AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1716, is 14 amended to read as follows: 15 Section 1716. A. Any person in this state who shall steal any 16 horse, jackass, jennet, mule, cow, hog, or implement of husbandry, 17 as defined in Section 1-125 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes 18 shall be guilty of a felony and, upon conviction shall be punished, 19 be guilty of a felony punishable by confinement in the State 20 Penitentiary custody of the Department of Corrections for a term of 21 not less than three (3) years, nor more than $\frac{\text{ten}}{\text{(10)}}$ fifteen (15) 22 years; and any, and by a fine in an amount that is equal to three 23 times the value of the animals or implement of husbandry that was 24 stolen.

B. Any person in this state who shall steal any dog, sheep, or goat, shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a felony and upon conviction therefor shall be punished punishable by confinement in the State Penitentiary custody of the Department of Corrections for a term of not less than six (6) months, nor more than three (3) years, or and by a fine in an amount that is equal to three times the value of the animals and machinery or implement of husbandry that were was stolen but not more than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment.

C. Two-thirds (2/3) of the fine collected in subsection A or B of this section shall be paid to the owner of the animal or implement of husbandry and one-third (1/3) of the fine collected shall be paid to the State Department of Agriculture Revolving Fund and shall be utilized solely for the benefit of the agriculture law enforcement agents commissioned pursuant to the provisions of Section 6-310 of Title 2 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

The word "horse" as used in this section includes all D. animals of the equine species and the word "cow" includes all animals of the bovine species.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.
