- B. No special election shall be called if the such a vacancy occurs in the office of a member of the United States Senate in an even-numbered year if the term of the office expires the following year. In such case, the candidate elected to the office at the regular General Election shall be appointed by the Governor to fill the unexpired term.
- C. If such a vacancy occurs in the office of a member of the
 United States House of Representatives in an even-numbered year, the
 Regular Primary Election, Runoff Primary Election or General
 Election for that office shall be deemed to also serve as a Special
 Election to fill the unexpired term as designated by the Governor.
 Within thirty (30) days after such vacancy occurs, the Governor
 shall issue a Writ of Election declaring the same, and the candidate
 elected at the Regular Election shall be deemed to have also been
 elected at a Special Election to fill the unexpired term.
- D. The proclamation required by Section 12-102 of this title shall serve as the Writ of Election described in this section.
