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**Bill Analysis**

The CS for SB 272 creates the Kelsey Smith Act. The measure authorizes a law enforcement agency, as defined in the measure, to request and receive the call location of a user's communication device from a telecommunication company in order to respond to a call for emergency services or in an emergency situation that involves risk of death or serious physical harm. The CS requires notice to be provided to the user whose information was provided to law enforcement 30 days after the call for emergency services or the emergency situation. Every telecommunication company registered to do business in the state must annually submit emergency contact information to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation (OSBI) to facilitate requests from a law enforcement agency. Carriers are not required to submit emergency contact information for individual customers to OSBI.

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
