Fiscal Analysis

HB 1681 establishes a \$20 annual single park parking pass for Oklahoma residents. Currently, nonresidents pay \$75 for a year long parking pass to all state parks and residents pay a discounted rate of \$60. Creating the new single park pass will encourage some residents to switch from the statewide \$60 park pass to the \$20 single park pass costing state parks \$40 per switch. In addition, some residents who previously did not purchase an annual pass at \$60 will purchase the cheaper \$20 pass. HB1681 will be revenue neutral if for every resident that switches from the statewide pass to the single park pass, two new single park passes are purchased. With the state parks parking pass program being in existence for less than a year, there is currently not enough data to know the fiscal impact.
