**Research Analysis**

SB 1056 modifies current law relating to obscene material. The measure provides that any material that creates a prurient interest in sex in minors shall qualify as obscene material. The measure also provides that the "reasonable person" standard does not apply when an adult knowingly provide material that qualifies as obscene to a minor without written informed consent by the minor's parent or guardian.
