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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1210.517 of Title 70, unless
16	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
17	A. The Oklahoma State Department of Education shall maintain
18	the dyslexia handbook created by the Dyslexia and Education Task
19	Force pursuant to Section 1 of Chapter 261 of the 2017 Oklahoma
20	Session Laws that includes guidance, technical assistance and
21	training to assist all local school systems, students and families
22	in the implementation of evidence-based practices for instructing
23	students with characteristics of dyslexia.
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1 The Department shall review the handbook and make revisions В. 2 as necessary on an annual basis with stakeholders, including, but not limited to, previous members of the Dyslexia and Education Task 3 4 Force and the Oklahoma Advisory Panel created pursuant to Part B of 5 the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act. Previous members of the task force shall be consulted when making revisions to the 6 7 Members of the task force not available for the annual handbook. review shall be replaced by individuals meeting the criteria of his 8 9 or her original appointee and maintain the original composition of 10 the task force.

11 C. Any revisions to the handbook shall include, but not be 12 limited to, the following information for local school systems 13 screening students in kindergarten and grades one through three who 14 have been identified through the response-to-intervention process as 15 having characteristics of dyslexia:

16 1. Evidence-based practices designed specifically for students 17 with characteristics of dyslexia;

18 2. Characteristics of targeted instruction for dyslexia;

Guidance on developing instructional plans for students with
characteristics of dyslexia;

Best practices toward meaning-centered reading and writing;

5. Developmentally appropriate curricula and engaging

23 instructional materials and practices;

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1	6. Structured multisensory approaches to teach language and
2	reading skills;
3	7. Suggested training programs; and
4	8. Guidance on dysgraphia and dyscalculia.
5	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
