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11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
12	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 4, Chapter 229, O.S.L.
13	2013 (59 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 6001), is amended to read as
14	follows:
15	Section 6001. A. 1. There is hereby created <u>re-created</u> the
16	State Board of Behavioral Health Licensure to continue until July 1,
17	2019 <u>2020</u> , in accordance with the provisions of the Oklahoma Sunset
18	Law.
19	2. Members of the Board shall serve at the pleasure of and may
20	be removed from office by the appointing authority. Members shall
21	continue to serve until their successors are appointed. Any vacancy
22	shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments.
23	Four members shall constitute a quorum.
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1 3. The Board shall meet at least twice a year, but no more than 2 four (4) times a year and shall elect a chair and a vice-chair from 3 among its members. The Board shall only meet as required for: 4 election of officers, a. 5 b. establishment of meeting dates and times, rule development, 6 с. 7 review and recommendation, and d. adoption of nonbinding resolutions to the Board 8 e. 9 concerning matters brought before the Board. 10 4. Special meetings may be called by the chair or by 11 concurrence of any three members. 12 в. 1. All members of the Board shall be knowledgeable of 13 counseling issues. The Board shall be appointed by the Governor 14 with the advice and consent of the Senate: 15 four members who are licensed professional counselors, a. 16 three members who are licensed family and marital b. 17 therapists, 18 two members who are licensed behavioral practitioners, с. 19 and 20 d. two members representing the public and possessing 21 knowledge of counseling issues. 22 Members of the Board shall serve for a period of three (3) 2. 23 years and may be removed at any time by the appointing authority. 24 Vacancies on the Board shall be filled by the appointing authority.

A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the
 transaction of business.

3 3. All appointees who are licensed professional counselors 4 shall be selected from a list of qualified candidates submitted by 5 the Executive Committee of the Oklahoma Counseling Association acting in conjunction with the executive committees of all state 6 7 professional counseling associations which represent a specialty recognized pursuant to the Licensed Professional Counselors Act. 8 9 Appointees who are licensed marital and family therapists shall be 10 selected from a list of qualified candidates submitted by the 11 Oklahoma Association for Marriage and Family Therapy and who 12 represent a specialty recognized by the Marital and Family Therapist 13 Licensure Act. Appointees who are licensed behavioral therapists 14 shall be selected from a list of qualified candidates submitted by 15 the National Association for Masters in Psychology and who represent 16 a specialty recognized by the Licensed Behavioral Practitioner Act.

17 4. The members of the Board from each professional area of 18 behavioral health counseling shall comprise separate committees and 19 shall consult on professional issues within their respective areas 20 of behavioral health counseling. Each committee shall recommend to 21 the Board approval or disapproval of all licenses to be issued 22 within its specialty. Each committee shall be authorized to 23 recommend approval or disapproval of the examination requirements 24 for all applicants for licensure in the respective area of

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behavioral health counseling, provide grading standards for examinations, and provide for other matters relating to licensure in that area of behavioral health counseling. Each committee may create advisory committees to consult on professional duties and responsibilities pursuant to the provisions of this act.

5. Any and all recommendations, approvals, or disapprovals made
by a committee pursuant to the provisions of this section shall not
become effective without the approval of a majority of members of
the Board.

The jurisdictional areas of the Board shall include
 professional counseling licensing and practice issues, marital and
 family therapist licensing and practice issues, behavioral
 practitioner licensing and practice issues and such other areas as
 authorized by the Licensed Professional Counselors Act.

15 C. The Board shall not recommend rules for promulgation unless 16 all applicable requirements of the Administrative Procedures Act 17 have been followed, including but not limited to notice, rule impact 18 statements and rule-making hearings.

D. Members of the Board shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for expenses incurred in the performance of their duties, as provided in the State Travel Reimbursement Act. The Board is authorized to utilize the conference rooms of and obtain administrative assistance from the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as required.

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E. The Board is authorized and empowered to:

Establish and maintain a system of licensure and
 certification pursuant to the provisions of the Licensed
 Professional Counselors Act;

2. Adopt and enforce standards governing the professional
conduct of persons licensed pursuant to the provisions of the
Licensed Professional Counselors Act;

3. Lease office space for the purpose of operating and
maintaining a state office, and pay rent thereon; provided, however,
such state office shall not be located in or directly adjacent to
the office of any person licensed pursuant to the provisions of the
Licensed Professional Counselors Act;

4. Purchase office furniture, equipment, and supplies;
 5. Employ such office personnel as may be necessary, and fix
 and pay their salaries or wages;

16 6. Contract with state agencies for the purposes of
17 investigating written complaints regarding the conduct of persons
18 licensed pursuant to the provisions of the Licensed Professional
19 Counselors Act and obtaining administrative assistance as deemed
20 necessary by the Executive Director; and

21 7. Make such other expenditures as may be necessary in the 22 performance of its duties.

F. The Board shall employ an Executive Director. The ExecutiveDirector shall be authorized to:

1	1. Employ and maintain an office staff;
2	2. Enter into contracts on behalf of the Board; and
3	3. Perform other duties on behalf of the Board as needed or
4	directed.
5	G. All employees and positions shall be placed in unclassified
6	status, exempt from the provisions of the Oklahoma Personnel Act.
