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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
20	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1000.21, as
21	amended by Section 2, Chapter 223, O.S.L. 2014 (59 O.S. Supp. 2016,
22	Section 1000.21), is amended to read as follows:
23	Section 1000.21 A. 1. There is hereby created the Oklahoma
24	Uniform Building Code Commission within the Construction Industries

2	authorized to a	dminister the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code
3	Commission Act	and exercise all incidental powers necessary and
4	proper to imple	ment and enforce the provisions of the Oklahoma

6	thereto. The O	klahoma Uniform Building Code Commission shall
7	consist of elev	en (11) members, nine of whom shall be appointed by
8	the Governor wi	th the advice and consent of the Senate as follows:

11	C	onstruction,
12	b. o	ne member who is a general contractor from a
13	s	tatewide organization that represents commercial

1 pursuant to the provisions of the Internal Revenue 2 Code, 26 U.S.C., Section 170(a), who has represented 3 municipalities and had statutory functions for 4 municipalities for at least fifteen (15) years prior 5 to November 1, 2005, one member who is a Certified Building Official 6 g. 7 employed by a political subdivision, h. one member who is a licensed architect from a 8 9 statewide organization that represents architects, and 10 i. one member who is from the insurance industry with 11 knowledge of building codes and experience in property 12 loss mitigation. 13 2. The members shall be appointed for staggered terms of four 14 (4) years, beginning July 1, 2009. A full term of office for 15 purposes of determining term limits provided in subsection C of this 16 section shall be the completion of a full four-year term of 17 appointment. 18 The remaining two members of the Commission shall be the Β. 19 State Fire Marshal, or a designee, and an appointee of the

20 Construction Industries Board.

C. Appointed members shall continue in office until a successor
is appointed by the Governor, notwithstanding the term limitations.
No appointed member shall serve more than two consecutive full fouryear terms; provided, such a member shall be eligible to serve until

1 a successor is appointed, and such member may be reappointed after a 2 two-year absence from the Commission. The Governor shall fill all 3 vacancies and unexpired terms in the same manner as the original 4 appointment of the member whose position is to be filled. No initial appointment to a term of less than four (4) years or any 5 partial-term appointment to fill a vacancy or unexpired term of 6 7 another member shall be counted for purposes of determining term limits. An appointed member may be removed by the Governor for 8 9 cause.

D. Whenever a member of the Commission is absent from more than one-half (1/2) of all meetings of the governing body, regular and special, held within any period of twelve (12) consecutive months, the member shall thereupon cease to hold office by operation of law. SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1000.22, is amended to read as follows:

16 Section 1000.22 1. A. The Oklahoma Uniform Building Code 17 Commission shall organize immediately after July 1, 2009, and 18 annually thereafter, by electing annually elect from among its 19 members a chair and a vice-chair. The Commission shall hold 20 regularly scheduled meetings at least once each quarter at a time 21 and place determined by the Commission and may hold such special 22 meetings, emergency meetings or continued or reconvened meetings as 23 found by the Commission to be necessary. A majority of the members

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of the Commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of
 business.

3	$\frac{2}{2}$ B. The chair shall preside at meetings of the Commission,
4	set the agenda, sign orders and other required documents, coordinate
5	Commission activities and perform such other duties as may be
6	prescribed by the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission Act.
7	$\frac{3}{2}$ C. The vice-chair shall perform the duties of the chair
8	during the absence or disability of the chair and shall perform such
9	other duties as may be prescribed by the Oklahoma Uniform Building
10	<u>Code</u> Commission <u>Act</u> .
11	4. The Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission Chief
12	Executive Officer, at the discretion of the Commission, shall:
13	a. keep a record of all proceedings of the Commission and
14	certify to actions of the Commission,
15	b. oversee the receipt and deposit of all monies received
16	by the Commission in the appropriate revolving funds,
17	c. submit, at the first regular meeting of the Commission
18	after the end of each fiscal year, a fully itemized
19	report of the receipts and disbursements for the prior
20	fiscal year, showing the amount of funds on hand, and
21	d. perform such other duties as are prescribed in this
22	act or as may be prescribed by the Commission.
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5. The Commission shall comply with the provisions of the
 Oklahoma Open Meeting Act, the Oklahoma Open Records Act and the
 Administrative Procedures Act.

4 <u>6. D.</u> All members of the Commission and such employees as
5 determined by the Commission shall be bonded as required by Sections
6 85.26 through 85.31 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

7 7. E. The liability of any member or employee of the Commission
8 acting within the scope of Commission duties or employment shall be
9 governed by The Governmental Tort Claims Act.

10 8. F. Members of the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission 11 and members of all technical committees shall serve without 12 compensation, but shall be reimbursed for all actual and necessary 13 expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in accordance 14 with the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1000.23, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 223, O.S.L. 2014 (59 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1000.23), is amended to read as follows:

Section 1000.23 A. The Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission shall have the power and the duty to review and adopt recommend to the Commissioner of Labor standards and practices pursuant to this act by reviewing and adopting all building codes for residential and commercial construction to be used by all entities within this state. Codes and standards adopted by the

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1 Commission shall be the minimum standards for residential and 2 commercial construction in this state.

B. All public projects shall abide by such minimum standards
and requirements; provided, nothing in the Oklahoma Uniform Building
Code Commission Act shall prevent or take away from state agencies
the authority to enact and enforce requirements containing higher
standards and requirements than such minimum standards and
requirements.

9 C. Municipalities and other political subdivisions shall abide 10 by such minimum standards and requirements; provided, nothing in the 11 Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission Act shall prevent or take 12 away from such municipalities and other political subdivisions the 13 authority to enact and enforce requirements containing higher 14 standards and requirements than such minimum standards and 15 requirements.

16 D. The Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission shall have the 17 power and duty to establish recommend to the Commissioner of Labor a 18 training and certification process for all residential and 19 commercial building code inspectors that prescribes standards, 20 practices and procedures for prelicensing inspector training and 21 other inspector training that enhances the education of building and 22 construction inspectors; provided the training does not infringe 23 upon the education requirements and process under the Oklahoma 24 Inspectors Act. Prelicensing programs prescribing the standards,

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1 practices and procedures for prelicensing building inspectors for 2 use by other state agencies and other education providers, both 3 public and private, may be developed through the use of a technical 4 committee developing any program or curriculum and recommending to the Board proposed administrative rules setting forth any standards 5 6 and procedures to be adopted pursuant to paragraph 1 of subsection A of Section 1000.24 of this title. The Commission shall establish 7 regional prelicensing training on a regional basis for the purpose 8 9 of training the county and municipal inspectors in the Uniform 10 Building Code statewide building codes adopted pursuant to this act. 11 The regional training shall be offered at no cost to the participant 12 building and construction inspector trainee and shall be funded from 13 the funds received pursuant to Section 1000.25 of this title. Each 14 inspector operating in this state on behalf of any state agency or 15 any municipal or county office may complete participate in regional 16 training and be issued a certification for inspections by the 17 Uniform Building Code Commission on and after January 1, 2015 18 certificate of completion for any training program established 19 pursuant to this act; however, any certificate of completion is 20 subject to the continuing education approval process of the 21 licensing entity. The training and certification applications 22 standards and procedures, qualifications and application procedures 23 for the instructor, provider, if a nonstate governmental entity, and 24 the inspector trainee applications shall be promulgated by

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<u>administrative</u> rules of the Commission Department of Labor. The
 Commission may establish forms Forms and procedures may be
 <u>established</u> to implement and administer the provisions of this
 section.

5 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1000.24, is 6 amended to read as follows:

7 Section 1000.24 A. 1. Beginning July 1, 2009, pursuant Pursuant to and in compliance with Article I of the Administrative 8 9 Procedures Act, the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission 10 Department of Labor shall have the power to adopt, amend, repeal and promulgate rules as may be necessary to perform the duties required 11 12 under the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission Act. Rules 13 authorized under this section shall not become effective prior to 14 October 1, 2009.

15 2. Beginning October 1, 2009, the Commission shall have the 16 power to enforce the provisions of the Oklahoma Uniform Building 17 Code Commission Act.

Any codes adopted by state agencies, municipalities or other political subdivisions of the state prior to uniform codes being adopted by the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission, pursuant to the provisions of, or rules promulgated pursuant to, the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission Act, shall be considered valid and in effect until uniform codes are adopted by the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission.

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B. The Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission shall have the following powers:

3 Exercise all incidental powers and duties which are 1. 4 necessary to effectuate the provisions of the Oklahoma Uniform 5 Building Code Commission Act; 6 2. Adopt and have an official seal; 7 3. Maintain an administrative staff, including, but not limited to, an Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission Chief Executive 8 9 Officer; 10 4. Direct such other expenditures as may be necessary in the 11 performance of its duties, including, but not limited to, 12 expenditures for office space, equipment, furnishings and contracts 13 for services. All expenditures shall be made pursuant to the 14 Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act; 15 5. 2. Appoint technical committees to review and recommend for 16 adoption all building codes. The technical committees shall review 17 and recommend building codes with any amendments for adoption by the 18 Commission and receive requests for advisory opinions for 19 interpretation of any statewide building code adopted pursuant to 20 this act, evaluate the requests for appropriateness of need for an 21 advisory opinion, assign any requests to the appropriate technical 22 committee requesting participation from entities responsible for the 23 enforcement of any code involved in the request providing deference 24 to an entity's previous interpretation and, upon recommendation of a

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1 <u>technical committee, issue advisory opinions interpreting the</u> 2 adopted statewide code; and

6. 3. Create a website listing all building codes adopted by
the Commission and any advisory opinions issued. The website shall
provide a method for listing all codes adopted by a state agency,
city or any other political subdivision of the state containing
higher standards and requirements than the codes adopted pursuant to
the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission Act as required in
Section 14-107 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

10 C. After October 1, 2009, the Commission The Department of 11 Labor shall account for all receipts and expenditures of the monies 12 of the Commission, including annually preparing and publishing a 13 statement of receipts and expenditures of the Commission for each 14 fiscal year. The Commission's annual statement of receipts and 15 expenditures shall be audited by the State Auditor and Inspector or 16 an independent accounting firm, and the audit report shall be 17 certified to the Governor of this state to be true and correct_{au} 18 under oath, by the chair and vice-chair of the Commission

19 Commissioner of Labor.

SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1000.25, as
last amended by Section 4, Chapter 223, O.S.L. 2014 (59 O.S. Supp.
2016, Section 1000.25), is amended to read as follows:
Section 1000.25 A. The Oklahoma Uniform Building Code
Commission shall establish recommend to the Department of Labor a

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system of fees to be charged for the issuance and renewal of any construction permits issued by any agency, municipality, or other political subdivision of this state.

4 This provision is subject to the following limitations: Β. 5 1. No schedule of fees may be established or amended by the Commission Department except during such times as the Legislature is 6 7 in session; provided, the Commission Department may establish or amend a schedule of fees at a time when the Legislature is not in 8 9 session if the fees or schedule of fees has been specifically 10 authorized by the Legislature pursuant to paragraphs 2 and 3 of this 11 subsection. The Commission must Department shall follow the 12 procedures required by Article I of the Administrative Procedures 13 Act for adoption of rules in establishing or amending any such 14 schedule of fees;

15 The Commission Department shall charge fees for building 2. 16 permits and renewal of such permits issued by any state agency, 17 municipality, or other political subdivision of this state which 18 authorized work governed by codes within the purview of the 19 Commission Department only within the following ranges: 20 For issuance of permit not to exceed \$5.00 21 For renewal of permit not to exceed \$5.00 22 Fees shall be remitted to the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code 23 Commission Revolving Fund created pursuant to Section 1000.28 of 24 this title within thirty (30) days after the end of the preceding

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calendar month. The Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission
 Department of Labor shall report to the Governor, President Pro
 Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House semiannually its
 collections for the six (6) months preceding the report;

5 3. Fees shall be collected by any state agency, municipality or 6 other political subdivision issuing construction permits within this 7 state. The fees shall be deposited in an account created by the 8 collecting entity for that purpose;

9 4. The state agency, municipality or other political 10 subdivision shall remit the monies in the account on a monthly basis 11 directly to the State Treasury for deposit in the Oklahoma Uniform 12 Building Code Commission Revolving Fund created pursuant to Section 13 1000.28 of this title. Along with the deposits required by this 14 paragraph, each state agency, municipality or other political 15 subdivision shall also submit a report stating the total amount of 16 funds collected and the total number of fees imposed during the 17 preceding month. The report shall be made on computerized or manual 18 disposition reports as provided by rule of the Commission rules 19 promulgated pursuant to paragraph 1 of subsection A of Section 20 1000.24 of this title;

5. Any state agency, municipality or other political
subdivision collecting and remitting fees pursuant to this section
may levy a fee up to fifty cents (\$0.50) for every construction
permit or renewal permit issued. These monies shall be deposited

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into an account for the sole use of the state agency, municipality or other political subdivision. The state agency, municipality or other political subdivision shall state the total amount of funds collected and the total number of fees imposed to the State Treasury in the report required by paragraph 4 of this subsection;

6 6. It shall be the responsibility of the state agency,
7 municipality or other political subdivision to account for and
8 ensure the correctness and accuracy of payments made to the State
9 Treasury pursuant to this title;

10 7. Funds collected by a state agency, municipality or other 11 political subdivision and remitted to the State Treasury pursuant to 12 the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission Act shall be deposited 13 in the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission Revolving Fund and 14 shall be used solely for the purposes of the Oklahoma Uniform 15 Building Code Commission Act; provided that of the gross permit fees 16 charged, collected and received, ten percent (10%) shall be paid 17 into the General Revenue Fund of the state; and

18 8. Nothing in this act shall prevent the Oklahoma Uniform
19 Building Code Commission from offering incentives for prompt
20 payment.

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1 Section 1000.28 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a 2 revolving fund for the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission to be designated the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission 3 Revolving Fund. The fund shall be a continuous fund, not subject to 4 5 fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all fees or payments 6 of any type received by the Commission Department of Labor for the 7 purposes outlined in the provisions of the Oklahoma Uniform Building 8 Code Commission Act. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund 9 are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the 10 Commission Department for the purpose of implementing and 11 administering the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission Act. 12 Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the 13 State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the 14 Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for 15 approval and payment. 16 SECTION 7.
