AMENDATORY 2 O.S. 2011, Section 16-3, is 14 amended to read as follows: 15 Section 16-3. The State Board of Agriculture shall institute a 16 broad program of education, outreach and action in the protection, 17 reforestation, harvesting, and wise use of forests and their 18 products throughout Oklahoma under the provisions the Board shall 19 adopt. These provisions shall include the need for trees and 20 forests to meet the increasing demands for forest products for human 21 consumption, the necessity of environmental improvement to filter 22 out noise and dirt, clean and replenish the atmosphere, to conserve 23 soil, water and wildlife, and to provide outdoor recreation for 24 healthful living. The Board shall administer silviculture best

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1 management practices in cooperation with forestry land users under 2 the provisions of state and federal water pollution laws that 3 include the process to identify silviculturally related nonpoint 4 sources of pollution as defined by the Oklahoma Environmental 5 Quality Code and, to the extent feasible, establish procedures and 6 methods to control these sources.

7 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 2 O.S. 2011, Section 16-51, is
8 amended to read as follows:

9 Section 16-51. The State Board of Agriculture for its Forestry 10 Division on behalf of the state may acquire land suitable for nurseries, seed orchards, museums or educational facilities, state 11 12 forests, school forests, tower, recreation and other sites by gift, 13 donation, or purchase and may enter into agreements with the federal 14 government or other agency for acquiring by gift or purchase the 15 lands that are, in the judgment of the Board, suitable and desirable 16 for the above purposes.

17 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 2224, is
18 amended to read as follows:

Section 2224. <u>A.</u> The <u>Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation</u>
Commission may transfer to any city, county, or other agency of
government, which is a willing recipient, its interest in real and
personal property owned by the State of Oklahoma or the Department
and operated and maintained under the jurisdiction of the
Commission. Such real estate transfers shall not be subject to

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Section 456.7 or 129.4 or 456.7 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes <u>this title</u> or any provision of state law relative to disposition of real estate. Such real estate transfers shall be subject to the following provisions:

The city, county or other agency recipient shall agree to
 accept the interest transferred by the state, accept responsibility
 for the property, and use the real estate for public recreation or
 <u>educational</u> purposes in accordance with the Land and Water
 Conservation Fund Act of 1965, Public Law 88-578, 78 U.S.C., Section
 897;

11 2. The city, county or other agency recipient shall not dispose 12 of the property unless substitute property is provided that is 13 equivalent in value and usefulness;

The Commission shall transfer the property to the recipient
 by quit claim deed or other instrument as may be appropriate;

16 4. The consideration for the property transfer shall be the
17 agreement of the recipient to continue public recreation use of the
18 property and to manage the property without an operating subsidy
19 from the Department or Commission;

20 5. The real estate transfer shall be subject to all existing
21 easements and reservations of record; and

22 6. The Commission shall provide written notice to the President
23 Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
24 Representatives detailing any such proposed transfer agreement to be

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entered into pursuant to this section no later than thirty (30) days
prior to the first day of the legislative session. The Commission
shall approve such proposed transfer during the legislative session
to be effective at the beginning of the next fiscal year, contingent
pon the approval of the proposed transfer by the Legislature.
B. The Commission shall transfer the property commonly known as
the Forest Heritage Center, located in Beavers Bend State Park,
AcCurtain County, Oklahoma, to the Oklahoma Department of
Agriculture, Food, and Forestry.
SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
