The floor amendment to HB 1030 changes the effective date of the measure from January 1, 2024 to one year after enactment.

**Fiscal Analysis**

This measure creates new law relating to privacy of computer data, providing protections for the personal information of consumers and enacting guidelines for businesses collecting consumer data information. Persons in violation of this act would be liable to the state of Oklahoma for injunctive relief and/or civil penalties. The Oklahoma Attorney General (AG) would be entitled to recover reasonable expenses, including reasonable attorney fees, court costs, and investigatory costs incurred in obtaining injunctive relief or civil penalties, or both. The frequency of such violations is not predictable, however the penalty collections associated with this measure would have a positive impact on the General Revenue Fund. The floor amendment does not affect the fiscal impact of this measure.
