8	An Act relating to a Task Force on Small Community
9	Development; providing for membership; requiring selection of chair and vice-chair; providing for

12	date; and declaring an emergency.
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 8305 of Title 74, unless there
18	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
19	A. There is hereby created the "Task Force on Small Community
20	Development".
21	B. The Task Force shall consist of eleven (11) members as
22	follows:
23	1. One person appointed by the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of
24	Representatives;

- 2. One person appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate;
 - 3. One person appointed by a statewide organization, organized as a nonprofit entity, providing membership services to cities and towns located within the state who shall have experience with issues related to rural economic developmental;
 - 4. One person appointed by the Executive Director of the Oklahoma Department of Commerce;
 - 5. One person appointed by the Oklahoma Center for the Advancement of Science and Technology;
- 11 6. One person appointed by the Oklahoma Association of Regional Councils;
 - 7. One person appointed by the Oklahoma Economic Development Council;
 - 8. One person appointed by the University of Oklahoma who shall be an economist; and
 - 9. One person appointed by Oklahoma State University who shall be an economist having expertise with rural economic development issues.
 - C. The Task Force shall study methods to prevent population declines in communities of the state having fewer than thirty thousand (30,000) residents, according to the latest Federal Decennial Census or most recent population estimate, and to improve

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the economic climate in the state in order to promote economic development in those communities.

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- D. The Task Force shall hold an organizational meeting not later than July 30, 2017. The Task Force shall select from its membership a chair and vice-chair.
- E. The Task Force may conduct business without a quorum of its membership being present, but a quorum shall be required to be present for purposes of adoption of the final report of the Task Force.
- F. The Task Force shall not be subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act but shall cause notice of its meeting to be posted through the website of both the Oklahoma House of Representatives and the Oklahoma State Senate at least ten (10) days prior to its meetings.
- G. The Task Force may request the assistance of any state agency, board, commission, department or other entity of state government to acquire relevant information for purposes of the study. Staff assistance for the Task Force shall be provided by the Oklahoma House of Representatives and the Oklahoma State Senate.
- H. The Task Force shall develop a final report and transmit the report not later than December 15, 2018, to the Governor, the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate.
- SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2017.

1	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
2	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
3	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
4	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
