9	term care administrators; prohibiting Oklahoma State Board of Examiners for Long-Term Care Administrators
10	from including certain requirement relating to nursing facility administrators; and providing an effective date.

14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 330.53, as
16	amended by Section 1, Chapter 241, O.S.L. 2016 (63 O.S. Supp. 2016,
17	Section 330.53), is amended to read as follows:
18	Section 330.53 A. The Oklahoma State Board of Examiners for
19	Long-Term Care Administrators shall have authority to issue licenses
20	or certifications to qualified persons as long-term care
21	administrators, and shall establish qualification criteria for each
22	type of long-term care administrator.
23	B. No license or certification shall be issued to a person as a
24	long-term care administrator unless:

The person shall have submitted evidence satisfactory to the
Board that the person is:

a. not less than twenty-one (21) years of age, and

4

b. of reputable and responsible character; and

2. The person shall have submitted evidence satisfactory to the Board of the person's ability to supervise the defined facility type in which he or she is licensed or certified to serve as a long-term care administrator.

9 C. All persons currently licensed or certified or lawfully serving as an administrator in their defined facility type shall be 10 11 permitted to continue to serve in their current capacity under their 12 current terms of authorization. The Board may promulgate rules pursuant to Section 330.57 of this title to address future 13 certification and licensure requirements for all long-term care 14 15 administrator types without effect on the licensure or certification status of those currently certified or licensed. The Board shall 16 not include a requirement for a four-year degree in any future 17 licensing or certification requirements for assisted living, 18 residential care or adult day care administrators. The Board shall 19 20 not include a requirement for completion of a four-year degree for 21 licensing or certification requirements for nursing facility 22 administrators if such individuals possess ten (10) years of 23 experience in administrative management, with five (5) years of 24 experience as a certified assistant administrator in a long-term

care facility. Until such rules are promulgated, current licensure 1 and certification processes and standards shall remain in place. 2 The Oklahoma State Board of Examiners for Long-Term Care D. 3 Administrators shall, on or before July 1, 2017, promulgate rules 4 permitting eligible applicants to sit for the state standards 5 examination at a testing facility using procedures approved by the 6 National Association of Long-Term Care Administrator Board, 7 including but not limited to the use of electronic or online methods 8 9 for examination. Ε. The Oklahoma State Board of Examiners for Long-Term Care 10 Administrators shall promulgate rules to implement the provisions of 11 12 this section. SECTION 2.
