the 14 veteran has previously received an exemption pursuant to this 15 paragraph, no registration with the veterans registry shall be 16 The Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Commission shall required. 17 promulgate any rules necessary to implement the provisions of this 18 paragraph; 19

5. <u>4.</u> Legal resident owners or tenants, their spouses, parents,
grandparents, children and their spouses, grandchildren and their
spouses who fish in private ponds on land owned or leased by them;
<del>6.</del> <u>5.</u> Any legal resident or nonresident who is a patient of an
institution of the State of Oklahoma this state established for the

1 care and treatment of mental illness or alcohol or drug dependency 2 or any developmentally disabled person residing in any group home or 3 other institution or developmentally disabled persons when 4 accompanied by an attendant of the institution or legal guardian of 5 the patient, or when fishing on institutional property;

7. Any legal resident or nonresident under eighteen (18) years
of age who is in the legal and physical custody of the State of
Oklahoma or one of its agencies by court order;

9 8. Any legal resident or nonresident under eighteen (18) years
10 of age who is in the physical custody of a child care facility as
11 defined by Section 402 of Title 10 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

12 9. 6. Any legal resident or nonresident who is legally blind or who has any other physical impairment, as certified by a physician 13 licensed in this state or any state which borders this state, which 14 prevents the person from properly using fishing apparatus without 15 the assistance of another person, and any one person actually 16 accompanying and actually assisting such legally blind or otherwise 17 physically impaired person while the latter is fishing. This 18 certification shall be carried by the individual while fishing; 19

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10. Nonresidents under fourteen (14) years of age;

21 <u>11. 7.</u> Any legal resident or nonresident who is a Job Corps 22 trainee of this state, provided that the trainees shall have on 23 their persons a duly authorized identification card issued by their 24 respective Job Corps Center and shall present the card upon request, 1 in lieu of a fishing license. The trainees shall return their cards 2 to their respective Job Corps Center when the trainees leave their 3 respective Job Corps training programs;

4 <u>12.</u> <u>8.</u> Any legal resident having a proven disability which
5 renders the resident nonambulatory and confined to a wheelchair as
6 certified by a physician licensed in this state or any state which
7 borders this state;

8 <u>13. 9.</u> Any legal resident who is fishing with a pole and line, 9 trotline, or throwline in streams, natural lakes, natural ponds, and 10 mine pits in the county in which the person is a resident, or in 11 streams, natural lakes, natural ponds, and mine pits which form a 12 part of the boundary line of the county in which the person is a 13 resident, when using any bait other than commercial or artificial 14 bait, blood, stink bait, cut fish, and shrimp; and

15 <u>14.</u> <u>10.</u> Any legal resident or nonresident participating in an 16 aquatic education event or clinic sanctioned by the Department of 17 Wildlife Conservation.

18 C. Except as otherwise provided for in the Oklahoma Wildlife 19 Conservation Code, the resident fishing licenses issued pursuant to 20 the provisions of this section and the fee for each shall be:

Annual fishing license for legal residents eighteen (18)
 years of age and older - Twenty-four Dollars (\$24.00) Thirty Dollars
 (\$30.00);

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2. Annual fishing license for legal residents sixteen (16) or 1 seventeen (17) years of age - Four Dollars (\$4.00); and 2 3. Two-day fishing license for legal residents - Fourteen 3 <del>Dollars (\$14.00).</del> 4 D. Of the fees collected pursuant to the provisions of 5 paragraphs 1 and 3 of subsection C of this section, Five Dollars 6 7 (\$5.00) of the license fee shall be for the Oklahoma Wildlife Land Stamp and shall be deposited in the Oklahoma Wildlife Land Fund 8 9 created pursuant to the provisions of Section 4-141 of this title. E. Except as otherwise provided for in the Oklahoma Wildlife 10 Conservation Code, the nonresident fishing licenses issued pursuant 11 to the provisions of this section and the fee for each shall be: 12 13 1. Annual fishing license for nonresidents - Fifty-four Dollars (\$54.00) Sixty-five Dollars (\$65.00), provided the Commission may 14 enter into reciprocity agreements with states wherein nonresident 15 license fees shall be in conformity with such reciprocal agreements; 16 17 2. Six-day fishing license for nonresidents - Thirty-four Dollars (\$34.00); and 18 3. One-day fishing license for nonresidents - Fourteen Dollars 19 (\$14.00) Daily fishing license for residents - Ten Dollars (\$10.00); 20 21 and 4. Daily fishing license for nonresidents - Eighteen Dollars 22 (\$18.00). 23 24

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1 F. Of the fees collected pursuant to the provisions of 2 paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 of subsection E of this section, Five Dollars (\$5.00) of the annual license fee for nonresidents, One Dollar and 3 fifty cents (\$1.50) of the six-day fishing license for nonresidents 4 5 fee and One Dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50) of the one-day fishing license for nonresidents fee shall be deposited in the Wildlife Land 6 Acquisition Fund created pursuant to the provisions of Section 4-132 7 of this title. Of the fees collected pursuant to the provisions of 8 9 paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 of subsection E of this section, Five Dollars (\$5.00) of the license fee shall be for the Oklahoma Wildlife Land 10 Stamp and shall be deposited in the Oklahoma Wildlife Land Fund 11 12 created pursuant to the provisions of Section 4-141 of this title. G. D. Legal residents who have resided in this state for at 13 least six (6) months and who are receiving Social Security 14 Disability benefits, Supplemental Security Income benefits, 15 disability benefits under the Railroad Retirement Act, 45 U.S.C.A., 16 17 Section 231a, postal employees receiving disability benefits pursuant to 5 U.S.C., Section 8451 (1998) or legal residents who are 18 one hundred percent (100%) disabled and are receiving disability 19 payments from the Multiple Injury Trust Fund pursuant to Section 403 20 31 of Title 85 85A of the Oklahoma Statutes, may purchase a five-21 year disability fishing combination hunting/fishing license from the 22 Director for Ten Dollars (\$10.00) Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for five 23 (5) years. 24

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1 H. E. 1. Any person arrested while violating the provisions of 2 this section who does not meet the requirements of subsection  $\frac{1}{K}$  H of 3 this section, may purchase a substitute temporary thirty-day license 4 from the arresting game warden in lieu of posting bond. The fee for 5 a substitute license purchased pursuant to the provisions of this 6 subsection shall be:

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for legal residents, Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), and

9 b. for nonresidents, Ninety Dollars (\$90.00) One Hundred
 10 Fifty Dollars (\$150.00).

Except as otherwise provided by this subsection, the fees
 from licenses purchased pursuant to the provisions of this
 subsection shall be deposited in the Wildlife Conservation Fund to
 be used exclusively for developing, managing, preserving, and
 protecting wildlife and wildlife habitat.

16 <del>I.</del> <u>F.</u> Unless a substitute license is purchased as provided for 17 by subsection <u>H E</u> of this section, any resident of this state 18 convicted of violating the provisions of this section shall be 19 punished by the imposition of a fine of not less than Twenty-five 20 Dollars (\$25.00) nor more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) or by 21 imprisonment in the county jail for a period not to exceed thirty 22 (30) days, or by both said such fine and imprisonment.

23 J. G. Unless a substitute license is purchased as provided for 24 by subsection  $H \ge Of$  this section, any nonresident convicted of

violating this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) or by imprisonment in the county jail for a period not more than thirty (30) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

5 K. H. Any person producing proof in court that a current fishing license issued by the Department of Wildlife Conservation to 6 that person was in force at the time of the alleged offense shall be 7 entitled to dismissal of a charge of violating this section upon 8 9 payment of court costs. If proof of a current fishing license 10 issued by the Department to the person that was in force at the time of the alleged offense is presented to the court or district 11 12 attorney within seventy-two (72) hours after the violation, the 13 charge shall be dismissed without payment of court costs.

9. 8. Any legal resident or nonresident hunting, pursuing,

C. Except as otherwise provided for in the Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Code, the nonresident hunting licenses issued pursuant to this section and the fee for each license shall be:

Annual hunting license for nonresidents hunting game other
 than deer, antelope, elk, or bear which expires one (1) year after
 the date of issuance - One Hundred Seventy-five Dollars (\$175.00)
 <u>Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00)</u>. Nonresidents hunting big game or
 combination big game and upland game in a commercial hunting area,
 <u>gun hunting for deer, archery hunting for deer, or primitive</u>
 firearms hunting for deer shall be required to have this license;

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1 2. Gun hunting license for deer for nonresidents which shall be 2 valid for hunting all deer allowed during the current calendar year deer gun season - Two Hundred Seventy-nine Dollars (\$279.00) Two 3 Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) in addition to the nonresident annual 4 5 hunting licensed required in paragraph 1 of this subsection; 3.
