11	325.3, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 220, O.S.L. 2013 (74 O.S. Supp. 2016, Sections 325.1 and 325.3),
12	which relate to the State Fire Marshal; abolishing the Oklahoma Council on Firefighter Training;
13	transferring duties, equipment and funds to the State Fire Marshal; creating the Firefighter Training
14	Advisory Committee within the Office of the State Fire Marshal; providing for membership of the
15	Committee; directing Committee to advise and assist State Fire Marshal; providing Committee meeting
16	frequency to be determined by State Fire Marshal Commission; transferring certain duties of the
17	Council on Firefighter Training to the State Fire Marshal Commission; amending 68 O.S. 2011, Section
18	2358.7, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 161, O.S.L. 2012 (68 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 2358.7), which
19	relates to tax credits for volunteer firefighters; transferring certain duties of the Council on
20	Firefighter Training to the State Fire Marshal Commission; amending Section 1, Chapter 220, O.S.L.
21	2013 (70 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 3401.2), which relates to Oklahoma State University fire service
22	training; transferring certain duties of the Council on Firefighter Training to the State Fire Marshal
23	Commission; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 68 O.S. 2011, Section 50001, as
amended by Section 569, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (68 O.S. Supp.
2016, Section 50001), is amended to read as follows:

5 Section 50001. A. There is hereby levied upon percentages of fire insurance gross premiums from a sum of the following lines of 6 7 insurance: fire, allied, homeowners multiperil, commercial multiperil, growing crops, ocean marine, inland marine, auto 8 9 physical damage (including collision), and aircraft physical damage, 10 less returns and dividends to policyholders, which is issued in this 11 state by companies doing business in this state a tax of five-12 sixteenths of one percent (5/16 of 1%). The percentages of fire 13 insurance gross premiums to be considered for taxation shall be 14 determined annually by the Commissioner. This tax shall be 15 collected annually, by the last day of February, from companies 16 collecting such premiums and shall be collected by the Insurance 17 Commissioner as other taxes on insurance are collected. The 18 Insurance Commissioner shall keep a separate account of all such 19 monies received and shall pay the same to the State Treasurer.

<u>B.</u> There is hereby created in the State Treasury a fund for the Fire Marshal Commission and the State Fire Marshal to be designated the "Fire Marshal Fund". The fund shall consist of all monies collected pursuant to the provisions of this section and shall be used in the performance of duties imposed by law upon the Fire

1	Marshal Commission and the Office of the State Fire Marshal.
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2	Expenditures from the Fire Marshal Fund shall be made upon warrants
3	issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by
4	law with the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
5	Services for approval and payment. Beginning July 1, 1982, all
6	expenditures from the Fire Marshal Fund shall be made pursuant only
7	to legislative appropriation. Beginning July 1, 1983, all monies
8	collected pursuant to the provisions of this section shall be
9	deposited in the State Treasury for credit to the General Revenue
10	Fund of the state.
11	C. Beginning July 1, 2017, all monies annually collected
12	pursuant to the provisions of this section shall be apportioned as
13	follows:
14	1. The first Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) shall be
15	deposited in the Fire Marshal Fund; provided that ten percent (10%)
16	of the first Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) shall be paid into
17	the General Revenue Fund of this state; and
18	2. Any remaining monies not apportioned pursuant to paragraph 1
19	of this subsection shall be deposited into the General Revenue Fund
20	<u>of this state.</u>
21	D. Employees of the Office of State Fire Marshal, other than
22	the State Fire Marshal, shall have salaries commensurate with those
23	fixed by the Merit System of Personnel Administration. All salaries
24	shall be payable monthly from funds available to the State Fire

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Marshal. The State Fire Marshal, subject to confirmation by the 1 Fire Marshal Commission, shall appoint and fix the salaries of such 2 employees as are necessary to fulfill the duties of his office. 3 4 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 325.1, as 5 amended by Section 1, Chapter 161, O.S.L. 2012 (74 O.S. Supp. 2016, 6 Section 325.1), is amended to read as follows: 7 Section 325.1 A. The Oklahoma Council on Firefighter Training is hereby abolished and all powers, duties and responsibilities of 8 9 the Oklahoma Council on Firefighter Training shall be transferred to 10 the Office of the State Fire Marshal. All equipment, vehicles, 11 records, furniture and fixtures of the Oklahoma Council on 12 Firefighter Training shall be turned over to the Office of the State 13 Fire Marshal by January 1, 2018. Any unexpended balance of the 14 Oklahoma Council on Firefighter Training's operational funds as of 15 January 1, 2018, shall be transferred to the Office of State Fire 16 Marshal revolving fund. 17 B. There is hereby established within the Oklahoma Council on 18 Firefighter Training Office of the State Fire Marshal the 19 Firefighter Training Advisory Committee. 20 B. C. The Council Committee shall consist of ten (10) members, 21 three of whom shall be ex officio and nonvoting, as follows: 22 1. One member to be appointed by the Oklahoma State 23 Firefighters Association who shall be a member of an Oklahoma fire 24

3	2. One member to be appointed by the Professional Fire Fighters
4	of Oklahoma who shall be a fire union officer, chief officer, or
5	fire service instructor from a full-time paid fire department;
6	3. One member to be appointed by the Oklahoma Fire Chiefs'
7	Association who shall be a chief officer from an Oklahoma career or
8	combination or volunteer fire department;
9	4. One member to be appointed by the State Fire Marshal
10	Commission who shall be a representative of the Oklahoma Fire
11	Service with preferred skills in arson investigation or code
12	enforcement;
13	5. One member to be appointed by the Oklahoma Rural Fire
14	Coordinators who shall be a chief officer or fire service instructor
15	from a volunteer fire department;
16	6. One member to be appointed by the Director of the State
17	Department of Health-Emergency Medical Services Division who shall
18	be a chief officer or fire service EMS instructor from an Oklahoma
19	fire-department;
20	7. One member to be appointed by the Director of the Oklahoma
21	Department of Homeland Security who shall be a municipal emergency
22	management official;
23	8. The Director of Fire Service Training, Oklahoma State
24	University, ex officio and nonvoting;

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1	9. The Director of Fire Service Publications, Oklahoma State
2	University, ex officio and nonvoting; and
3	10. The Director of the Oklahoma Department of Career and
4	Technology Education or the Director's designee, ex officio and
5	nonvoting.
6	C. The initial term of office for the members of the Council
7	shall be:
8	1. Three (3) years for persons appointed pursuant to paragraphs
9	1 through 3 of subsection B of this section;
10	2. Two (2) years for persons appointed pursuant to paragraphs 4
11	and 5 of subsection B of this section; and
12	3. One (1) year for persons appointed pursuant to paragraphs 6
13	and 7 of subsection B of this section.

1 G. representatives of the Oklahoma Fire Service, total number 2 and length of appointments to be determined by the State Fire 3 Marshal Commission. 4 The Council Committee shall be responsible for: D. 5 1. Identifying Advise and assist the State Fire Marshal Commission in identifying firefighter training needs and setting the 6 7 firefighter training goals for the State of Oklahoma; 2. Interacting Advise and assist the State Fire Marshal 8 9 Commission in interacting with the Homeland Security Department's 10 Preparedness and Awareness Division on firefighter training and 11 grants; 12 3. Administering Advise and assist the State Fire Marshal 13 Commission in administering and maintaining the incentive and 14 recognition programs established for Oklahoma firefighters; and 15 4. Ensuring Advise and assist the State Fire Marshal Commission 16 in ensuring that the state has consistent basic and continuing 17 education programs that include steps for all ranks or positions of 18 career and volunteer firefighters, by setting minimum standards for

19 career, recommended levels for volunteer, identifying training 20 programs and courses required for fire service members to achieve 21 those levels.

H. E. The Council Committee shall advise assist the State Fire
 Marshal Commission in advising the Governor, the Speaker of the
 House of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the State

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Senate and the Oklahoma State Fire Service on fire and emergency
 service training needs for the state. The <u>Council State Fire</u>
 <u>Marshal Commission</u> shall submit an annual report or recommendations
 regarding fire and emergency service training needs to the Governor,
 the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro
 Tempore of the State Senate not later than December 31 each year.

7 I. After the initial appointments to the Council have been made 8 and at the beginning of each fiscal year thereafter, the Council 9 shall select from among its membership a chairperson and vice-10 chairperson. The chairperson and vice-chairperson shall be selected 11 annually at the first regularly scheduled meeting of the Board on or 12 after July 1. Either the current chairperson or current vicechairperson shall be a current volunteer member of a combination or 13 14 volunteer fire department.

15 J. At least four members of the Council must be present to 16 constitute a quorum at the meetings of the Council. A simple 17 majority of the members in attendance and voting shall constitute 18 passage of any vote.

19 K. The chair of the Council shall recommend to the appointing 20 authority the replacement of any Council member who misses more than 21 two consecutive regular meetings or who attends less than fifty 22 percent (50%) of the Council's regularly scheduled meetings in a 23 twelve-month period without an excused absence.

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L. The Council may seek federal and private grants where applicable.

M. The Council shall conduct six meetings annually. Meetings
of the Council shall be held at a location and time to be determined
by the chair. The chair shall have the discretion to cancel or
reschedule any regular meeting by written notice within a reasonable
time prior to the meeting. Council members shall be notified of the
time and place of all such meetings at least seven (7) days prior to
the meeting date.

10 N. Special meetings of the Council may be called at the discretion of the chair or by a written request of at least three 11 12 members of the Council. An agenda, together with a written notice 13 of the time and place of any such meeting must be provided to the 14 Council members at least seven (7) days in advance. Only matters 15 contained in the agenda shall be voted on at any special meeting. 16 The chair shall have the discretion to cancel any special meeting; 17 provided, that such meetings called by the members of the Council 18 are canceled only with their consent.

19 <u>F. The Committee shall meet at the discretion of the State Fire</u> 20 <u>Marshal Commission.</u>

SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 325.3, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 220, O.S.L. 2013 (74 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 325.3), is amended to read as follows:

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Section 325.3 A. Oklahoma State University Fire Service 1 2 Training in conjunction with the Oklahoma Office of Homeland 3 Security and the Oklahoma Council on Firefighter Training (COFT) 4 State Fire Marshal Commission shall develop a program to educate 5 firefighters on a unified command protocol for emergency incidents 6 occurring in this state. This program shall be offered statewide by 7 Oklahoma State University Fire Service Training. Methods of 8 training may include, but are not limited to: 9 1. Live classroom sessions with approved instructors; 10 2. Live exercises and drills with approved instructors; 11 3. Interactive television; 12 4. Independent study; and 13 5. Web-based methods. 14 The training program shall be in compliance with the Β. 15 National Incident Management System (NIMS) and shall include 16 provisions consistent with the National Fire Protection Association 17 training courses. 18 The program shall have curriculum and training materials С. 19 that are consistently utilized by all training providers at all 20 training locations. 21 Subject to funding, these programs shall be offered at D. 22 facilities approved by Oklahoma State University Fire Service 23 Training and shall include, but not be limited to, other

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institutions of higher education, technology center school
 facilities, local fire departments and other qualified entities.

3 E. Oklahoma State University Fire Service Training shall carry
4 out all duties and responsibilities in accordance with Section 1 of
5 this act.

6 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 68 O.S. 2011, Section 2358.7, as 7 amended by Section 2, Chapter 161, O.S.L. 2012 (68 O.S. Supp. 2016, 8 Section 2358.7), is amended to read as follows:

9 Section 2358.7 A. For taxable years beginning after December
10 31, 2004, there shall be allowed as a credit against the tax imposed
11 pursuant to Section 2355 of this title an amount equal to:

12 1. Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) each year for which a 13 volunteer firefighter provides proof of certification as required by 14 subsection B of this section; and

15 2. Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00) each year following the 16 taxable years for which a taxpayer is eligible for the credit 17 provided by paragraph 1 of this subsection for a volunteer 18 firefighter providing proof of certification as required by 19 subsection D of this section.

B. In order to claim the tax credit authorized by paragraph 1 of subsection A of this section, a volunteer firefighter shall be required to provide adequate documentation to the Oklahoma Tax Commission of at least twelve (12) credited hours toward the State Support or State Basic Firefighter or Firefighter I from an

1 internationally recognized accrediting assembly or board, their equivalent, or other related fire or emergency medical services 2 3 training approved by the Council on Firefighter Training State Fire 4 Marshal Commission and offered by Oklahoma State University Fire 5 Service Training or Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education prior to or during the first taxable year for which a tax 6 7 credit is claimed pursuant to paragraph 1 of subsection A of this 8 section. For the purpose of this subsection, the local fire chief 9 shall be the authority having jurisdiction and shall choose and 10 approve all volunteer firefighter training in the applicable 11 department.

12 C. For each year subsequent to the first year for which a 13 volunteer firefighter may claim the tax credit authorized by 14 paragraph 1 of subsection A of this section, in order to claim any 15 further tax credits pursuant to paragraph 1 of subsection A of this 16 section, the volunteer firefighter shall be required to provide 17 documentation that the firefighter has completed an additional six 18 (6) hours of State Support or State Basic Firefighter or Firefighter 19 I from an internationally recognized accrediting assembly or board, 20 their equivalent, or other related fire or emergency medical 21 services training approved by the Council on Firefighter Training 22 State Fire Marshal Commission until such program or its equivalent 23 is completed. For purposes of this subsection, equivalency shall be 24 determined by the Oklahoma Council on Firefighter Training State

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1 Fire Marshal Commission and Oklahoma State University Fire Service 2 Training. For purposes of this subsection, Firefighter I or Firefighter II certifications or their equivalents may be provided 3 4 in lieu of the State Support or State Basic Firefighter completion. 5 D. After having completed the State Support or State Basic Firefighter program, in order to be eligible for the tax credit 6 7 authorized by paragraph 2 of subsection A of this section, the volunteer firefighter shall: 8

9 1. Complete at least six (6) hours of continuing education each 10 year until the volunteer firefighter completes Intermediate or 11 Advanced Firefighter or Firefighter I from an internationally 12 recognized accrediting assembly or board, their equivalent, or other 13 related fire or emergency medical services training approved by the 14 Council on Firefighter Training State Fire Marshal Commission or its 15 equivalent. For purposes of this paragraph, equivalency shall be 16 determined by the Oklahoma Council on Firefighter Training State 17 Fire Marshal Commission and Oklahoma State University Fire Service 18 Training;

After completion of Intermediate or Advanced Firefighter or
 Firefighter I from an internationally recognized accrediting
 assembly or board, their equivalent, or other related fire or
 emergency medical services training approved by the Council on
 Firefighter Training State Fire Marshal Commission, the volunteer
 firefighter shall complete six (6) hours of training per year to

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claim the tax credit. For the purpose of this subsection, the local
 fire chief shall be the authority having jurisdiction and shall
 choose and approve all volunteer firefighter training in the
 applicable department;

5 3. Provide documentation from the fire chief of the applicable 6 department that the firefighter has been provided and participated 7 in all annual training as required by federal and state authorities; 8 and

9 4. Provide documentation from the fire chief of the applicable 10 department that the volunteer firefighter has met the requirements 11 under the fire department's constitution and bylaws and is a member 12 in good standing of the department together with a record of the 13 total number of years of service in good standing with such 14 department.

E. The Office of the State Fire Marshal and the Oklahoma
Council on Firefighter Training shall prescribe a reporting form for
use by volunteer fire departments and by volunteer firefighters in
order to provide the certifications required by this section.

F. The Oklahoma Tax Commission may require copies of such reporting form provided by the Oklahoma Council on Firefighter Training <u>State Fire Marshal Commission</u> regarding training history to verify eligibility for the tax credits provided by this section.

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1 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 220, O.S.L.
2 2013 (70 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 3401.2), is amended to read as
3 follows:

Section 3401.2 A. The purpose of Oklahoma State University
Fire Service Training (OSU FST) shall be to develop, deliver,
support and evaluate training, education and professional
certification programs for fire service in this state to ensure
emergency responders may safely and successfully perform their
duties.

10 B. OSU FST shall:

11 1. Deliver and support training and education programs for fire 12 service and other emergency responders in this state to meet local 13 and state needs by:

14 collaborating with technology center schools and other a. 15 training providers to ensure training, training 16 support and support of certification testing is 17 readily available to all areas of the state to 18 accomplish the Oklahoma Council on Firefighter 19 Training (COFT) State Fire Marshal Commission annual 20 state training plan and regional training plans which 21 are voluntarily developed and adopted, and 22 collaborating with technology center schools and other b. 23 training providers to develop and maintain a database 24 of available instructors to teach fire and emergency

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1 responder topics. The database shall be maintained on 2 the OSU FST website and made available to other 3 training providers;

2. Collaborate with COFT the State Fire Marshal Commission on
efforts which shall include, but not be limited to, participation in
the activities of the COFT the State Fire Marshal Commission
training task force and initiatives intended to accomplish COFT the
State Fire Marshal Commission firefighter training goals and the
state-specific standards certification program;

10 3. Develop or adopt and disseminate curriculum and 11 instructional materials to fire departments and training providers 12 consistent with state and federal statutory requirements for 13 classes, courses and programs for delivery to fire service in this 14 state, with every effort being made to provide the curriculum and 15 materials at minimal or no cost. Unless required by state or 16 federal regulations, selection, adoption and/or use of the OSU-FST-17 disseminated curriculum and training materials or instructors shall 18 be at the discretion of each training provider or local fire 19 department;

4. Maintain and make available by electronic means, in a manner consistent with state and federal regulations, to the Oklahoma Council on Firefighter Training, fire chiefs, training officers and other agencies as required by law, as requested, all training and certification records of Oklahoma firefighters who participate in

1 training sponsored by OSU FST or records provided to OSU FST by
2 local fire departments or other training agencies. The provisions
3 of this paragraph shall not apply to state and federal wild-land
4 fire agencies;

5 5. Develop, administer and evaluate an accredited certification 6 program available to all firefighters and other emergency responders 7 based on National Fire Protection Association standards and/or state 8 and federal standards. The program shall:

- 9 а. be accredited through the International Fire Service 10 Accreditation Congress and/or the National Board on 11 Fire Service Professional Oualifications at levels 12 deemed beneficial to fire service in this state, 13 b. provide for dissemination to recognized certification 14 partners and posting to the OSU FST's website a list 15 of qualified proctors and evaluators for use during 16 OSU FST certification events,
- 17 develop, as requested, special certifications based on с. 18 state-specific standards adopted by COFT or other 19 state agencies that are designed for emergency 20 responders in this state, which may not be accredited, 21 maintain certification records and disseminate d. 22 certifications of COFT the State Fire Marshal 23 Commission-adopted or approved Oklahoma state-specific 24 certifications. The certifications may be jointly

1labeled as COFT the State Fire Marshal Commission, OSU2FST, the Oklahoma Career and Technology Education3System or other COFT State Fire Marshal Commission -4approved training providers administering state-5specific certifications,

- e. ensure that the Oklahoma state-specific certifications
 shall not duplicate certifications accredited by the
 International Fire Service Accreditation Congress or
 the National Board on Fire Service Professional
 Qualifications, or titles of certification levels
 listed in the National Fire Protection Association
 professional qualifications standards, and
- 13 f. when requested by an Oklahoma fire department or state 14 agency, facilitate delivery of International Fire 15 Service Accreditation Congress and National Board on 16 Fire Service Professional Qualifications accredited 17 certification processes which are not currently 18 available through OSU FST; and

Fulfill any other statutory requirements set forth by the
 Legislature.

C. OSU FST shall be the Oklahoma state government
 representative to the United States Fire Administration's National
 Fire Academy and shall be responsible for delivering and

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disseminating training courses provided by, or made available
 through, the National Fire Academy.

D. Beginning September 15, 2014, and continuing on September 15 every following year, OSU FST shall submit an annual report regarding its programs, activity and accomplishments to the Chair of the Board of Regents for the Oklahoma Agricultural and Mechanical Colleges, the President of Oklahoma State University and the Dean of the Oklahoma State University College of Engineering, Architecture and Technology.

10 Ε. Nothing in this section shall be construed to divert funding 11 from one entity to another. Nothing in this section shall be 12 construed to limit, preclude or exempt an organization, agency or 13 local department from delivery of training; development, adoption or 14 dissemination of training curriculum or materials; participation in 15 a COFT certification program based on an Oklahoma state-specific 16 standard adopted or approved by COFT; or issuance of a certificate 17 of completion of training.

SECTION 6. This act shall become effective July 1, 2017.
SECTION 7. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
