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20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
21	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 19 O.S. 2011, Section 180.58, is
22	amended to read as follows:
23	Section 180.58 A. Sections 180.58 through 180.68 of this title
24	shall apply to all counties which do not approve an exemption of

1 household goods of the heads of families and livestock employed in 2 support of the family from ad valorem taxation pursuant to the 3 provisions of Section 6 of Article X of the Oklahoma Constitution.

B. The purpose of Sections 180.58 through 180.68 of this title
is to codify and revise the laws of the state relating to the
salaries and wages of county officers and their deputies and
employees, and to establish said salaries and wages by general law
applicable throughout the state under a uniform schedule fixing such
salaries and wages and future increases and reductions thereof upon
the following bases:

The available revenues of the several counties out of which
 such salaries and wages may be paid;

13 2. The amount of services required to be performed;

14 3. The monetary value of such services in relation to that of 15 nongovernmental services of similar nature in the areas wherein such 16 services are performed; and

17 4. The relative amounts of services required of the various
18 county officers, their deputies and employees upon investigation and
19 full consideration of the applicable facts.

20 C. The Legislature has determined that the foregoing bases of 21 such schedule gradations generally are cognate to the combination of 22 the following factors:

23 1. The net gross assessed valuation of all tangible taxable
24 property of the county (total taxable valuation less homestead)

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1 exemption allowances except those additional homestead exemptions
2 authorized and allowed pursuant to Section 2890 of Title 68 of the
3 Oklahoma Statutes), hereinafter referred to as "service-ability";
4 and

5 2. The population of the county, hereinafter referred to as the6 "service-load".

7 The application of said factors properly establishes a rational and 8 relevant formula for uniformity of salaries and wages and of future 9 increases and decreases thereof.

10SECTION 2.AMENDATORY19 O.S. 2011, Section 180.59, is11amended to read as follows:

12 Section 180.59 The net gross assessed total tangible property 13 valuation for ad valorem tax purposes in each county, or service-14 ability factor, shall be determined from the county assessor's 15 certificate of such valuations as filed with the excise board of the 16 county for the purpose of computation of ad valorem tax levies of 17 each year, and no subsequent amendments thereto to effect an 18 increase or decrease in such valuations shall have any effect for 19 such year whatsoever.

20 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 19 O.S. 2011, Section 180.62, as 21 amended by Section 1, Chapter 27, O.S.L. 2019 (19 O.S. Supp. 2020, 22 Section 180.62), is amended to read as follows:

Section 180.62 A. The basic salaries of county officers upon
 which all salaries and future increases or decreases thereof shall

1 not be less than Nineteen Thousand Dollars (\$19,000.00) per annum 2 nor shall they exceed Forty-four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars 3 (\$44,500.00) Forty-nine Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$49,500.00) 4 per annum.

B. The board of county commissioners, or if the county has
elected to come under the County Budget Act, the budget board
members of the county, shall set the salaries for all elected county
officials within the limits allowed by law.

9 C. The annual salaries fixed by this act shall be paid either 10 monthly or twice a month, by order of the board of county 11 commissioners, for each month or fraction thereof the incumbent 12 lawfully occupies and holds title to such office.

13SECTION 4.AMENDATORY19 O.S. 2011, Section 180.63, is14amended to read as follows:

Section 180.63 In every county in this state, the salary of all county officers named in paragraph 1 of Section 180.61 of this title may <u>shall</u> be increased from the applicable basic salary named in Section 180.62 of this title, for net <u>gross assessed</u> valuation or serviceability, according to the following scale:

20 A. To the basic salary:

21 1. Add the product of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) times each 22 One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) net gross assessed valuation, or 23 major fraction thereof, until a net gross assessed valuation of 24 Seventy-five Million Dollars (\$75,000,000.00) is reached;

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2. Thereafter add the product of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00)
 times each additional Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) net gross
 <u>assessed</u> valuation, or major fraction thereof, until a net gross
 <u>assessed</u> valuation of Five Hundred Million Dollars (\$500,000,000.00)
 is reached;

3. Thereafter add the product of One Hundred Twenty-five
Dollars (\$125.00) times each additional Seven Million Dollars
(\$7,000,000.00) net gross assessed valuation, or major fraction
thereof, until a net gross assessed valuation of Two Billion Dollars
(\$2,000,000.00) is reached; and

4. Thereafter as to all additional net gross assessed valuation
add the product of One Hundred Twenty-five Dollars (\$125.00) times
each additional Twenty Million Dollars (\$20,000,000.00) net gross
assessed valuation, or major fraction thereof.

B. Also, the salary of each county officer shall be
additionally increased from the basic salary named in Section 180.62
of this title, and the additions thereto heretofore provided in this
section, for population or service load according to the following
scale:

20 1. The product of Twelve Dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50) times 21 each one thousand (1,000) population, or major fraction thereof 22 until a population of seventy-five thousand (75,000) is reached; 23 thereafter<u>;</u>

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2. The product of Twelve Dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50) times
 each additional five thousand (5,000) population, or major fraction
 thereof until a population of one hundred fifty thousand (150,000)
 is reached; thereafter add<u>; and</u>

3. The product of Twelve Dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50) times
each additional ten thousand (10,000) population, or major fraction
thereof.

8 C. This section shall not reduce the present salary of any
9 county officer in Oklahoma during their present term of office.
10 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 19 O.S. 2011, Section 180.68, as
11 amended by Section 2, Chapter 27, O.S.L. 2019 (19 O.S. Supp. 2020,
12 Section 180.68), is amended to read as follows:

13 Section 180.68 The date on which changes in the salaries and 14 rates of pay for county officers and their deputies, aides and 15 assistants under this act due to changes in population or, gross 16 assessed valuation or both population and gross assessed valuation 17 in any county shall take effect, shall be as of, on and or after the 18 first day of January July based upon the population as shown by the 19 latest Federal Decennial Census for the State of Oklahoma, and the 20 total net gross assessed valuations of tangible taxable properties 21 for such fiscal year as shown by the official certificate which the 22 county assessor files with the county excise board for the purpose 23 of computing appropriations and levies for such current fiscal year.
