- B. The online admission portal or website required in subsection A of this section shall:
- 1. Contain or link to other websites that contain high school planning, college planning and financial planning information;
- 2. Include a means for comparing the tuition, fees and other costs for each degree program offered at each institution within the State System; and
- 3. Create a unique identification number for each student upon completion and submission of an admission form that shall be used by all institutions within the State System for purposes of identifying students who apply and while they are enrolled at the institution.
- C. The State Regents shall have the online admission portal or website completed and fully implemented no later than January 1, 2020.
- SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.
