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6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to public health and safety; creating  
8 the Breast Cancer Prevention Act; defining certain  
9 term; requiring facility performing mammograms to  
10 provide certain notice to certain patient; providing  
11 certain construction; providing for codification; and  
12 providing an effective date.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-553.1 of Title 63, unless  
16 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Breast Cancer  
18 Prevention Act".

19 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-553.2 of Title 63, unless  
21 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

22 A. As used in the Breast Cancer Prevention Act, "physician"  
23 means an individual licensed pursuant to the Oklahoma Allopathic  
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1 Medical and Surgical Licensure and Supervision Act and the Oklahoma  
2 Osteopathic Medicine Act.

3 B. If a physician has determined after a mammogram is performed  
4 that a patient has dense breasts or extremely dense breasts, based  
5 on the breast imaging reporting and data system established by the  
6 American College of Radiology, the facility where the mammogram was  
7 performed shall provide the following notice to the patient:

8 "Your mammogram shows that your breast tissue is dense. Dense  
9 breast tissue is common and is not abnormal. However, dense breast  
10 tissue can make it harder to evaluate the results of your mammogram  
11 and may also be associated with an increased risk of breast cancer.  
12 This information about the results of your mammogram is given to you  
13 to raise your awareness and to inform your conversations with your  
14 doctor. Together, you can decide which screening options are right  
15 for you. A report of your results was sent to your physician."

16 C. Nothing in the Breast Cancer Prevention Act shall be  
17 construed to create or impose liability for failing to comply with  
18 its requirements. Nothing in the Breast Cancer Prevention Act shall  
19 be deemed to create a duty of care or other legal obligation beyond  
20 the duty to provide notice as set forth in subsection B of this  
21 section. Nothing in the Breast Cancer Prevention Act shall be  
22 deemed to require a notice that is inconsistent with the provisions  
23 of the federal Mammography Quality Standards Act, as compiled in 42

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1 U.S.C., Section 263b, or any regulations promulgated pursuant to  
2 that act.

3 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.

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
