 time beginning February 28, 1961, through May 7, 1975; and

3 3. Was honorably separated or discharged from military service,
4 still in active service in an honorable status, or was in active
5 service at the time of his or her death.

The Oklahoma Vietnam War Medallion award shall be awarded 6 С. 7 regardless of whether or not such veteran served within the United States or in a foreign country. The award shall be awarded 8 9 regardless of whether or not such veteran was under eighteen (18) 10 years of age at the time of enlistment. For purposes of this section, "veteran" means any person defined as a veteran by the 11 12 United States Department of Veterans Affairs or its successor 13 agency.

D. The Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs shall administer the Vietnam War Medallion Program and set the procedures for awarding the medallion, medal and certificate.

E. In order to create statewide involvement in the design of the award in recognition of this historic endeavor, the Governor shall solicit potential designs from elementary and secondary schools, veterans' groups, and any other interested parties; provided, any such design shall include the words "Oklahoma Vietnam War Medallion". The Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs is authorized to expend any monies appropriated to the Oklahoma
