**Research Analysis**

The House amendment to SB 748, strikes Subsection D from the measure in its entirety. Which allows for the standing order to remain in effect until the United States Food and Drug Administration classifies at least one emergency opioid antagonist as an over-the-counter drug.

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SB 748, as amended, directs the Commissioner of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services to designate a physician to issue a statewide standing order for emergency opioid antagonist within 30 days of the measure's effective date.

The standing order will authorize any licensed pharmacist, health care provider, or mental health or substance abuse provider to distribute emergency opioid antagonists to any person or entity within the state upon request, and allow for the possession, storage, distribution, and administration of emergency opioid antagonists by any individual or entity.
