Research Analysis

The proposed committee substitute for **HB3567**, clarifies the authority of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control (OBNDD) to sell used vehicles, used equipment and forfeited property. It allows electronic compounded prescriptions, compounded infusion prescriptions, and approved research prescriptions and requires that all written prescriptions use official forms from the OBNDD, purchased by the medical provider, and sourced from approved vendors. These forms can include multiple addresses but are only for the registered practitioner's use.

The measure outlines the conditions under which the Director can limit, suspend, or revoke registrations related to controlled dangerous substances. These conditions include falsification, criminal convictions, loss of federal authorization, failure to prevent diversion, improper prescription, substance abuse, and violations of relevant laws and rules. The section also addresses the handling and forfeiture of controlled substances in case of suspension or revocation and mandates the notification of the Drug Enforcement Administration regarding such actions.

The bill adds, clarifies and alphabetizes definitions, allows the Director to issue orders for violations, with their order becoming final if no individual proceeding is requested, and requires registrants facing action to maintain registration and renew annually.
