7	An Act relating to labor; creating the Task Force for the Study of Caregiver Insurance; providing for
8	membership of Task Force; requiring organizational meeting; providing for quorum; providing for
9	cochairs; requiring study of caregiver insurance; defining scope of study; providing for staff
10	assistance; requiring final report; providing for termination of Task Force; providing for
11	noncodification; and declaring an emergency.
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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
16	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
17	A. There is hereby created the Task Force for the Study of
18	Caregiver Insurance.
19	B. The Task Force shall consist of a representative from each
20	of the following organizations or state agencies selected by that
21	organization or agency:
22	1. The Department of Labor;
23	2. The Oklahoma Employment Security Commission;
24	3. The State Department of Health;

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4. The Department of Human Services;

S. One appointee selected by the Speaker of the House of
 Representatives;

6. One appointee selected by the Minority Leader of the House
5 of Representatives;

6 7. One appointee selected by the President Pro Tempore of the7 Senate;

8 8. One appointee selected by the Minority Leader of the Senate;9 and

10 9. One appointee selected by the Governor.

11 C. The Task Force shall conduct an organizational meeting not 12 later than August 31, 2015. A majority of the members present at 13 the organizational meeting or any subsequent meeting shall 14 constitute a quorum for the purpose of any action taken including 15 the preparation and approval of the final report required by 16 subsection G of this section.

D. The Task Force shall be authorized to meet as necessary inorder to perform the duties imposed upon it.

E. The Task Force shall conduct a study regarding compensation for the wage penalties sustained by any individual who is unable to work due to the employee's own sickness or injury, the sickness or injury of a family member, or the birth, adoption or foster care placement of a new child. The study shall include but shall not be limited to:

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Benefits to families of employer-led programs to assist
 employee's balance of workplace demands and family needs;

3 2. Recommendations for structuring a statewide caregiver
4 insurance program based on a temporary disability program; and
5 3. Such other matters related to caregiver insurance as the

6 Task Force deems relevant.

F. Staff assistance for the Task Force shall be provided by the
8 staff of the Oklahoma House of Representatives and the State Senate.

9 G. The Task Force shall produce a final written report of its 10 findings and any recommendations regarding caregiver insurance. The 11 report shall be submitted to the Governor, the Speaker of the 12 Oklahoma House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of 13 the State Senate not later than November 1, 2015.

H. The provisions of this section shall cease to have the force
and effect of law, and the Task Force shall terminate effective
January 1, 2016.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
