14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 68 O.S. 2011, Section 50001, as
16	amended by Section 569, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (68 O.S. Supp.
17	2016, Section 50001), is amended to read as follows:
18	Section 50001. <u>A.</u> There is hereby levied upon percentages of
19	fire insurance gross premiums from a sum of the following lines of
20	insurance: fire, allied, homeowners multiperil, commercial
21	multiperil, growing crops, ocean marine, inland marine, auto
22	physical damage (including collision), and aircraft physical damage,
23	less returns and dividends to policyholders, which is issued in this
24	state by companies doing business in this state a tax of five-

sixteenths of one percent (5/16 of 1%). The percentages of fire 1 2 insurance gross premiums to be considered for taxation shall be 3 determined annually by the Commissioner. This tax shall be collected annually, by the last day of February, from companies 4 5 collecting such premiums and shall be collected by the Insurance Commissioner as other taxes on insurance are collected. 6 The 7 Insurance Commissioner shall keep a separate account of all such monies received and shall pay the same to the State Treasurer. 8

9 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a fund for the Β. 10 Fire Marshal Commission and the State Fire Marshal to be designated 11 the "Fire Marshal Fund". The fund shall consist of all monies 12 collected pursuant to the provisions of this section and shall be used in the performance of duties imposed by law upon the Fire 13 Marshal Commission and the Office of the State Fire Marshal. 14 15 Expenditures from the Fire Marshal Fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by 16 law with the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise 17 Services for approval and payment. Beginning July 1, 1982, all 18 expenditures from the Fire Marshal Fund shall be made pursuant only 19 to legislative appropriation. Beginning July 1, 1983, all monies 20 collected pursuant to the provisions of this section shall be 21 deposited in the State Treasury for credit to the General Revenue 22 Fund of the state. 23

1	C. All monies annually collected pursuant to the provisions of
2	this section shall be apportioned as follows:
3	1. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017, the first One
4	Million Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,600,000.00) shall be
5	deposited in the State Fire Marshal Revolving Fund as defined in
6	Section 324.20b of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes; provided, that
7	ten percent (10%) of the first One Million Six Hundred Thousand
8	Dollars (\$1,600,000.00) shall be paid into the General Revenue Fund
9	of this state;
10	2. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and for every
11	subsequent fiscal year thereafter, the first Two Million Dollars
12	(\$2,000,000.00) shall be deposited in the Fire Marshal Fund;
13	provided, that ten percent (10%) of the first Two Million Dollars
14	(\$2,000,000.00) shall be paid into the General Revenue Fund of this
15	state; and
16	3. Any remaining monies not apportioned pursuant to paragraphs
17	1 and 2 of this subsection shall be deposited into the General
18	Revenue Fund of this state.
19	D. Employees of the Office of State Fire Marshal, other than
20	the State Fire Marshal, shall have salaries commensurate with those
21	fixed by the Merit System of Personnel Administration. All salaries
22	shall be payable monthly from funds available to the State Fire
23	Marshal. The State Fire Marshal, subject to confirmation by the
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1	Fire Marshal Commission, shall appoint and fix the salaries of such
2	employees as are necessary to fulfill the duties of his office.
3	SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 325.1, as
4	amended by Section 1, Chapter 161, O.S.L. 2012 (74 O.S. Supp. 2016,
5	Section 325.1), is amended to read as follows:
6	Section 325.1 A. The Oklahoma Council on Firefighter Training
7	is hereby abolished and all powers, duties and responsibilities of
8	the Oklahoma Council on Firefighter Training shall be transferred to
9	the Office of the State Fire Marshal. All equipment, vehicles,
10	records, furniture and fixtures of the Oklahoma Council on
11	Firefighter Training shall be turned over to the Office of the State
12	Fire Marshal by January 1, 2018. Any unexpended balance of the
13	Oklahoma Council on Firefighter Training's operational funds as of
14	January 1, 2018, shall be transferred to the Office of State Fire
15	Marshal Revolving Fund.
16	B. There is hereby established within the Oklahoma Council on
17	Office of the State Fire Marshal, the Firefighter Training Advisory
18	<u>Committee</u> .
19	B. C. The Council Committee shall consist of ten (10) members,
20	three of whom shall be ex officio and nonvoting, as follows:
21	1. One member to be appointed by the Oklahoma State
22	Firefighters Association who shall be a member of an Oklahoma fire
23	department representing all members of paid, volunteer and
24	combination fire departments;

1	2. One member to be appointed by the Professional Fire Fighters
2	of Oklahoma who shall be a fire union officer, chief officer, or
3	fire service instructor from a full-time paid fire department;
4	3. One member to be appointed by the Oklahoma Fire Chiefs'
5	Association who shall be a chief officer from an Oklahoma career or
6	combination or volunteer fire department;
7	4. One member to be appointed by the State Fire Marshal
8	Commission who shall be a representative of the Oklahoma Fire
9	Service with preferred skills in arson investigation or code
10	enforcement;
11	5. One member to be appointed by the Oklahoma Rural Fire
12	Coordinators who shall be a chief officer or fire service instructor
13	from a volunteer fire department;
14	6. One member to be appointed by the Director of the State
15	Department of Health-Emergency Medical Services Division who shall
16	be a chief officer or fire service EMS instructor from an Oklahoma
17	fire department;
18	7. One member to be appointed by the Director of the Oklahoma
19	Department of Homeland Security who shall be a municipal emergency
20	management official;
21	8. The Director of Fire Service Training, Oklahoma State
22	University, ex officio and nonvoting;
23	9. The Director of Fire Service Publications, Oklahoma State
24	University, ex officio and nonvoting; and

1	10. The Director of the Oklahoma Department of Career and
2	Technology Education or the Director's designee, ex officio and
3	nonvoting.
4	C. The initial term of office for the members of the Council
5	shall be:
6	1. Three (3) years for persons appointed pursuant to paragraphs
7	1 through 3 of subsection B of this section;
8	2. Two (2) years for persons appointed pursuant to paragraphs 4
9	and 5 of subsection B of this section; and
10	3. One (1) year for persons appointed pursuant to paragraphs 6
11	and 7 of subsection B of this section.
12	D. After the expiration of the initial terms of office
13	prescribed by subsection C of this section, the term of office for
14	each member of the Council shall be for a period of three (3) years.
15	E. Each member of the Council shall serve at the pleasure of
16	the appointing authority.
17	F. Appointments made to fill a vacancy in any position shall be
18	for the period of time remaining for such appointed position and
19	shall be made in the same manner as for the original appointment.
20	Any vacancy in the Council shall be filled in the same manner as
21	provided for in the original appointment.
22	G. representatives of the Oklahoma Fire Service, with the total
23	number and length of appointments to be determined by the State Fire
24	Marshal Commission.

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D. The Council Committee shall be responsible for:

I. Identifying Advise and assist the State Fire Marshal
 <u>Commission in identifying</u> firefighter training needs and setting the
 firefighter training goals for the State of Oklahoma;

5 2. Interacting Advise and assist the State Fire Marshal
6 Commission in interacting with the Homeland Security Department's
7 Preparedness and Awareness Division on firefighter training and
8 grants;

9 3. Administering Advise and assist the State Fire Marshal
 10 Commission in administering and maintaining the incentive and
 11 recognition programs established for Oklahoma firefighters; and

4. Ensuring Advise and assist the State Fire Marshal Commission in ensuring that the state has consistent basic and continuing education programs that include steps for all ranks or positions of career and volunteer firefighters, by setting minimum standards for career, recommended levels for volunteer, identifying training programs and courses required for fire service members to achieve those levels.

H. E. The Council Committee shall advise assist the State Fire
Marshal Commission in advising the Governor, the Speaker of the
House of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the State
Senate and the Oklahoma State Fire Service on fire and emergency
service training needs for the state. The Council State Fire
Marshal Commission shall submit an annual report or recommendations

1	regarding fire and emergency service training needs to the Governor,
2	the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro
3	Tempore of the State Senate not later than December 31 each year.
4	I. After the initial appointments to the Council have been made
5	and at the beginning of each fiscal year thereafter, the Council
6	shall select from among its membership a chairperson and vice-
7	chairperson. The chairperson and vice-chairperson shall be selected
8	annually at the first regularly scheduled meeting of the Board on or
9	after July 1. Either the current chairperson or current vice-
10	chairperson shall be a current volunteer member of a combination or
11	volunteer fire department.
12	J. At least four members of the Council must be present to
13	constitute a quorum at the meetings of the Council. A simple
14	majority of the members in attendance and voting shall constitute
15	passage of any vote.
16	K. The chair of the Council shall recommend to the appointing
17	authority the replacement of any Council member who misses more than
18	two consecutive regular meetings or who attends less than fifty
19	percent (50%) of the Council's regularly scheduled meetings in a
20	twelve-month period without an excused absence.
21	L. The Council may seek federal and private grants where
22	applicable.
23	M. The Council shall conduct six meetings annually. Meetings
24	of the Council shall be held at a location and time to be determined

by the chair. The chair shall have the discretion to cancel or reschedule any regular meeting by written notice within a reasonable time prior to the meeting. Council members shall be notified of the time and place of all such meetings at least seven (7) days prior to the meeting date.

N. Special meetings of the Council may be called at the 6 7 discretion of the chair or by a written request of at least three members of the Council. An agenda, together with a written notice 8 9 of the time and place of any such meeting must be provided to the 10 Council members at least seven (7) days in advance. Only matters contained in the agenda shall be voted on at any special meeting. 11 12 The chair shall have the discretion to cancel any special meeting; provided, that such meetings called by the members of the Council 13 are canceled only with their consent. 14

15 <u>F. The Committee shall meet at the discretion of the State Fire</u>
16 Marshal Commission.

17 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 325.3, as 18 amended by Section 3, Chapter 220, O.S.L. 2013 (74 O.S. Supp. 2016, 19 Section 325.3), is amended to read as follows:

Section 325.3 A. Oklahoma State University Fire Service
Training in conjunction with the Oklahoma Office of Homeland
Security and the Oklahoma Council on Firefighter Training (COFT)
State Fire Marshal Commission shall develop a program to educate
firefighters on a unified command protocol for emergency incidents

occurring in this state. This program shall be offered statewide by
 Oklahoma State University Fire Service Training. Methods of
 training may include, but are not limited to:

Live classroom sessions with approved instructors;
 Live exercises and drills with approved instructors;
 Interactive television;
 Independent study; and

8 5. Web-based methods.

9 B. The training program shall be in compliance with the
10 National Incident Management System (NIMS) and shall include
11 provisions consistent with the National Fire Protection Association
12 training courses.

C. The program shall have curriculum and training materials that are consistently utilized by all training providers at all training locations.

D. Subject to funding, these programs shall be offered at facilities approved by Oklahoma State University Fire Service Training and shall include, but not be limited to, other institutions of higher education, technology center school facilities, local fire departments and other qualified entities.

E. Oklahoma State University Fire Service Training shall carry
out all duties and responsibilities in accordance with Section 1
3401.2 of this act Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 68 O.S. 2011, Section 2358.7, as
 amended by Section 2, Chapter 161, O.S.L. 2012 (68 O.S. Supp. 2016,
 Section 2358.7), is amended to read as follows:

Section 2358.7 A. For taxable years beginning after December
31, 2004, there shall be allowed as a credit against the tax imposed
pursuant to Section 2355 of this title an amount equal to:

7 1. Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) each year for which a
8 volunteer firefighter provides proof of certification as required by
9 subsection B of this section; and

Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00) each year following the
 taxable years for which a taxpayer is eligible for the credit
 provided by paragraph 1 of this subsection for a volunteer
 firefighter providing proof of certification as required by
 subsection D of this section.

In order to claim the tax credit authorized by paragraph 1 15 в. of subsection A of this section, a volunteer firefighter shall be 16 required to provide adequate documentation to the Oklahoma Tax 17 Commission of at least twelve (12) credited hours toward the State 18 Support or State Basic Firefighter or Firefighter I from an 19 internationally recognized accrediting assembly or board, their 20 equivalent, or other related fire or emergency medical services 21 training approved by the Council on Firefighter Training State Fire 22 Marshal Commission and offered by Oklahoma State University Fire 23 Service Training or Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology 24

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Education prior to or during the first taxable year for which a tax credit is claimed pursuant to paragraph 1 of subsection A of this section. For the purpose of this subsection, the local fire chief shall be the authority having jurisdiction and shall choose and approve all volunteer firefighter training in the applicable department.

7 C. For each year subsequent to the first year for which a volunteer firefighter may claim the tax credit authorized by 8 9 paragraph 1 of subsection A of this section, in order to claim any 10 further tax credits pursuant to paragraph 1 of subsection A of this section, the volunteer firefighter shall be required to provide 11 12 documentation that the firefighter has completed an additional six (6) hours of State Support or State Basic Firefighter or Firefighter 13 I from an internationally recognized accrediting assembly or board, 14 15 their equivalent, or other related fire or emergency medical services training approved by the Council on Firefighter Training 16 State Fire Marshal Commission until such program or its equivalent 17 is completed. For purposes of this subsection, equivalency shall be 18 determined by the Oklahoma Council on Firefighter Training State 19 20 Fire Marshal Commission and Oklahoma State University Fire Service Training. For purposes of this subsection, Firefighter I or 21 Firefighter II certifications or their equivalents may be provided 22 in lieu of the State Support or State Basic Firefighter completion. 23

D. After having completed the State Support or State Basic
 Firefighter program, in order to be eligible for the tax credit
 authorized by paragraph 2 of subsection A of this section, the
 volunteer firefighter shall:

5 1. Complete at least six (6) hours of continuing education each year until the volunteer firefighter completes Intermediate or 6 7 Advanced Firefighter or Firefighter I from an internationally recognized accrediting assembly or board, their equivalent, or other 8 9 related fire or emergency medical services training approved by the 10 Council on Firefighter Training State Fire Marshal Commission or its 11 equivalent. For purposes of this paragraph, equivalency shall be 12 determined by the Oklahoma Council on Firefighter Training State Fire Marshal Commission and Oklahoma State University Fire Service 13 Training; 14

2. After completion of Intermediate or Advanced Firefighter or 15 Firefighter I from an internationally recognized accrediting 16 assembly or board, their equivalent, or other related fire or 17 emergency medical services training approved by the Council on 18 Firefighter Training State Fire Marshal Commission, the volunteer 19 firefighter shall complete six (6) hours of training per year to 20 claim the tax credit. For the purpose of this subsection, the local 21 fire chief shall be the authority having jurisdiction and shall 22 choose and approve all volunteer firefighter training in the 23 applicable department; 24

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3. Provide documentation from the fire chief of the applicable
 department that the firefighter has been provided and participated
 in all annual training as required by federal and state authorities;
 and

4. Provide documentation from the fire chief of the applicable
department that the volunteer firefighter has met the requirements
under the fire department's constitution and bylaws and is a member
in good standing of the department together with a record of the
total number of years of service in good standing with such
department.

E. The Office of the State Fire Marshal and the Oklahoma Council on Firefighter Training State Fire Marshal Commission shall prescribe a reporting form for use by volunteer fire departments and by volunteer firefighters in order to provide the certifications required by this section.

The Oklahoma Tax Commission may require copies of such 16 F. reporting form provided by the Oklahoma Council on Firefighter 17 Training State Fire Marshal Commission regarding training history to 18 verify eligibility for the tax credits provided by this section. 19 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 220, O.S.L. 20 2013 (70 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 3401.2), is amended to read as 21 follows: 22

23 Section 3401.2 A. The purpose of Oklahoma State University 24 Fire Service Training (OSU FST) shall be to develop, deliver,

support and evaluate training, education and professional
 certification programs for fire service in this state to ensure
 emergency responders may safely and successfully perform their
 duties.

B. OSU FST shall:

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Deliver and support training and education programs for fire
service and other emergency responders in this state to meet local
and state needs by:

9 a. collaborating with technology center schools and other training providers to ensure training, training 10 support and support of certification testing is are 11 12 readily available to all areas of the state to accomplish the Oklahoma Council on Firefighter 13 Training (COFT) State Fire Marshal Commission annual 14 state training plan and regional training plans which 15 are voluntarily developed and adopted, and 16 b. collaborating with technology center schools and other 17 training providers to develop and maintain a database 18 of available instructors to teach fire and emergency 19 responder topics. The database shall be maintained on 20 the OSU FST website and made available to other 21 training providers; 22

Collaborate with COFT the State Fire Marshal Commission on
 efforts which shall include, but not be limited to, participation in

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1 the activities of the COFT State Fire Marshal Commission training 2 task force and initiatives intended to accomplish COFT the State 3 <u>Fire Marshal Commission</u> firefighter training goals and the state-4 specific standards certification program;

5 3. Develop or adopt and disseminate curriculum and instructional materials to fire departments and training providers 6 7 consistent with state and federal statutory requirements for classes, courses and programs for delivery to fire service in this 8 9 state, with every effort being made to provide the curriculum and 10 materials at minimal or no cost. Unless required by state or 11 federal regulations, selection, adoption and/or use of the OSU-FST-12 disseminated curriculum and training materials or instructors shall be at the discretion of each training provider or local fire 13 department; 14

4. Maintain and make available by electronic means, in a manner 15 consistent with state and federal regulations, to the Oklahoma 16 Council on Firefighter Training State Fire Marshal Commission, fire 17 chiefs, training officers and other agencies as required by law, as 18 requested, all training and certification records of Oklahoma 19 firefighters who participate in training sponsored by OSU FST or 20 records provided to OSU FST by local fire departments or other 21 training agencies. The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply 22 to state and federal wild-land fire agencies; 23

5. Develop, administer and evaluate an accredited certification
 program available to all firefighters and other emergency responders
 based on National Fire Protection Association standards and/or state
 and federal standards. The program shall:

- 5a.be accredited through the International Fire Service6Accreditation Congress and/or the National Board on7Fire Service Professional Qualifications at levels8deemed beneficial to fire service in this state,
- 9 b. provide for dissemination to recognized certification
  10 partners and posting to the OSU FST's website a list
  11 of qualified proctors and evaluators for use during
  12 OSU FST certification events,
- c. develop, as requested, special certifications based on
   state-specific standards adopted by COFT the State
   Fire Marshal Commission or other state agencies that
   are designed for emergency responders in this state,
   which may not be accredited,
- 18d.maintain certification records and disseminate19certifications of COFT State-Fire-Marshal-Commission-20adopted or -approved Oklahoma state-specific21certifications. The certifications may be jointly22labeled as COFT the State Fire Marshal Commission, OSU23FST, the Oklahoma Career and Technology Education24System or other COFT State-Fire-Marshal-Commission-

approved training providers administering state-

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- e. ensure that the Oklahoma state-specific certifications
  shall not duplicate certifications accredited by the
  International Fire Service Accreditation Congress or
  the National Board on Fire Service Professional
  Qualifications, or titles of certification levels
  listed in the National Fire Protection Association
  professional qualifications standards, and
- 10 f. when requested by an Oklahoma fire department or state 11 agency, facilitate delivery of International Fire 12 Service Accreditation Congress and National Board on 13 Fire Service Professional Qualifications accredited 14 certification processes which are not currently 15 available through OSU FST; and

16 6. Fulfill any other statutory requirements set forth by the17 Legislature.

C. OSU FST shall be the Oklahoma state government representative to the United States Fire Administration's National Fire Academy and shall be responsible for delivering and disseminating training courses provided by, or made available through, the National Fire Academy.

D. Beginning September 15, 2014, and continuing on September 15
every following year, OSU FST shall submit an annual report

regarding its programs, activity and accomplishments to the Chair of the Board of Regents for the Oklahoma Agricultural and Mechanical Colleges, the President of Oklahoma State University and the Dean of the Oklahoma State University College of Engineering, Architecture and Technology.

Nothing in this section shall be construed to divert funding 6 Ε. from one entity to another. Nothing in this section shall be 7 construed to limit, preclude or exempt an organization, agency or 8 9 local department from delivery of training; development, adoption or 10 dissemination of training curriculum or materials; participation in 11 a COFT State Fire Marshal Commission certification program based on 12 an Oklahoma state-specific standard adopted or approved by COFT the State Fire Marshal Commission; or issuance of a certificate of 13 completion of training. 14 SECTION 6. This act shall become effective July 1, 2017. 15 SECTION 7. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 16 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby 17

18 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and

19 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
