12	Management and Homeland Security; making an appropriation; identifying source; establishing amount; providing purpose; requiring and limiting the
13	utilization of funds; creating certain special account; limiting duration of account; requiring
14	certain determination; providing and limiting the nature of account and funds within account;
15	authorizing agency to submit request for certain deposit or transfer; requiring certain compliance and
16	verification; authorizing certain memorandums of understanding; limiting scope; prohibiting certain
17	memoranda terms; authorizing and limiting the promulgation of rules and utilization of procedures;
18	authorizing and limiting the retention of monies for administration costs; requiring certain reports and
19	submissions to certain entities; requiring appearance before certain joint committee; limiting duration of
20 21	certain requirements; providing determination process; providing for noncodification; and declaring
21	an emergency.
23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
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1SECTION 1.NEW LAWA new section of law not to be2codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

3 There is hereby appropriated to the Emergency Relief and Impacts 4 Revolving Fund created in Enrolled House Bill No. 1017 of the 1st 5 Extraordinary Session of the 59th Oklahoma Legislature, from any 6 monies not otherwise appropriated from the Statewide Recovery Fund 7 of the State Treasury created in Enrolled House Bill No. 3349 of the 2nd Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of Twenty-Five 8 9 Million Dollars (\$25,000,000.00) or so much thereof as may be 10 necessary to administer the Emergency Relief and Impacts Grant 11 Program. Such funds shall be utilized in a manner consistent with 12 the recommendations adopted by the Joint Committee on Pandemic 13 Relief Funding on May 19, 2023.

14SECTION 2.NEW LAWA new section of law not to be15codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

16 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a Statewide Α. 17 Recovery Special Account for the Oklahoma Department of Emergency 18 Management and Homeland Security for each appropriation section of 19 this act. The duration of such accounts shall continue for the 20 period of time that monies related to the American Rescue Plan Act 21 of 2021 are being budgeted, expended, or managed in the state. The 22 ending of such period shall be determined by the State Treasurer, 23 and shall result in the closing of such accounts as a matter of law. 24 Such accounts shall be continuing accounts as otherwise provided in

1 this section, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall 2 exclusively consist of monies related to the relevant appropriation made in this act and as otherwise directed by law. All monies 3 4 deposited to the credit of such accounts are hereby appropriated and 5 may be budgeted and expended by the Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management and Homeland Security in accordance with the provisions 6 7 of this act. Expenditures from such accounts shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as 8 9 prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and 10 Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

The Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management and Homeland 11 Β. 12 Security is authorized to request in writing that the monies 13 appropriated by the provisions of this act be deposited or 14 transferred to the accounts created pursuant to subsection A of this 15 section. No later than seven (7) calendar days from the date of 16 such request, the Director of the Office of Management and 17 Enterprise Services shall comply with such request and verify to the 18 requesting agency that such deposit or transfer has been completed. A new section of law not to be 19 SECTION 3. NEW LAW 20 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows: 21 The Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management and Homeland 22 Security may enter into memorandums of understanding with other 23 agencies of the State of Oklahoma for the auditing, documentation, 24 evaluation, implementation, oversight, reporting, and management of

funds and associated efforts related to the appropriations made in this act; provided, that no such memorandum of understanding shall require or include, as an option or condition, the direct or practical transfer or relinquishment of control by the agency appropriated such funds to budget, expend, allocate, and request the distribution of the funds appropriated by this act.

7 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
8 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

9 The Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management and Homeland 10 Security may promulgate rules, utilize existing rules, establish 11 procedures, and utilize existing procedures to implement the 12 provisions of this act; provided, such rules and procedures do not 13 conflict with or impede the provisions of this act.

14 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be 15 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

16 The Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management and Homeland 17 Security shall retain no more than two percent (2%) of the funds 18 appropriated by this act to reimburse:

Costs incurred by the Oklahoma Department of Emergency
 Management and Homeland Security; or

Costs incurred on the agency's behalf, associated with the 22 administration of the appropriated funds and programming required by 23 the Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management and Homeland 24 Security under the provisions of this act; provided, that no funds shall be retained that would be disallowable under the provisions of
 the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021.

3 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be 4 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

5 A. The Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management and Homeland6 Security shall:

1. Submit to the Chairs of the Joint Committee on Pandemic
Relief Funding, or any successor Oklahoma House of Representatives
or Oklahoma State Senate legislative committee or joint committee,
as designated by the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of
Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State
Senate:

- a. a written or electronic quarterly report detailing the
 budgeting, expenditure, and management of all monies
 appropriated in this act, and
- b. a copy of all memorandums of understanding and
 contracts with third parties entered into by the
 Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management and
 Homeland Security to facilitate, assist, or administer
 powers and duties provided to the Department under the
 provisions of this act; and

22 2. At the Joint Committee on Pandemic Relief Funding's request, 23 appear before the Joint Committee no later than six (6) months after 24 the effective date of this act, and as otherwise requested by the

1 Joint Committee to provide a status update regarding the 2 implementation of the provisions of this act. The provisions of subsection A of this section shall remain 3 в. 4 applicable for the period of time that monies appropriated under 5 this act are being budgeted, expended, or managed in the state. The 6 ending of such period shall be determined by the State Treasurer, 7 and shall be reported to the Governor, the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives, and the President Pro Tempore of the 8 9 Oklahoma State Senate. 10 SECTION 7.
