STATE OF OKLAHOMA 1st Session of the 56th Legislature (2017) HOUSE BILL 1226 By: West (Tammy) AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to insurance; requiring automobile and motorcycle insurance rates to include premium reductions for completing a victims impact panel program; providing exception for attending certain court-ordered programs; directing insurance companies to allow certain premium reductions; providing qualification to be based on certificate of completion; providing time period for discount; defining term; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 924.1a of Title 36, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Any schedule of rates or rating plan for automobile or motorcycle liability and physical damage insurance submitted to or filed with the State Insurance Commissioner shall provide for an appropriate reduction in premium charges for those insured persons for a five-year period after successfully completing a victims impact panel program. Provided, however, there shall be no reduction in premiums for a program or course attended pursuant to a

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- 1 court order in connection with a motor vehicle violation or an 2 alcohol- or drug-related offense.
 - B. All insurance companies writing automobile or motorcycle liability and physical damage insurance in this state shall allow an appropriate reduction in premium charges to all eligible persons pursuant to this section.
 - C. Upon successfully completing the victims impact panel program, each participant shall be issued a certificate which shall be the basis of qualification for the discount on insurance.
 - D. Each participant shall successfully complete a victims impact panel program each five (5) years to continue to be eligible for the discount on insurance.
 - E. "Victims impact panel program", as used in this section, means a meeting with at least one live presenter who will share personal stories with participants about how alcohol- and drug-related motor vehicle incidents and the illegal conduct of others have personally impacted the life of the presenter. A certificate of completion shall be issued to the person upon satisfying the attendance of the victims impact panel program. A victims impact panel program shall not be provided by any certified assessment agency or certified assessor.
- SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.

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
