BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 29 O.S. 2021, Section 3-103, is
amended to read as follows:

Section 3-103. A. The Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation
Commission shall constitute an advisory, administrative and
policymaking board for the protection, restoration, perpetuation,
conservation, supervision, maintenance, enhancement, and management
of wildlife in this state as provided in the Oklahoma Wildlife
Conservation Code.

B. The Director shall consult with the Commission regarding the
administration of the affairs of the Department of Wildlife

1 Conservation. The Commission is authorized and empowered to require
2 from the Director complete reports and information relative to the
3 affairs of the Department at the time and in the manner the
4 Commission may deem advisable.

5 C. The Commission shall meet in regular session at least nine
6 times per year not to exceed one meeting per month with not more
7 than two consecutive calendar months between meetings and in special
8 sessions as may be called by the Chair or a majority of the
9 Commission. The Commission may hold any regular or special session
10 at any location within this state. Should a location be chosen
11 other than Commission headquarters in Oklahoma City for a regular or
12 special meeting, notice shall be posted at Commission headquarters
13 in Oklahoma City and advertised in the local newspaper of the city
14 in which the meeting is to be held, at least one time during each of
15 the two (2) weeks prior to the meeting. The advertisements shall
16 include time, date, and address of location of the meeting.

17 D. In addition to the other powers and duties prescribed by
18 law, the Commission shall:

19 1. Institute an affirmative action plan for hiring women and
20 minorities throughout the agency;

21 2. Elect a chair, ~~vice-chair~~ vice chair, and secretary, who
22 shall perform the duties required of them by statutes, rules of the
23 Commission, and the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma. The
24

1 chair, ~~vice chair~~ vice chair, and secretary shall receive no extra
2 compensation;

3 3. Appoint a Director, and determine the qualifications of the
4 Director and all assistants and employees. A Commissioner shall not
5 be eligible for employment in any position within the Department;

6 4. Prescribe rules and policies for the transaction of its
7 business and the control of the Department;

8 5. Develop and implement a plan to provide step raises for
9 Commission employees so that discrepancies of pay levels within a
10 pay grade are eliminated;

11 6. Acquire by purchase, lease, gift, or devise, waters, real
12 property, and personal property incident to the exercise of its
13 functions and to maintain, operate, and dispose of the same;

14 7. Acquire real property by condemnation only when the Attorney
15 General or other counsel deems it an appropriate means of clearing
16 title from willing or unavailable sellers;

17 8. Supervise the establishment, extension, improvement, and
18 operation of the wildlife refuges, propagation areas or stations,
19 public hunting areas, public fishing areas, game management areas,
20 and fish hatcheries;

21 9. Prescribe the manner of cooperation with the Oklahoma
22 Tourism and Recreation Department, colleges and universities within
23 the state, other state agencies, any agency of the federal
24 government, and any city, town, school district, or any other agency

1 or organization in study of conservation and propagation of wildlife
2 and in the establishment, maintenance, and operation of visual
3 educational facilities, recreational facilities, and hunting and
4 fishing facilities, in the study and propagation of wildlife;

5 10. Supervise the letting of all contracts and purchases for
6 the Department, with all purchases of personal property to be made
7 through the Office of Management and Enterprise Services;

8 11. Authorize all claims or expenditures prior to incurring
9 payment except as otherwise provided in this Code;

10 12. Prescribe rules on the use of Department-owned vehicles by
11 the Director, department heads and other essential employees as the
12 Commission deems necessary in order to perform their duties;

13 13. Prescribe rules for the sale of all regular or special
14 licenses;

15 14. Publicize and encourage the conservation and appreciation
16 of wildlife and all other natural resources;

17 15. Regulate the seasons and harvest of wildlife;

18 16. Promulgate rules to sell fishing and hunting licenses via
19 the Internet;

20 17. Annually report to the Governor and the Legislature on the
21 complete operation, activities, and plans of the Department,
22 together with such recommendations for future activities as the
23 Commission may deem to be in the best interest of the state; and
24

1 18. Provide the Governor and the Legislature with an annual
2 inventory of all property and equipment.

3 E. Five (5) years after the effective date of this act, and
4 every five (5) years thereafter, the Commission shall prepare a
5 report for the Legislature with proposed licensing fees based on the
6 latest Consumer Price Index year-to-date percent change release as
7 of the date of the annual average county wage data release from the
8 Bureau of Economic Analysis of the U.S. Department of Commerce for
9 Legislature approval or rejection.

10 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 29 O.S. 2021, Section 4-110, is
11 amended to read as follows:

12 Section 4-110. A. Except as otherwise provided in the Oklahoma
13 Wildlife Conservation Code, no person shall fish, pursue, harass,
14 catch, kill, take in any manner, use, have in possession, sell, or
15 transport all or any portion of fish without having first procured a
16 license for such from the Director or from any of the authorized
17 agents of the Department of Wildlife Conservation. The Oklahoma
18 Wildlife Conservation Commission may designate two (2) days per year
19 in which residents and nonresidents may fish without first procuring
20 a fishing license pursuant to the provisions of this section.

21 B. The following legal residents of Oklahoma and the following
22 nonresidents shall be exempt from the annual fishing license
23 requirements of subsection C of this section ~~and the following~~
24

1 ~~nonresidents shall be exempt from the annual nonresident fishing~~
2 ~~licenses required pursuant to subsection E of this section:~~

3 1. Legal residents under ~~sixteen (16)~~ eighteen (18) years of
4 age and nonresidents under ~~sixteen (16)~~ eighteen (18) years of age
5 ~~from states which do not require nonresident fishing licenses for~~
6 ~~persons under sixteen (16) years of age;~~

7 2. Legal residents sixty-five (65) years of age or older and

24 spouses who fish in private ponds on land owned or leased by them;

3 care and treatment of mental illness or alcohol or drug dependency
4 or any developmentally disabled person residing in any group home or
5 other institution or developmentally disabled persons when
6 accompanied by an attendant of the institution or legal guardian of
7 the patient, or when fishing on institutional property;

8 ~~7.~~ Any legal resident or nonresident under eighteen (18) years
9 of age who is in the legal and physical custody of the State of
10 Oklahoma or one of its agencies by court order;

11 ~~8.~~ Any legal resident or nonresident under eighteen (18) years
12 of age who is in the physical custody of a child care facility as
13 defined by Section 402 of Title 10 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

14 ~~9.~~ 6. Any legal resident or nonresident who is legally blind or
15 who has any other physical impairment, as certified by a physician
16 licensed in this state or any state which borders this state, which
17 prevents the person from properly using fishing apparatus without
18 the assistance of another person, and any one person actually
19 accompanying and actually assisting such legally blind or otherwise
20 physically impaired person while the latter is fishing. This
21 certification shall be carried by the individual while fishing;

1 their persons a duly authorized identification card issued by their
