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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 22-117.2 of Title 11, unless
16	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
17	A. The governing body of a municipality is prohibited from
18	adopting, enacting or enforcing any ordinance authorizing the use of
19	automated recording equipment or system to enforce compliance with
20	traffic signals, traffic speeds or other traffic laws, rules or
21	regulations on any public street, road or highway within this state
2.2	or to impose or collect any civil or criminal fine fee or penalty

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for any such violation.

B. Any municipality using automated recording equipment or system shall remove such equipment or system by January 1, 2016.

- C. The provisions of this section shall not apply to any use of photo-monitoring systems by the Oklahoma Turnpike Authority for toll collection and enforcement of violations of toll collection regulations.
- D. For purposes of this section, the term "automated recording equipment or system" means a camera or optical device installed to work in conjunction with a traffic-control signal or radar speed-detection equipment or both and designed to record images that depict the license plate attached to the rear of a motor vehicle that is not being operated in compliance with instructions of the traffic-control signal or the posted speed limit.
- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 459 of Title 19, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. The board of county commissioners is prohibited from adopting, enacting or enforcing any resolution authorizing the use of automated recording equipment or system to enforce compliance with traffic signals, traffic speeds or other traffic laws, rules or regulations on any public street, road or highway within this state or to impose or collect any civil or criminal fine, fee or penalty for any such violation.

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- B. Any county using automated recording equipment or system shall remove such equipment or system by January 1, 2016.
- C. The provisions of this section shall not apply to any use of photo-monitoring systems by the Oklahoma Turnpike Authority for toll collection and enforcement of violations of toll collection regulations.
- D. For purposes of this section, the term "automated recording equipment or system" means a camera or optical device installed to work in conjunction with a traffic-control signal or radar speed-detection equipment or both and designed to record images that depict the license plate attached to the rear of a motor vehicle that is not being operated in compliance with instructions of the traffic-control signal or the posted speed limit.
