7	An Act relating to volunteer firefighters; creating the Volunteer Firefighter Protection Act; defining
8	terms; prohibiting public and private employers from terminating employment of employee who becomes
9	volunteer firefighter; prohibiting employment termination if employee is late or absent due to
10	emergency; permitting reduction in pay for missed time; authorizing employer to request written
11	statement of supervisor verifying absence; requiring volunteer firefighter to give reasonable notice to
12	employer; providing cause of action for violations of act; outlining possible damages and awards; setting
13	statute of limitations for claims; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.
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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 595 of Title 18, unless there is
20	created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
21	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Volunteer
22	Firefighter Protection Act".
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1 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 596 of Title 18, unless there is 3 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 4 As used in the Volunteer Firefighter Protection Act: 5 1. "Volunteer firefighter" means any firefighter in the service of any fire department or Rural Fire Protection District, including 6 7 but not limited to any municipal, volunteer, rural, or subscription fire department or organization, or charitable corporation, who 8 9 receives no monetary compensation for services; and 10 2. "Monetary compensation" means any economic return for services, but shall not include: 11 12 life insurance, sickness, health, disability, annuity, a. 13 length of service, retirement, pension, or other 14 employee-type fringe benefits, or 15 b. de minimus compensation to pay for equipment, 16 clothing, fuel, minor costs related to transportation, 17 or other minor operation costs. 18 NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified SECTION 3. 19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 597 of Title 18, unless there is 20 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 21 No public or private employer shall terminate employment of Α. 22 an employee for joining any fire department or Rural Fire Protection 23 District, including but not limited to any municipal volunteer, 24

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rural, or subscription fire department or organization, or a
 charitable corporation, as a volunteer firefighter.

B. No public or private employer shall terminate employment of an employee who is a volunteer firefighter because the employee, when acting as a volunteer firefighter, is absent from or late to work in order to respond to an emergency prior to the time the employee is to report to work.

8 C. An employer may deduct from the regular pay of the employee 9 the amount of money that the employee would have earned during the 10 time the employee is absent from work because of responding to an 11 emergency in the course of performing the duties of a volunteer 12 firefighter.

13 In the case of an employee who is a volunteer firefighter D. 14 and who is absent from employment or late to work because of 15 responding to an emergency in the course of performing the duties of 16 a volunteer firefighter, the employer has the right to request that 17 the employee provide the employer with a written statement from the 18 supervisor or acting supervisor of the volunteer fire department 19 stating that the employee responded to an emergency and stating the 20 time and date of the emergency.

E. An employee who is a volunteer firefighter and who may be absent from or late to work in order to respond to an emergency in the course of performing the duties of a volunteer firefighter shall

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make a reasonable effort to notify the employer that the employee
 may be absent or late.

3 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 4 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 598 of Title 18, unless there is 5 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. An employee who is terminated in violation of the Volunteer
Firefighter Protection Act may bring a civil action against the
employer who violated the act.

B. The employee may seek reinstatement of the former position,
payment of back wages, reinstatement of fringe benefits, and, where
seniority rights are granted, reinstatement of seniority rights.

12 C. The employee shall commence an action within one (1) year13 following the date of termination.

SECTION 5. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.
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
