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**Bill Analysis**

SB 902 provides that prior to the state joining a multistate voter list maintenance organization, the organization must certify that all persons it identifies as eligible to vote but not yet registered are citizens of the United States. The measure prohibits such organizations from releasing any voter registration data or motor vehicle license data received from this state to any other party unless such an organization may provide relevant matching information to a member state regarding duplicate registrations, deaths, or changes of residency involving persons identified in the data provided by this state. If such an organization is proven to provide such data contrary to the provisions of this measure, the state shall withdraw from the multistate voter list maintenance organization. The Attorney General is authorized to bring suit for damages against an organization in violation of the provisions of this measure. The measure directs the Secretary of the State Election Board to annually publish costs associated with membership in a multistate voter list maintenance organization as well as relevant statistical information. Additionally, the measure prohibits Service Oklahoma from providing motor vehicle license data for persons who are identified as not being citizens of the United States or whose citizenship status is unknown.

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
