Page 1, strike the title, enacting clause and entire bill and insert 12 13 "An Act relating to traumatic brain injury; stating legislative intent; creating the Advisory Council on 14 Traumatic Brain Injury for specified time period; providing for membership, appointment, terms and 15 selection of officers; requiring quorum; providing for travel reimbursement; stating duties and 16 responsibilities; requiring submission of annual summary of recommendations; requiring certain 17 registry and reporting thereto; authorizing specified agencies to implement certain programs; providing for 18 codification; and providing an effective date. 19 20 21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 22 A new section of law to be codified SECTION 1. NEW LAW 23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-291.8 of Title 63, unless 24 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

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1 It is the intent of the Oklahoma Legislature to provide 2 preventive education and other preventive actions concerning 3 traumatic brain injuries. It is also the intent of the Legislature 4 to ensure referral to the appropriate public and private entities 5 and agencies of those persons suffering from debilitating traumatic brain injuries so those persons can be rehabilitated to their 6 7 highest potential. Further, it is the intent of the Legislature that rehabilitation and preventive education be facilitated through 8 9 the use of mandatory reporting of traumatic brain injuries. The 10 intent of the Legislature shall be effected through the use of an 11 advisory council to provide guidelines and advice to agencies and 12 private entities to carry out the legislative intent.

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-291.9 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

16 A. There is hereby established until December 31, 2027, within 17 the State Department of Health an Advisory Council on Traumatic 18 Brain Injury. The Council shall consist of eleven (11) members and 19 shall include:

20 1. Six persons with brain injuries or relatives of persons with 21 brain injuries; and

22 2. Five other persons from professional groups, health
23 institutions, community groups and private industry.

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B. 1. Members of the Council shall be appointed by the
 Governor and shall serve for terms of four (4) years. The Council
 shall meet at least two times annually.

2. 4 The Council shall select from among its membership a chair 5 and vice-chair and such other officers as the members of the Council deem necessary. A majority of the members of the Council shall 6 7 constitute a quorum to transact business but no vacancy shall impair the right of the remaining members to perform the duties and 8 9 responsibilities of the Council. Members of the Council shall not 10 receive a salary but shall be allowed reimbursement for expenses 11 pursuant to the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

12 C. The duties and responsibilities of the Council shall be:
13 1. To provide advice and expertise to the State Department of
14 Health including but not limited to:

a. identifying, reviewing and promoting rehabilitation
opportunities for persons suffering from traumatic
brain injuries,

b. assisting the State Department of Health in
determining the number of persons fifty-five (55)
years of age and under who reside in a long-term care
facility due to traumatic brain injury, and
c. ensuring immediate family members and guardians of all
persons identified as residing in a long-term care

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1 2 facility due to traumatic brain injury are informed about rehabilitation opportunities;

2. To promote meetings and programs for the discussion of
reducing the debilitating effects of brain injuries and disseminate
information in cooperation with any other department, agency or
entity on the prevention, evaluation, care, treatment and
rehabilitation of persons affected by brain injuries;

3. To study and review current prevention, evaluation, care,
treatment and rehabilitation technologies and recommend appropriate
preparation, training, retraining and distribution of manpower and
resources in the provision of services to brain-injured persons
through private and public residential facilities, day programs and
other specialized services;

4. To report to the Governor and Legislature of the needs of
persons with brain injuries and family members of persons with brain
injuries and to recommend policies and practices to meet those
needs;

18 5. To encourage research into the causes, prevention and19 treatment of brain injuries;

20 6. To promote brain injury prevention and awareness throughout
21 the state; and

7. To perform additional duties as may be deemed necessary bythe State Department of Health.

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D. The Council shall provide an annual summary of recommendations to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the State Commissioner of Health not later than the tenth legislative day of each session of the Legislature.

6 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 7 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-291.10 of Title 63, unless 8 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

9 A. 1. The State Department of Health shall establish and
10 maintain a central registry of persons who die or are hospitalized
11 from traumatic brain injuries.

12 2. Beginning on November 1, 2023, all hospitals and related 13 institutions licensed under Section 1-702 of Title 63 of the 14 Oklahoma Statutes shall report to the State Department of Health 15 after the identification of any person suffering a traumatic brain 16 injury the name, age and residence of the person, the type and 17 extent of the traumatic brain injury and any other additional 18 information as may be deemed necessary by the Department.

The Office of the Chief Medical Examiner shall report to the
 State Department of Health any person who dies as a result of
 suffering a traumatic brain injury.

B. The State Department of Health shall forward to the Advisory
 Council on Traumatic Brain Injury by November 1 of each year an
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annual summary of the compiled statistics from information reported
 under this section.

6	The State Department of Health, the Department of Human Services

NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-291.8 of Title 63, unless 15 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 16 It is the intent of the Oklahoma Legislature to provide 17 preventive education and other preventive actions concerning 18 traumatic brain injuries. It is also the intent of the Legislature 19 to ensure referral to the appropriate public and private entities 20 and agencies of those individuals suffering from debilitating 21 traumatic brain injuries so those persons can be rehabilitated to 22 their highest potential. Further, it is the intent of the 23 Legislature that rehabilitation and preventive education be 24 facilitated through the use of mandatory reporting of traumatic

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brain injuries. The intent of the Legislature shall be effected through the use of an advisory council to provide guidelines and advice to agencies and private entities to carry out the legislative intent.

5 SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 6 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-291.9 of Title 63, unless 7 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. There is hereby established within the State Department of
Health an Advisory Council on Traumatic Brain Injury. The Council
shall consist of eleven (11) members and shall include:

Six people with brain injuries or relatives of persons with
 brain injuries; and

Five other individuals from professional groups, health
 institutions, community groups, and private industry.

B. 1. Members of the Council shall be appointed by the
Governor and shall serve for terms of four (4) years. The Council
shall meet at least two times annually.

2. The Council shall select from among its membership a chair and vice-chair and such other officers as the members of the Council deem necessary. A majority of the members of the Council shall constitute a quorum to transact business but no vacancy shall impair the right of the remaining members to perform the duties and responsibilities of the Council. Members of the Council shall not

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receive a salary but shall be allowed reimbursement for expenses
 pursuant to the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

C. The duties and responsibilities of the Council shall be:

 To provide advice and expertise to the State Department of
 Health in preparation, implementation and periodic review of a
 coordinated rehabilitation system for individuals suffering from
 traumatic brain injuries in Oklahoma by November 1, 2022;

To promote meetings and programs for the discussion of 9 reducing the debilitating effects of brain injuries and disseminate 10 information in cooperation with any other department, agency or 11 entity on the prevention, evaluation, care, treatment and 12 rehabilitation of persons affected by brain injuries;

3. To study and review current prevention, evaluation, care, treatment and rehabilitation technologies and recommend appropriate preparation, training, retraining and distribution of manpower and resources in the provision of services to brain-injured persons through private and public residential facilities, day programs and other specialized services;

19 4. To report to the Governor and Legislature of the needs of 20 persons with brain injuries and family members of persons with brain 21 injuries and to recommend policies and practices to meet those 22 needs;

23 5. To encourage research into the causes, prevention and
24 treatment of brain injuries;

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6. To promote brain injury prevention and awareness throughout
 the state; and

3 7. To perform additional duties as may be deemed necessary by4 the State Department of Health.

5 D. An annual summary of recommendations shall be provided by 6 the Council to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the 7 Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the State 8 Commissioner of Health not later than the tenth legislative day of 9 each session of the Legislature.

10 SECTION 8. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 11 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-291.10 of Title 63, unless 12 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The State Department of Health shall establish and maintain
a central registry of persons who die or are hospitalized from
traumatic brain injuries.

16 1. Every public and private health and social agency and 17 attending physician shall report to the State Department of Health 18 within seven (7) working days after the identification of any person 19 suffering a traumatic brain injury.

20 2. The State Medical Examiner shall report to the Department of 21 Health within seven (7) working days any individual who dies as a 22 result of suffering a traumatic brain injury.

3. The report shall contain the name, age, residence and thetype and extent of the traumatic brain injury and any other

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additional information as may be deemed necessary by the Department.
 The report shall be required of all public and private health and
 social agencies and attending physicians beginning November 1, 2023.

B. An annual summary of the compiled statistics shall be
forwarded to the Advisory Council on Traumatic Brain Injury by
November 1 of each year.

7 SECTION 9. A new section of law to be codified NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-291.11 of Title 63, unless 8 9 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 10 Beginning January 1, 2022, the State Department of Health shall 11 conduct an annual survey of nursing homes in the state to determine the number of individuals fifty-five (55) years of age and under who 12 13 reside in such homes due to traumatic brain injury. The immediate 14 family members and guardians of all individuals identified in such a 15 survey shall be informed about rehabilitation opportunities that 16 exist through public and private entities.

SECTION 10. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-291.12 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

It shall be the duty of the State Department of Health, the Department of Human Services and the Department of Transportation Highway Safety Division to implement programs for assistance, education and other preventive programs recommended by the Advisory Council on Traumatic Brain Injury.

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1	SECTION 11. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
2	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-291.13 of Title 63, unless
3	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
4	The Advisory Council on Traumatic Brain Injury shall cease to
5	exist on December 31, 2027.
6	SECTION 12. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
