Supp. 2014, Sections 901.58 and 901.61), which relate to the Rural Fire Protection 11 Program Fund Act; stating effectiveness; updating references; modifying requirements of coordinators 12 examining certain financial assistance applications; providing deadline by which coordinator shall certify 1.3 certain participants; updating language; deleting requirement regarding how financial assistance is 14 expended; requiring certain electronic transfer of funds; updating references; specifying grants to be 15 administered; updating language; providing city population limit for eligible participants; defining 16 term; updating language and references; requiring electronic transfer of certain funds; updating 17 references; and providing an effective date. 18 19 20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 21 SECTION 1. 19 O.S. 2011, Section 901.56, is AMENDATORY 22 amended to read as follows: 23 Section 901.56 A. The provisions of this section shall become

effective when funds are made available for such purpose to the

- Rural Fire Protection Program Fund for distribution of financial
 assistance to eligible participants as defined by this section.

 Upon the availability of such funds, the State The Oklahoma

 Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry shall notify the
 coordinator of such available funds coordinators when financial
 assistance is available.
 - B. For the purposes of this section "coordinator" means shall mean the rural fire coordinator in each rural fire protection coordination district as defined in Section 901.61 of this title.
 - C. Upon notification of the State Department of Agriculture that financial assistance is available pursuant to subsection A of this section on or before the last day of June of each year that funds are available for such purpose, the district coordinators shall consider and determine the relative needs of participants for monies in the Rural Fire Protection Program Fund financial assistance. Participants Coordinators shall examine each participant applying for financial assistance and certify that eligible participants include only incorporated cities under ten thousand (10,000) population according to the latest Federal Decennial Census, towns, and legally formed rural fire departments formed legally and maintained under applicable state law. Based upon the information available to him On or before the last day of June during a year in which financial assistance is available, the coordinator shall certify to the Commissioner of Agriculture the

names of the incorporated cities, towns, and legally formed rural fire departments participants which he determines are in need of and eligible for financial assistance from the Rural Fire Protection

Program, and the amount of financial assistance required by each in accordance with the provisions of this section. In making this determination and certification, the coordinator shall consider the intent and purpose of the Rural Fire Protection Program Fund Act.

No incorporated city, town or legally formed rural fire department shall receive monies distributed from the Rural Fire Protection

Program Fund merely for the purpose of accumulation when such monies are not required to accomplish the purposes of this section.

- D. In making such determination of needs, the coordinator No participant shall first determine that each fire department to be certified has been duly formed under the appropriate state statutes receive financial assistance merely for the purpose of accumulation.
- E. On or before the last day of August of each year <u>financial</u> assistance is available, the State Department of Agriculture shall distribute the monies in the Rural Fire Protection Program Fund <u>financial assistance</u> in the manner provided by law this section.
- F. Any amount so financial assistance distributed from the Rural Fire Protection Program Fund to any eligible participant shall be expended only for the maintenance of its fire department, the:
- 1. The purchase, construction, maintenance, repair and operation of $\frac{1}{1}$ fire stations.

- 2. The purchase, maintenance, and repair of fire apparatus and equipment, the;
- 3. The purchase, rental, installation, or maintenance of fire hydrants, the;
- 4. The payment of insurance premiums upon fire stations, fire apparatus, and equipment, and
- 5. The payment of insurance premiums for injuries or death of fire fighters, as otherwise provided by law.

Provided, however, that no monies financial assistance shall be expended from the fund for any purpose relating to the water supply systems of any participant, nor for the improvement or construction of such systems nor for any other appurtenances relating to the distribution or use of such water supply system. Monies so

Financial assistance distributed from the Rural Fire Protection

Program Fund to any eligible participant may also be expended, in an amount not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the allocated funds or the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) in the aggregate during any period of one (1) year, whichever is larger, for the expense of any fire fighters attending a certified fire school.

G. No amount so distributed from the Rural Fire Protection

Program Fund to any eligible participant financial assistance shall be expended or obligated for the purchase of land or the construction of buildings for fire stations unless all previous debts or obligations previously incurred for such purposes and to be

paid from monies distributed from the Rural Fire Protection Program Fund by such eligible participant have been fully paid and satisfied. No monies from the fund financial assistance shall be expended or obligated for the construction of buildings for fire stations unless the participant proposing to expend or obligate monies distributed from the Rural Fire Protection Program Fund financial assistance for that purpose holds fee simple title, not encumbered by any lien, or holds a lease for a period of not less than ten (10) years, with provisions for renewal of the lease annually, to the land on which it proposes to construct any such building. Provided, however, that this provision shall not prohibit construction or location of a fire station on land donated in whole or part to the participant for the purpose, and use of Rural Fire Protection Program Fund monies financial assistance for such construction or location, where the donor has reserved right or of reversion of such land under stated conditions, if such use be appropriate and reasonable.

H. Amounts so Financial assistance distributed from the Rural Fire Protection Program Fund to any eligible participant shall be expended under the direction of the chief of the fire department upon duly executed vouchers approved as required by law. In no event Financial assistance shall any such monies to be expended for any purpose which does not relate to the permitted only be

- distributed for the purposes specifically stated in permitted by this section.
- I. Financial assistance shall be distributed from the

 Department to participants by electronic transfer of funds as required by state law.
- 6 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 19 O.S. 2011, Section 901.57, is 7 amended to read as follows:

Section 901.57 A. When funds are made available for such purpose, the State Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry shall administer matching grants from any monies which may be available for the purpose of the improvement of improving fire protection in rural areas of the State of Oklahoma, to the end that mitigating the hazard of loss by fire, and reducing fire insurance rates, may be reduced and the promoting public safety thereby promoted. Any such monies shall be distributed in the manner provided by law.

B. The State Department of Agriculture is authorized to shall allocate such monies funds obtained pursuant to subsection A of this section to eligible entities participants on a matching basis and such matching requirements may be fulfilled by either in cash or inkind contributions from the participant. Eligible participants include only incorporated cities under ten thousand (10,000) population according to the latest Federal Decennial Census, towns, and rural fire departments formed legally and maintained under

- applicable state law. In addition, the State Department of

 Agriculture is authorized to establish preferential matching

 requirements for eligible entities participants which have Insurance

 Service Organization rates of ten (10) or which have other critical

 circumstances and needs which are determined by the State Department

 of Agriculture to justify preferential matching requirements as

 determined by the Department.
 - C. For the purposes of this section "coordinator" shall mean the rural fire coordinator in each rural fire protection coordination district as defined in Section 901.61 of this title.
 - <u>D.</u> 1. The State Department of Agriculture shall in writing notify the rural fire protection coordination districts coordinator of any available grant monies by August 1st 1 of each year.
 - 2. Each rural fire protection coordination district coordinator desiring to obtain such grant monies matching grants for eligible participants and the improvement of fire protection within such a rural fire protection coordination district shall submit such a request to the Department, in such the form and in such manner as required by the Department, by September 1, of each year.
 - 3. The Forestry <u>Services</u> Division <u>of the Department</u> shall submit the final list of <u>grantees</u> <u>eligible participants</u> and <u>their</u> approved amounts <u>prior</u> <u>of matching grants</u> to <u>the October meeting of</u> the <u>State</u> Board of Agriculture for consideration <u>prior</u> to October 1 of each year.

- 4. By October 1 of each year, the Department shall make a determination on approve the allocation of such monies matching grants to the rural fire protection coordination districts participants.
- 5. Upon approval by the State Board of Agriculture, the Forestry Services Division shall distribute the prescribed forms required by law awarding matching grants to all grantees to certify participants for the purpose of certifying the grant. The prescribed form must shall be signed by the grantee participant and returned to the Forestry Services Division before the matching grant becomes official is awarded.
- 6. Expenditures made <u>by the participant</u> prior to the date of the <u>matching</u> grant award shall not be considered <u>eligible</u> for reimbursement.
- 7. Fire departments Participants shall submit copies of paid invoices, canceled checks, or other proof of purchase, attached to the prescribed form when requesting reimbursement from the Department. No more than three (3) partial payment requests are from a participant shall be permitted.
- 8. Fire departments Participants shall keep complete and accurate records of grant expenditures and make this information available to the Forestry Services Division or the coordinators assigned coordinator on request.

- 9. Approved claims shall be submitted by the Forestry Division for payment. Checks shall be sent promptly to the fire department's contact person when received Upon receipt and approval of the prescribed form requesting reimbursement and supporting documentation from participants, the Forestry Services Division shall electronically transfer matching grant funds to participants.
- 10. The coordinators Each coordinator shall elosely track the progress of all grantees in the assigned district participants to assure their the completion by June 30. As of April 1, each coordinator shall make an assessment shall be made to determine the amount of matching grant funds which remain unobligated in each rural fire protection coordination district, and therefore available to make additional matching grants within that district. The coordinators Each coordinator shall use the original prioritized list of matching grant applications to make additional matching grants, and submit a list of additional grantees participants and amounts to the Forestry Services Division for processing through the April earliest available meeting of the State Board of Agriculture for approval. These Additional matching grants are still subject to the June 30 cutoff for obligating grant funds. The same procedures will shall be used as for the first round of matching grants.
- 11. Follow-up compliance audits shall be performed by the coordinators each coordinator and the Forestry Services Division of

the State Department of Agriculture. Fire departments are required to cooperate Participants shall fully cooperate during the audit.

D. In determining the amount of grant monies to be awarded to a E. Each rural fire protection coordination district pursuant to the provisions of this section, such district shall be eligible to receive an a funding amount resulting from computing the number of fire departments with service area populations of less than ten thousand (10,000) persons in a within the rural fire protection coordination district divided by the total number of fire departments with service area populations of less than ten thousand (10,000) persons in this state within the State of Oklahoma multiplied by the total amount of the matching grant monies available to rural fire protection coordination districts in the state.

E. F. In addition to any other criteria established by the State Department of Agriculture for receipt distribution of matching grant monies for funds to rural fire protection coordination districts, the State Department of Agriculture, pursuant to the Administrative Procedures Act, Article I, Sections 250.3 through 308.2 and Article II, Sections 309 through 323 of Title 75 of the Oklahoma Statutes, shall establish criteria to rate and prioritize applications for funding such requests of the matching grants within rural fire protection coordination districts. Such criteria shall include, but not be limited to, consideration for: number of

1 residents, businesses and square miles to be protected; fire runs per calendar year; annual sales and property tax collection; use of volunteers; written fire plan or standard operating procedures plan; 3 fundraising; training; compliance with legal requirements; and 5 workers' compensation and vehicle liability insurance coverage. 6 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 19 O.S. 2011, Section 901.58, as 7 amended by Section 72, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (19 O.S. Supp. 2014, 8 Section 901.58), is amended to read as follows: 9 Section 901.58 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a 10 revolving fund for the State Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, 11 Food, and Forestry, to be designated the "Rural Fire Defense 12 Equipment Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not 13 subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies 14 received by the State Department of Agriculture from any monies 15 received from appropriations, deposits made pursuant to the 16 provisions of this act, proceeds resulting from the sale of 17 equipment purchased out of monies in the fund, and such other monies 18 specifically designated by law. All monies accruing to the credit 19 of said fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and 20 expended by the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and 21 Forestry for the purpose of purchasing new firefighting equipment 22 for purchase by rural fire departments and such other purposes 23 specifically designated by law.  - SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 19 O.S. 2011, Section 901.61, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 29, O.S.L. 2013 (19 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 901.61), is amended to read as follows:
 - Section 901.61 A. The State Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry is hereby directed to administer a rural fire protection program and is hereby authorized to acquire federal excess property for the support and operation of rural fire departments and rural fire protection coordination districts.
 - B. For the purpose of coordination of improved rural fire protection, rural fire protection coordination districts are hereby created to consist of the following counties:
- District 1, composed of Washington, Nowata, Craig, Ottawa,
 Mayes, Delaware and Rogers Counties.
- District 2, composed of Wagoner, Cherokee, Adair, Sequoyah,

 Muskogee, Okmulgee and McIntosh Counties.
- District 3, composed of Pittsburg, Haskell, LeFlore, Pushmataha,
 Latimer, McCurtain and Choctaw Counties.
