- SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 101 of Title 80, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. The Legislature may review any executive order issued by the President of the United States, federal agency rule or federal congressional action to determine the constitutionality of such action. Upon recommendation from the Legislature, the Attorney General shall review such action by the federal government to determine the constitutionality of the action and whether the state should seek an exemption from the application of the action or seek to have the action declared unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction and prevent, prohibit or enjoin enforcement of the unconstitutional order, rule or action.
- B. Should the Attorney General decline to pursue action based upon the determination of the Legislature, the Legislature may declare the action unconstitutional by a majority vote and shall initiate an action to seek an exemption from the application of the action or seek to have the action declared unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction and prevent, prohibit or enjoin enforcement of the unconstitutional order, rule or action.
- C. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the state, county, political subdivision or any other publicly funded organization shall not implement, adopt or enforce any order, federal agency rule or federal congressional action declared

1 unconstitutional under subsection A or B of this section including, 2 but not limited to: Pandemics or other health emergencies; 3 1. 4 2. The regulation of natural resources, including oil and 5 natural gas; 6 3. The regulation of the agriculture industry; 7 4.
