Supp. 2018, Section 198.11b), which relates to the Strategic Planning 10 Committee on the Olmstead Decision; modifying state public policy for individuals with disabilities; providing priority for services in an integrated 11 setting; stating institutional placement shall be a last resort; creating the Commission on Independence 12 and Ability; describing purpose of Commission; 1.3 establishing membership of Commission; providing for filling of vacancies; establishing quorum 14 requirements; directing designation of Commission cochairs; providing for annual meeting schedule; 15 setting minimum number of annual meetings; requiring compliance with the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act; 16 authorizing Commission to divide into subcommittees; directing Office of the Attorney General to provide 17 staff assistance; authorizing use of staff expertise and services; permitting contract with outside 18 expertise; requiring cooperation of all state entities and employees; prohibiting compensation for 19 Commission members; providing for travel reimbursement of members; listing Commission duties 20 and responsibilities; requiring Commission to submit certain reports by specified dates; providing an 2.1 effective date; and declaring an emergency. 22 23

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

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SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 56 O.S. 2011, Section 198.11b, as amended by Section 233, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (56 O.S. Supp. 3 2018, Section 198.11b), is amended to read as follows:

Section 198.11b A. It is the public policy of the State of Oklahoma to:

- 1. Recognize and support individuals with disabilities by treating them with dignity and respect as productive members of our society in Oklahoma;
- 2. Acknowledge their contributions as productive and independent citizens in the state and the useful work they perform in their local communities;
- 3. Support a service delivery system for individuals with disabilities ensuring that the individuals, their families, or guardians are well informed as to the types of services and resources available to such individuals in order to encourage their independence, self-esteem, and self-worth, regardless of the severity of the disability; and
- 4. Recognize that self-choice on the part of individuals with disabilities is critical and that priority shall be given to providing services to people with disabilities in the most appropriate integrated setting for meeting their needs should be a paramount consideration when determining appropriate placement of such individuals in community-based programs, residential care facilities, or any other placement or service that benefits the

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1 | needs and well-being of individuals with disabilities.
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- 2 <u>Institutional services shall be the last resort, ensuring that all</u>
 3 resources available shall be exhausted prior to institutional
- 4 placement.

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B. There is hereby created the Strategic Planning Committee on the Olmstead Decision to continue until July 1, 2010 Commission on Independence and Ability. The purpose of the Committee Commission is to monitor the implementation of the comprehensive, strategic

plan for the State of Oklahoma regarding the Olmstead Decision:

- 1. Monitor and provide oversight of the Department of Human

 Services Aging Services Division and ADvantage Administration Unit

 (AAU) to ensure that people with disabilities are receiving services

 in the most integrated setting, consistent with the Olmstead

 Decision; and
- 2. Evaluate and expand service options for the Consumer-Directed Personal Assistance Services and Supports (CD-PASS) program.
- C. The Strategic Planning Committee on the Olmstead Decision

 Commission shall be composed of fifteen (15) appointed members,

 eighteen (18) and four (4) ex officio members, and representatives

 from disability-related organizations, all of whom shall be voting

 members, as follows:
 - 1. a. The Governor shall appoint:

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- (1) one person three members with disabilities who is a community placement service provider for persons with disabilities receive services

 through CD-PASS: one from Oklahoma City, one from Norman and one from the southwest region of the state,
- (2) one person member who is an advocate for persons

 with disabilities a representative from a

 nonprofit, federally funded, consumer-controlled

 center for independent living serving the

 Oklahoma City metropolitan area, and
- (3) one parent or personal representative of a person

 with disabilities,
- (4) one member from an organization that provides

 direct care services within the Advantage Waiver

 Program, and
- (5) one member who is a consumer representative of disability services a Medicaid managed care organization.
- b. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint:
 - (1) two three members of the State Senate with disabilities who receive services through CD-PASS: one from Tulsa, one from Bartlesville and one from the southeast region of the state,

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- (2) two members one member who are consumers of

 disability services is a representative from a

 nonprofit, federally funded, consumer-controlled

 center for independent living serving the Tulsa

 metropolitan area, and
- (3) one member with a disability who has moved from an institutional setting into the community is a representative of a Medicaid managed care organization.
- c. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint:
 - (1) two three members of the House of Representatives with disabilities who receive services through CD-PASS: one from Oklahoma City, one from Tulsa and one from the rural western region of the state,
 - (2) one parent or personal representative of a person

 with disabilities member who is a representative

 - (3) one member who is a consumer of disability services, and

4. The cochairs of the Committee Commission shall annually establish a schedule of each year's meetings. The Committee Commission shall meet at least four times annually.

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- 5. Proceedings of all meetings of the Committee Commission shall comply with the provisions of the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act.
- 6. The <u>Committee Commission</u> may divide into subcommittees in furtherance of its purpose.
- E. 1. The Department of Human Services and the Office of the Attorney General shall serve as lead agencies agency and as such shall provide primary staffing for the Committee Commission.

 Appropriate personnel from the Oklahoma Health Care Authority and the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services shall also assist with the work of the Committee.
- 2. The Committee Commission may use the expertise and services of the staffs of the State Senate and the House of Representatives and may, as necessary, employ and contract for the advice and services of experts in the field as well as other necessary professional and clerical staff.
- F. All departments, officers, agencies, and employees of this state shall cooperate with the <u>Committee Commission</u> in fulfilling its duties and responsibilities including, but not limited to, providing any information, records, or reports requested by the <u>Committee Commission</u>.

G. Members of the Committee Commission shall receive no compensation for their service, but shall receive travel reimbursement as follows:

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- 1. Legislative members of the Committee shall be reimbursed for necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in accordance with the provisions of Section 456 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and
- 2. Nonlegislative members of the Committee shall be reimbursed by their appointing authorities or respective agencies for necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in accordance with the State Travel Reimbursement Act.
- H. The duties and responsibilities of the Strategic Planning

 Committee on the Olmstead Decision Commission on Independence and

 Ability shall include, but need not be limited to:
 - a. monitoring the implementation of the comprehensive,

 strategic plan for Oklahomans with disabilities,

 pursuant to the Olmstead Decision Long-Term Services

 and Supports (LTSS) system, specifically CD-PASS,
 - b. reviewing the LTSS for CD-PASS and ADvantage service delivery system within the state and the way in which persons with disabilities currently access the services,
 - c. reviewing existing statutes, policies, programs, services and funding sources that affect Oklahomans

with disabilities, including, but not limited to, identifying unique approaches and strategies to funding,

- d. identifying and reviewing funding and resource information available to persons with disabilities and their families in this state,
- e. identifying gaps and barriers in programs and services to individuals with disabilities and making any recommendations to enhance programs and the delivery system for persons with disabilities in Oklahoma,
- f. examining the feasibility of expanding the eligibility criteria for people served by the Developmental

 Disabilities Services Division of the Department of

 Human Services to include people with disabilities who are not eligible for the Advantage ADvantage Waiver program through the Aging Services Division and those with other diagnoses who are at risk of out-of-home placement,
- g. studying the feasibility and impact of requiring that assistive technology suppliers in this state meet national certification requirements, and
- h. taking all other actions necessary to monitor and assist with the implementation of the comprehensive

1 strategic plan maximize LTSS for people with 2 disabilities in the most integrated setting. 3 The Committee Commission shall prepare and submit a an I. 4 initial report of its findings and recommendations to the Legislature and Governor by July 15, 2007 October 31, 2019, and each 5 6 July 15 thereafter, and shall submit a final report by July 1, 2010 7 2022. 8 SECTION 2.
