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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 698.3, is
17	amended to read as follows:
18	Section 698.3 A. It is the intent of the Oklahoma Legislature
19	that Contingent on the availability of funding, beginning with the
20	2001-2002 2017-2018 school year, the Oklahoma State Regents for
21	Higher Education shall establish a teacher shortage employment
22	incentive program for students enrolled in a major course of study
23	in mathematics or science at the undergraduate level or graduate
24	level who declare an intention to serve and who subsequently serve

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1 this state by teaching in a secondary level public school of this 2 state for a minimum of five (5) seven (7) years in the subject areas 3 of mathematics or science. Students meeting the criteria provided 4 in this section shall be given the opportunity to enter into 5 participation in the program.

6 The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education are в. 7 authorized to make employment incentive payments pursuant to the provisions of this section to persons who hold a standard teaching 8 9 certificate or an alternative placement teaching certificate and who 10 actually render a minimum of five (5) seven (7) years of service as 11 teachers in the public schools of this state if not less than 12 seventy-five percent (75%) of the teaching assignment meets the 13 criteria specified in subsection A of this section. The total 14 amount of the employment incentive payments for any qualified person 15 shall not exceed an amount equal to three times the average annual 16 cost of undergraduate resident tuition and fees for full-time 17 enrollment at institutions which offer teacher education programs 18 within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, as defined by 19 the State Regents. Any amount not necessary to repay the balance of 20 a student's loan(s) shall be paid directly to any person otherwise 21 eligible for employment incentive payments pursuant to this section. 22 The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall С.

require the execution of appropriate contracts with eligible
persons. Persons failing to comply with the requirements of this

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1	section shall not be eligible for the employment incentive payments
2	provided for in this section. The Chancellor of the Oklahoma State
3	Regents for Higher Education, with approval of the State Regents,
4	may contract with any other appropriate organization or unit of
5	government for the administration of the provisions of this section.
6	D. If insufficient funds are available for employment incentive
7	payments to qualified persons during any fiscal year, the Chancellor
8	may make reductions in the payments made to those qualifying.
9	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2017.
10	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
11	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
12	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
13	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
