22	C. The Task Force shall study current regulation to determine
23	if the Oklahoma Corporation Commission is properly structured to

D. The Task Force shall hold an organizational meeting not later than December 1, 2017. The Task Force shall select from its membership a chair and vice chair.

8 E. The Task Force may conduct business without a quorum of its 9 membership being present, but a quorum shall be required to be 10 present for purposes of adoption of the final report of the Task 11 Force.

F. The Task Force may request the assistance of any state agency, board, commission, department or other entity of state government to acquire relevant information for purposes of the study. Staff assistance for the Task Force shall be provided by the Oklahoma House of Representatives, the Oklahoma State Senate and the Oklahoma Corporation Commission.

G. The Task Force shall develop a final report and transmit the report not later than December 1, 2018, to the Governor, the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate.

H. Each member of the Task Force shall serve withoutcompensation.

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1	I. The Task Force shall terminate effective the day following
2	the transmission of the report required by subsection G of this
