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BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1600.2 of Title 69, unless there

2 three-tenths (1.3) miles east of the intersection of State Highway 3
3 and County Road N4495 in McCurtain County shall be designated for
4 Mitchell Bobb, WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

5 3. The bridge located on State Highway 3 approximately two
6 thousand (2,000) feet west of the town of Oleta in Pushmataha County
7 shall be designated for Victor Brown, WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

8 4. The bridge located on U.S. Highway 259 approximately five
9 and three-quarter (5.75) miles south of Smithville in McCurtain
10 County shall be designated for Ben Carterby, WWI Choctaw Code
11 Talker;

12 5. The bridge located on U.S. Highway 70 approximately six
13 hundred (600) feet west of the intersection of U.S. Highway 70 and
14 County Road N3770 in Bryan County shall be designated for Ben
15 Colbert, WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

16 6. The bridge located on State Highway 3 over Beaver Creek east
17 of Antlers in Pushmataha County shall be designated for George E.
18 Davenport, WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

19 7. The bridge located on State Highway 3 over Dumpling Creek
20 east of Antlers in Pushmataha County shall be designated for Joseph
21 H. Davenport, WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

22 8. The bridge located on State Highway 3 over Boktuklo Creek
23 west of Broken Bow in McCurtain County shall be designated for James
24 M. Edwards, WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

1 9. The bridge located on U.S. Highway 70 over Raymond Gary Lake
2 in Choctaw shall be designated for Tobias W. Frazier, WWI Choctaw
3 Code Talker;

4 10. The bridge located on U.S. Highway 70 over Sulphur Creek at
5 the intersection of U.S. Highway 70 and County Road E2078 in Bryan
6 County shall be designated for Benjamin Hampton, WWI Choctaw Code
7 Talker;

8 11. The bridge located on U.S. Highway 259 crossing over Eagle
9 Fork Creek approximately one-half (0.5) mile south of Smithville in
10 McCurtain County shall be designated for Noel Johnson, WWI Choctaw
11 Code Talker;

12 12. The bridge located on State Highway 48 over Sincere Creek
13 in eastern Pontotoc County shall be designated for Otis Leader, WWI
14 Choctaw Code Talker;

15 13. The bridge located on U.S. Highway 259 over Yanubbee Creek
16 north of Broken Bow in McCurtain County shall be designated for
17 Solomon Bond Louis, WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

18 14. The bridge located on State Highway 7 over Pennington Creek
19 in central Johnston County shall be designated for Pete Maytubby,
20 WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

21 15. The bridge located on northbound State Highway 3
22 approximately two thousand three hundred (2,300) feet north of the
23 State Highway 3 bridge over Little River in McCurtain County shall
24 be designated for Jeff Nelson, WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

1 16. The bridge located on U.S. Highway 70 over Big Creek east
2 of Bokchito in Bryan County shall be designated for Joseph
3 Oklahombi, WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

4 17. The bridge located on southbound State Highway 3
5 approximately two thousand three hundred (2,300) feet north of the
6 State Highway 3 bridge over Little River in McCurtain County shall
7 be designated for Robert Taylor, WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

8 18. The bridge located on the U.S. Highway 70 Bypass over Old
9 Highway 70 east of Durant in Bryan County shall be designated for
10 Charles Walter Veach, WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

11 19. The bridge located on U.S. Highway 70 at the intersection
12 of U.S. Highway 70 and County Road N4750 east of Broken Bow in
13 McCurtain County shall be designated for Calvin Wilson, WWI Choctaw
14 Code Talker;

15 20. The bridge located on State Highway 113 approximately one
16 and one-quarter (1.25) miles south of the intersection of State
17 Highway 113 and County Road E1368 in Pittsburg County shall be
18 designated for Forreston Baker, WWII Choctaw Code Talker;

19 21. The bridge located on State Highway 1 approximately one
20 thousand eight hundred (1,800) feet west of the intersection of
21 State Highway 1 and the Indian Nation Turnpike in Pittsburg County
22 shall be designated for Schlicht Billy, WWII Choctaw Code Talker;

23 22. The bridge located on State Highway 1 approximately one and
24 six-tenths (1.6) miles west of the intersection of State Highway 1

1 and the Indian Nation Turnpike in Pittsburg County shall be
2 designated for Andrew Perry, WWII Choctaw Code Talker; and

3 23. The bridge on State Highway 31 at the eastern municipal
4 limits of Krebs shall be designated for Davis Pickens, WWII Choctaw
5 Code Talker.

6 D. The Department shall cause suitable permanent markers
7 bearing the names listed pursuant to subsection C of this section to
8 be placed upon the corresponding bridges designated in subsection C
9 of this section.

10 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
11 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.250 of Title 69, unless
12 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

13 The portion of State Highway 33 in Payne County beginning at the
14 Cimarron River in southwest Payne County and extending east to the
15 junction of State Highway 33 and U.S. Highway 177 shall be
16 designated as the "Jennifer Lea Briggs and Heather Wilson Memorial
17 Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable
18 permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

19 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.251 of Title 69, unless
21 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

22 The bridge over Interstate 35 on Historic Route 66 in northern
23 Oklahoma County shall be designated as the "Keith Alan Copeland
24 Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause

1 suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the
2 bridge.

3 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
4 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.252 of Title 69, unless
5 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

6 The bridge crossing over the BNSF Railroad on U.S. Highway 60
7 located approximately one and one-half (1.5) miles east of Wyandotte
8 in Ottawa County shall be designated as the "CPL Eldon Ervin
9 Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause
10 suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the
11 bridge.

12 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
13 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.253 of Title 69, unless
14 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

15 The bridge located on Interstate Highway 40 crossing S.E. 29th
16 Street in Midwest City shall be designated as the "James Everett
17 Clark III Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall
18 cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on
19 the bridge.

20 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.254 of Title 69, unless
22 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

23 The portion of State Highway 31 in Pittsburg County beginning at
24 the intersection of State Highway 31 and 9th Street in McAlester

1 extending east approximately four and one-half (4.5) miles to the
2 intersection of State Highway 31 and Adamson Road shall be
3 designated as the "Col. Noble A. Miller, USAF - WWII, Korea and
4 Vietnam, Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall
5 cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on
6 the highway.

7 SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
8 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.255 of Title 69, unless
9 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

10 The bridge crossing over the Arkansas River on State Highway 99
11 on the border between Osage and Pawnee Counties shall be designated
12 as the "SSG Jack Morgan Memorial Bridge". The Department of
13 Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that
14 name to be placed on the bridge.

15 SECTION 8. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.256 of Title 69, unless
17 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

18 The portion of U.S. Highway 377 in Johnston County beginning
19 north of Tishomingo at the intersection of U.S. Highway 377 and Golf
20 Course Road extending south four thousand (4,000) feet shall be
21 designated as the "Lt. Lowry Douglas Durlington Memorial Highway".
22 The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent
23 markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

8 Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers
9 bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

10 SECTION 10. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
11 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.258 of Title 69, unless
12 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

13 The portion of State Highway 99 in Lincoln County beginning at
14 the northern county border extending southward to the intersection
15 of State Highway 99 and State Highway 66 shall be designated as the
16 "Officer Nathan B. Graves Memorial Highway". The Department of
17 Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that
18 name to be placed on the highway.

19 SECTION 11. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.259 of Title 69, unless
21 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

22 The portion of U.S. Highway 59 in LeFlore County beginning at
23 the intersection of U.S. Highway 59 and State Highway 128 in
24 Heavener extending north two (2) miles shall be designated as the

1 "Pearl Harbor Veterans: CBM Doyle E. Winters, BM1c Jerry E. Roop and
2 S2c Donald G. Loe Memorial Highway". The Department of
3 Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that
4 name to be placed on the highway.

5 SECTION 12. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
6 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.260 of Title 69, unless
7 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

8 The bridge over Elk Creek on State Highway 44 approximately two
9 and one-half (2.5) miles south of the municipal limits of Sentinel
10 shall be designated as the "RM3 Bill Lester Driver, US Navy,
11 Memorial Bridge, WWII Veteran". The Department of Transportation
12 shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be
13 placed on the bridge.

14 SECTION 13. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.262 of Title 69, unless
16 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 The portion of Interstate 40 in Pottawatomie County beginning at
18 mile marker 184 and extending east to mile marker 186 shall be
19 designated as the "HM3 (FMF) Eric "Doc" Warren Memorial Highway".
20 The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent
21 markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

22 SECTION 14. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017."

20 SECTION 21. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.255 of Title 69, unless
22 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

23 The bridge located on Interstate Highway 40 crossing S.E. 29th
24 Street in Midwest City shall be designated as the "James Everett

1 Clark III Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall
2 cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on
3 the bridge.

4 SECTION 22. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
5 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.256 of Title 69, unless
6 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

7 The portion of State Highway 31 in Pittsburg County beginning at
8 the intersection of State Highway 31 and 9th Street in McAlester
9 extending east approximately four and one-half (4.5) miles to the
10 intersection of State Highway 31 and Adamson Road shall be
11 designated as the "Col Noble A. Miller, USAF - WWII, Korea and
12 Vietnam, Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall
13 cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on
14 the highway.

15 SECTION 23. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.257 of Title 69, unless
17 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

18 The bridge crossing over the Arkansas River on State Highway 99
19 on the border between Osage and Pawnee Counties shall be designated
20 as the "SSG Jack Morgan Memorial Bridge". The Department of
21 Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that
22 name to be placed on the bridge.

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1 SECTION 24. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.258 of Title 69, unless
3 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 The portion of U.S. Highway 377 in Johnston County beginning
5 north of Tishomingo at the intersection of U.S. Highway 377 and Golf
6 Course Road extending south four thousand (4,000) feet shall be
7 designated as the "Lt. Lowry Douglas Durlington Memorial Highway".
8 The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent
9 markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

10 SECTION 25. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
11 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.259 of Title 69, unless
12 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

13 The portion of U.S. Highway 62 in Lawton beginning at the
14 intersection of U.S. Highway 62 and NW 82nd Street extending east to
15 the intersection of U.S. Highway 62 and Interstate 44 shall be
16 designated as the "SPC Sonny Gene Sampler Memorial Highway". The
17 Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers
18 bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

19 SECTION 26. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.260 of Title 69, unless
21 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

22 The portion of State Highway 99 in Lincoln County beginning at
23 the northern county border extending southward to the intersection
24 of State Highway 99 and State Highway 66 shall be designated as the

1 "Officer Nathan B. Graves Memorial Highway". The Department of
2 Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that
3 name to be placed on the highway.

4 SECTION 27. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
5 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.261 of Title 69, unless
6 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

7 The portion of U.S. Highway 59 in LeFlore County beginning at
8 the intersection of U.S. Highway 59 and State Highway 128 in
9 Heavener extending north two (2) miles shall be designated as the
10 "Pearl Harbor Veterans: CBM Doyle E. Winters, BM1c Jerry E. Roop,
11 and S2c Donald G. Loe Memorial Highway". The Department of
12 Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that
13 name to be placed on the highway.

14 SECTION 28. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
