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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 52 O.S. 2011, Section 320.1, is
17	amended to read as follows:
18	Section 320.1 A. After the effective date of this act, it
19	shall be unlawful to locate any habitable structure within:
20	1. A The wellbore of an active vertically or horizontally
21	drilled oil or gas well within a radius of one hundred twenty-five
22	(125) five hundred (500) feet from the wellbore of an active well
23	any occupied structure; or
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2. A radius of fifty (50) feet from the The wellbore of an active vertically or horizontally drilled oil or gas well within a radius of three hundred (300) feet from any producing freshwater well; or

- 3. The center of any surface equipment or other equipment necessary for the operation of an active well, including, but not limited to, hydrocarbon and brine storage vessels, tanks, compressors, heaters, separators, dehydrators, or any other related equipment, within a radius of one hundred (100) feet from any occupied structure.
- B. Provided, however, the After the effective date of this act, it shall be unlawful to locate the wellbore of an active vertically or horizontally drilled oil or gas well that uses hydraulic fracturing techniques within a radius of two thousand (2,000) feet from any occupied structure or any producing freshwater well.
- C. For purposes of this section, "occupied structure" means any building or structure that requires a certificate of occupancy or building or structure intended for human occupancy, including homes, schools and hospitals.
- D. The provisions of this section shall not prohibit an operator and surface owner from agreeing in writing to setback provisions with distances different from those set forth in this section. Provided, however, the surface owner may waive the setback

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provisions only with regard to an occupied structure or producing
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    freshwater well located on the real property of the owner.
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        SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.
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
