- D. The Review Committee shall hold an organizational meeting not later than September 1, 2017. In furtherance of performing the assessment of the issues listed in subsection C of this section, the Review Committee may seek input from stakeholders, including the various businesses regulated by the Corporation Commission, such as representatives from the oil and gas, telecommunications, transportation, electric utilities, natural gas pipeline, natural gas local distribution companies and others involved in processes at the Corporation Commission including consumer groups, individual citizens, industrial associations, corporation commission staff and all others that would like to participate.
- E. The Review Committee may conduct business without a quorum of its membership being present, but a quorum shall be required to be present for purposes of adoption of the final report of the Review Committee.

- F. The Review Committee may request the assistance of any state agency, board, commission, department or other entity of state government to acquire relevant information for purposes of the study.
- G. The Review Committee shall develop a final report with specific recommendations and transmit the report not later than September 1, 2018, to the Governor, the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate.
- H. Each member of the Review Committee shall serve without compensation.
- I. The Review Committee shall terminate effective the day following the transmission of the report required by subsection G of this section.
- SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval."

 - C. The Task Force shall study current regulation to determine if the Oklahoma Corporation Commission is properly structured to efficiently operate in the twenty-first century. Such study shall

Staff assistance for the Task Force shall be provided by the Oklahoma House of Representatives, the Oklahoma State Senate and the Oklahoma Corporation Commission.
 - G. The Task Force shall develop a final report and transmit the report not later than December 1, 2018, to the Governor, the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate.
- H. Each member of the Task Force shall serve without compensation.
