9 COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

10 An Act relating to environment and natural resources;
11 amending 27A O.S. 2011, Section 2-6-107, which
12 relates to the definition of gray water; allowing the
13 use of wastewater from splash pads for certain
14 purposes and under certain conditions without a
15 permit; providing for references to certain terms;
16 and declaring an emergency.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

18 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 27A O.S. 2011, Section 2-6-107, is
19 amended to read as follows:

20 Section 2-6-107. A. "Gray water" means untreated household
21 wastewater that has not come in contact with toilet waste and
22 includes wastewater from bathtubs, showers, washbasins, clothes
23 washing machines and laundry tubs and untreated municipal wastewater
24 limited to wastewater captured from municipal splash pads and water
used by fire departments for cleaning equipment and vehicles. Gray
water shall not include wastewater from kitchen sinks, kitchen

1 dishwashers or laundry water from the washing of material soiled
2 with human excreta, such as diapers.

3 B. The definition of gray water in subsection A of this section
4 shall apply only in municipalities enacting ordinances regulating
5 the use of gray water within the limits of their municipal
6 boundaries.

7 C. The Department of Environmental Quality shall not require a
8 permit for reusing captured wastewater from a splash pad for
9 irrigation or land application, with or without intermediary storage
10 units, if the splash pad is within the jurisdictional boundaries of
11 a municipality or county that has enacted an ordinance or resolution
12 regulating the management of wastewater from splash pads and the
13 ordinance or resolution, at a minimum, includes the same conditions
14 and restrictions as set forth in paragraphs 5, 8, 11, and 12 of
15 subsection A of Section 2-6-108 of this title. For purposes of this
16 subsection, the term "splash pad" shall also include facilities
17 known as spray pools, spray pads, and spray grounds.

18 SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
19 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
20 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
21 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
