4 C. To retain eligibility while pursuing the program of higher5 learning in which enrolled, the student shall:

6 1. Achieve a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 on a 7 4.0 scale or its equivalent for courses taken through the student's sophomore year and achieve a minimum grade point average of 2.5 on a 8 9 4.0 scale or its equivalent for courses taken during the student's 10 junior year and thereafter. On a form provided by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 11 Education, every public school district shall designate at least one 12 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program contact person, who shall be 13 a counselor or teacher, at each public school site in this state in 14 which eighth-, ninth- or tenth-grade classes are taught. When 15 requested by the State Regents, the State Board of Education shall 16 assist the State Regents to ensure the designation of contact 17 persons. Private schools shall also designate at least one school 18 official as a contact person. For students who are educated by 19 other means, a parent or guardian or other person approved by the 20 State Regents shall be designated the contact person.

C. 1. Students who qualify on the basis of financial need according to subsection D or E of this section or who meet the eligibility qualification set forth in subparagraph a <u>or b</u> of paragraph 1 of subsection B of Section 2603 of this title prior to

A student shall be eligible to participate in the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program and to qualify for an award which includes payment of an amount equivalent to resident tuition or other tuition pursuant to Section 2604 of this title for the first semester or other academic unit of postsecondary enrollment if the student meets all of the following criteria <u>is</u>:

a. is a child of any person killed after January 1, 2000,
in the line of duty in any branch of the United States

1Armed Forces or who died after January 1, 2000, as a2result of an injury sustained while in the line of3duty in any branch of the United States Armed Forces4and the person who was killed or died filed an5individual or joint Oklahoma income tax return for the6tax year prior to the year during which the person was7killed or died, or

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 b.
 in the permanent custody of the Department of Human

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 Services at the time the student enrolls in the

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 program or in the permanent custody of the Department

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 of Human Services after completing the tenth grade or

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 in the permanent custody of the Department of Human

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 Services after reaching the age of sixteen (16).

14 <u>2. A student who is eligible to participate in the program</u> 15 <u>pursuant to paragraph 1 of this subsection shall also be required to</u> 16 meet all of the following criteria:

- 17a.is a resident of this state or is enrolled in a school18district located in this state that serves students19who reside in both this state and an adjacent state20pursuant to a contract as authorized in Section 5-21117.1 of this title,
- enrolls in an institution within The Oklahoma State
   System of Higher Education prior to reaching the age
   of twenty-one (21),

1 has satisfied admission standards as determined by the <del>d.</del> c. 2 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education for first-3 time-entering students for the appropriate type of institution, or, if attending a private institution, 4 5 has satisfied admission standards as determined by the private institution. No student participating in the 6 7 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program shall be admitted into an institution of higher education by 8 9 special admission standards,

10 <del>e.</del> d. has secured admission to, and enrolled in, an 11 institution which is a member of The Oklahoma State 12 System of Higher Education, a postsecondary 13 vocational-technical program offered pursuant to a 14 duly approved cooperative agreement between a 15 technology center school and an institution of The 16 Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, or a 17 private institution of higher learning located within 18 this state and accredited pursuant to Section 4103 of 19 this title, and

executes an agreement pursuant to subsection C of <del>f.</del>e. Section 2605 of this title.

22 2.3. A student who is eligible to participate in the program 23 pursuant to this subsection shall not be required to meet the 24 eligibility requirements set forth in subsection A of this section.

C. To retain eligibility while pursuing the program of higher
 learning in which enrolled, the student shall:

3 1. Achieve a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 on a 4 4.0 scale or its equivalent for courses taken through the student's 5 sophomore year and achieve a minimum grade point average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale or its equivalent for courses taken during the student's 6 7 junior year and thereafter. The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to any student who has received an Oklahoma Higher 8 9 Learning Access Program benefit award prior to the 2012-2013 school 10 year;

11 2. Maintain good academic standing and satisfactory academic 12 progress according to standards of the Oklahoma State Regents for 13 Higher Education;

Maintain satisfactory academic progress as required for
eligibility for federal Title IV student financial aid programs.
The provisions of this paragraph shall become effective for the
2012-2013 school year;

Comply with the standards related to maintenance of
 eligibility as promulgated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
 Education; and

21 5. Refrain from conduct that leads to expulsion or suspension
22 of more than one semester from an institution of higher education.
23 A student who violates the provisions of this paragraph shall

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permanently lose eligibility for program benefits. The provisions
 of this paragraph shall become effective January 1, 2008.

D. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and the
State Board of Career and Technology Education shall promulgate
rules relating to maintenance of eligibility under the Oklahoma
Higher Learning Access Act by a student.

E. It is the intent of the Legislature that students in the
ninth grade for the 1992-93 school year who are determined to be
eligible Oklahoma Higher Learning Access students pursuant to the
Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Act shall be the first students
eligible for benefits from the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust
Fund.

F. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education are authorized to study, develop and propose criteria for determining award eligibility based upon the completion of seven (7) semesters of high school coursework by a student.

SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 2605, as amended by Section 26, Chapter 11, O.S.L. 2012 (70 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 2605), is amended to read as follows:

20 Section 2605. A. Each school year, every fifth- through ninth-21 grade student in the public and private schools of this state and 22 students who are educated by other means and are in the equivalent 23 of the fifth through ninth grade shall be apprised, together with 24 the parent, custodial parent, or guardian of the student, of the

opportunity for access to higher learning under the Oklahoma Higher
 Learning Access Program. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
 Education and the State Board of Education shall develop, promote,
 and coordinate a public awareness program to be utilized in making
 students and parents aware of the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access
 Program.

7 On a form provided by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher в. Education, every public school district shall designate at least one 8 9 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program contact person, who shall be 10 a counselor or teacher, at each public school site in this state in 11 which eighth-, ninth- or tenth-grade classes are taught. When 12 requested by the State Regents, the State Board of Education shall 13 assist the State Regents to ensure the designation of contact 14 persons. Private schools shall also designate at least one school 15 official as a contact person. For students who are educated by 16 other means, a parent or guardian or other person approved by the 17 State Regents shall be designated the contact person.

C. 1. Students who qualify on the basis of financial need according to subsection D or E of this section or who meet the eligibility qualification set forth in subparagraph a <u>or b</u> of paragraph 1 of subsection B of Section 2603 of this title prior to entering the tenth grade or prior to reaching the age of fifteen (15) and the standards and provisions promulgated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall be given the opportunity

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1 throughout the eighth-, ninth-, and tenth-grade years, for students 2 enrolled in a public or private school, or between the ages of 3 thirteen (13) and fifteen (15), for students who are educated by 4 other means, to enter into participation in the program by agreeing 5 to, throughout the remainder of their school years or educational 6 program:

- a. attend school or an educational program regularly and
  do homework regularly,
- 9 b. refrain from substance abuse,
- 10 c. refrain from commission of crimes or delinquent acts,
- d. have school work and school records reviewed by
   mentors designated pursuant to the program,
- e. provide information requested by the Oklahoma State
  Regents for Higher Education or the State Board of
  Education, and
- 16 f. participate in program activities.

17 2. Students who meet the eligibility qualification set forth in 18 subparagraph a <u>or b</u> of paragraph 1 of subsection B of Section 2603 19 of this title after completing the tenth grade or after reaching the 20 age of sixteen (16) shall be given the opportunity prior to reaching 21 the age of twenty-one (21) to enter into participation in the 22 program and shall execute an agreement with provisions as determined 23 by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education.

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1 3. The contact person shall maintain the agreements, which 2 shall be executed on forms provided by the Oklahoma State Regents 3 for Higher Education and managed according to regulations 4 promulgated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, and 5 the contact person shall monitor compliance of the student with the terms of the agreement. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 6 7 Education are authorized to process student agreements and verify compliance with the agreements. Students failing to comply with the 8 9 terms of the agreement shall not be eligible for the awards provided 10 in Section 2604 of this title.

D. Except as otherwise provided for in subsection E of this section and except for students who qualify pursuant to subsection B of Section 2603 of this title, a student shall not be found to be in financial need for purposes of the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program if:

16 1. At the time the student applies for participation in the 17 Program during the eighth, ninth or tenth grade for students 18 enrolled in a public or private school, or between the ages of 19 thirteen (13) and fifteen (15), for students who are educated by 20 other means, the income from taxable and nontaxable sources of the 21 student's parent(s) exceeds Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per 22 year; and

23 2. At the time the student begins postsecondary education and
 24 prior to receiving any Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program

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1 benefit award, the federal adjusted gross income of the student's 2 parent(s) exceeds One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) per 3 year.

The determination of financial qualification as set forth in this paragraph shall be based on the income of the student, not the income of the parent(s), if a student:

- a. is determined to be independent of the student's
  parents for federal financial aid purposes, or
- 9 b. was in the permanent custody of the Department of
   10 Human Services at the time the student enrolled in the
   11 program, or
- was in the court-ordered custody of a federally
  recognized Indian tribe, as defined by the federal
  Indian Child Welfare Act, at the time the student
  enrolled in the program.

16 The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to any student 17 who has received an Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit 18 award prior to the 2012-2013 school year.

E. 1. A student who was adopted between birth and twelve (12) years of age while in the permanent custody of the Department of Human Services, in the court-ordered custody of a licensed private nonprofit child-placing agency, or federally recognized Indian tribe, as defined by the federal Indian Child Welfare Act, shall not be found to be in financial need for purposes of the Oklahoma Higher

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1 Learning Access Program if at the time the student begins postsecondary education and prior to receiving any Oklahoma Higher 2 Learning Access Program benefit award, the federal adjusted gross 3 4 income of the student's parent(s) exceeds One Hundred Fifty Thousand 5 Dollars (\$150,000.00) per year. The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to any student who has received an Oklahoma Higher 6 7 Learning Access Program benefit award prior to the 2012-2013 school 8 year.

9 2. A student who was adopted between thirteen (13) and 10 seventeen (17) years of age while in the permanent custody of the 11 Department of Human Services, in the court-ordered custody of a 12 licensed private nonprofit child-placing agency, or federally 13 recognized Indian tribe, as defined by the federal Indian Child 14 Welfare Act, shall not be found to be in financial need for purposes 15 of the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program if at the time the 16 student begins postsecondary education and prior to receiving any 17 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award, the federal 18 adjusted gross income of the student's parent(s) exceeds Two Hundred 19 Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) per year. The provisions of this 20 paragraph shall not apply to any student who has received an 21 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award prior to the 22 2012-2013 school year.

23 3. Except for students who qualify pursuant to subsection B of
24 Section 2603 of this title, the determination of financial

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1 qualification as set forth in this subsection shall be based on the 2 income of the student, not the income of the parent(s), if the 3 student is determined to be independent of the student's parents for 4 federal financial aid purposes. A determination of financial 5 qualification shall not be required for the student who meets the criteria set forth in this subsection at the time the student 6 7 applies for participation in the program. The provisions of this 8 paragraph shall not apply to any student who has received an 9 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award prior to the 10 2008-2009 school year.

F. The financial qualification of a student as set forth in subsections D and E of this section shall be certified by the contact person or by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education on the agreement form provided by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education. The form shall be retained in the permanent record of the student and a copy forwarded to the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education.

18 G. Agreements shall be witnessed by the parent, custodial
19 parent, or guardian of the student, who shall further agree to:
20 1. Assist the student in achieving compliance with the

20 1. Assist the student in achieving compliance with the 21 agreements;

22 2. Confer, when requested to do so, with the school contact
23 person, other school personnel, and program mentors;

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3. Provide information requested by the Oklahoma State Regents
 for Higher Education or the State Board of Education; and

4. Assist the student in completing forms and reports required
for program participation, making applications to institutions and
schools of higher learning, and filing applications for student
grants and scholarships.

7 Students who are enrolled in a school district located in Η. this state that serves students who reside in both this state and an 8 9 adjacent state pursuant to a contract as authorized in Section 5-10 117.1 of this title, are in the eleventh and twelfth grades during 11 the 2006-2007 school year, and who were denied participation in the 12 program shall be allowed to enter or reenter into participation in 13 the program by entering into agreements as set forth in subsections 14 C and D of this section by June 1, 2008.

I. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall promulgate rules for the determination of student compliance with agreements made pursuant to this section.

J. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall designate personnel to coordinate tracking of program records for the years when students participating in the program are still in the schools or are being educated by other means, provide staff development for contact persons in the schools, and provide liaison with the State Board of Education and local organizations and individuals participating in the program.

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1 K. The school district where an Oklahoma Higher Learning Access 2 Program student is enrolled when the student begins participation in 3 the program and any subsequent school district where the student 4 enrolls shall forward information regarding participation by the 5 student in the program to a school to which the student transfers 6 upon the request of the school for the records of the student.

7 L. Students participating in the Oklahoma Higher Learning 8 Access Program shall provide their social security number or their 9 student identification number used by their school to the Oklahoma 10 State Regents for Higher Education. The Regents shall keep the 11 numbers confidential and use them only for administrative purposes. 12 SECTION 7. This act shall become effective July 1, 2015. 13 SECTION 8. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 14 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby 15 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and 16 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
